PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Hello everyone,

Thinking about what to include in a President's report has probably been the most difficult job for me this year. 2006-07 has gone so fast, it only seems like a month or two ago that we were at the last AGM.

CFC membership appears to have stabilized this year. While the total numbers are down a little on last year, I believe the number of "active" members has increased. Chris spoke last year about being well on our way to rebuilding a stronger club. It's safe to say that we have consolidated this year, but we must strive to keep our existing members happy and attract new blood to the Club. Some new faces are starting to come through, a trend I hope will continue.

Financially, the Club remains in a strong position. That we roughly broke even in 2006-07 after halving the number of raffles, subsidising outings and offering discounted Columbia shirts to members, bodes well for the financial future of the Club. Next year we need to tip some money into the Fish Stocking Project, which I hope members will agree will be worthwhile in the years to come as, hopefully, some of the 50,000 fish to be stocked begin to show up in our catches.

Our financial result was helped by a highly successful Burrinjuck Convention, with thanks going to lan Buchanan, our 2006 Chairman, and Greg Davis for his organisational assistance. Some more tinkering around the edges and I believe we can be better yet again this year. Let the search for some bigger hamburgers begin!

I attended some excellent outings this year, with the two Narooma trips being the highlight. Shared accommodation like at Narooma and Kalkite brings a great level of camaraderie and socialising to outings, and I feel we have managed to strike a good balance between the competitive fishing and the social aspect. Speaking of the fishing, we had some excellent captures recorded this year, including some Australian and State records, as well as several members receiving Master Angler awards. Congratulations to these people and all our trophy winners for the year and I hope you all enjoyed wetting a line.

June 2007 saw the introduction of the Bateman's Marine Park which took away 20% of our beloved South Coast. While I fought hard in opposing the process used to develop the Park, it is unfortunately here with us and is unlikely to change. We can only hope that the supposed benefits are realised, and there are more fish to catch in future. I remain unconvinced. This year also saw the introduction of tighter bag limits and increased size limits for a number of our favourite species. The benefits may be a few years down the track, we can only wait and see. Don't forget the new rules start in September.

Once again, Gary, Patto and the team at Tackle World have provided outstanding support to the Club and I trust you will join me in showing our appreciation at every opportunity by supporting them with your business. I would also like to thank all our Burrinjuck sponsors and ask that you support them whenever possible as well.

Finally, I wish to thank the outgoing Committee for your efforts this year, especially those that filled in when required, and wish the incoming Committee and all our members all the best for a great year to come.

Hello fellow members

Although originally elected as the CFC's Assistant Secretary for the 2006/07 fishing year, I was quickly promoted to the Secretary's position after the member elected in this position was required to step down for personal reasons. This position was nothing new given I had filled it for the 2005/06 year, however my motivation towards the position was not high as last year. Although I fulfilled the core duties of the position I feel I could have been able to provide more if not for a couple of changes in my life outside the club. Having said that though I really must thank our President (Shane) who never seems to let anything slip through the cracks and whose enthusiasm and dedication to the club and our operating environment is second to none. I would also like to thank all the CFCs sponsors, with considerable appreciation going to Gary, Patto and the team at Tackle World Canberra, without them minor events like the meeting raffles all the way through to our major event – the Burrinjuck Convention – would not be possible.

The 06/07 financial year showed a profit of \$38.27. This was down \$372.35 from the 05/06 financial year.


This year, Columbia shirts were purchased and subsidised to club members. This and the accommodation expenses for club outings were the main expenses for the 06/07 financial year.

RECORDER'S REPORT

The 2006/07 season has come and gone and so ends my first year as Club Recorder, it has been an enjoyable experience to have a more active role in the Club and be part of the Committee.

On a personal note I have had a great fishing year (minus one mishap at the Mulwala Cod Classic), and I've caught and lost plenty of fish. I've learnt a lot through the Club this year especially in regards to saltwater fishing. Since becoming an ANSA member mid way through the year the only Masters fish I seem to be able to catch is Carp, but I'll work on that one in 2007/08!

The 2006/07 Club Championship was highly contested with several members exceeding last years winning total. This was the case with all Championship categories, all scores exceeded the 2005/06 mark.

There were 36 Club Line class Records set this year. There were 20 new Open Records, 11 new Ladies Records, and 5 new Junior Records. These included 9 new European Carp records.

There were 7 new All-Time Board fish which include:

Mario Imbriano submitted the only tagging captures for 2006/07, 1 Black Marlin, 3 Striped Marlin, and 3 Blue Marlin.

2006/07 saw a big increase in Captures, 504 to be exact which is up from 307 Captures in 2005/06. There was a large increase in captures of certain freshwater species such as European Carp (+77) and Rainbow Trout (+26), but interestingly a massive decline in Brown Trout Captures (-24). There was also an increase in captures of some saltwater species. Most of these tended to be estuary or beach species, such as Dusky Flathead (+45), Australian Salmon (+15), and Yellowfin Bream (+14). There was a decline in Captures of Gamefish such as Striped Tuna (-13) and Yellowfin Tuna (-6). There were no Yellowtail Kingfish, Albacore, Dolphin Fish (Mahi Mahi), or Australian Bonito weighed in this year.

The combined total weight of all fish weighed in this year was 916.76kg up 117.28kg on 2005/06. The average fish weight was 1.820kg down from 2.602kg in 2005/06, the decline in captures of large Saltwater Game species and the increase in smaller Estuary or Beach species would have contributed to this.

The biggest fish weighed in for 2006/07 was a 28kg Yellowfin Tuna captured by Dave Jenkins.

Of the 504 captures for the year, 26 senior anglers accounted for 154 Masters-class captures of over 100. Junior Members submitted 16 Masters-class captures of over 80 points, including 11 over 100 points.

There were 35 captures over 250 points, and 5 of these were over 500 points. The highest pointscoring fish was a European Carp caught by Andre Pretorius which weighed in at 11.15kg on 1kg for 892 points.
