

## ~ SECRETARY'S REPORT ~

Boy time flies! This year has gone really fast, it seems like I've only just sat in the Secretary's chair and now it's time to get out.

Overall the club is in fairly good shape. The membership has remained fairly steady over the 2007/2008 year. In 2005 the club had 88 members, which grew to 139 in 2006, but suffered a bit of a slump in 2007 with 120 members. This last year we had 117 members, which is a slight drop of 2.5%. This year we put \$3000.00 into fish stocking compared to \$00.00 last year. The rest was made up of small increases across the board.



## ~ RECORDER'S REPORT ~

This was my second year as Club Recorder, and having learnt the ropes last season this year has been quite enjoyable. As with any Committee position there is a little bit of work to do, in my case many nights in front of the computer, but it's rewarding to know you're contributing to the Club.

Personally I've had a good year when it comes to fishing. The highlight for me would have to be the Windamere Outing, and catching an Eel Tailed Catfish of 3.20kg on 1kg line (Which turned out to be close to an All-Time Board Fish, only 10 grams off!). I've also put a lot of effort into catching BIG Carp and I've caught some good ones, but I think Andre's Record is safe... for now.

One of our Senior teams placed 2nd in the State Titles this year (Greg Davis, James Hossack and Myself), and I also managed 2nd in the Individual Senior Male section. One of our Junior Teams also placed 2nd (Rhiannon Hossack, David Stacy, and Chantel Stacy), Rhiannon also placed 3rd in the Individual Junior Girl section.

It was great to be a part of the CFC winning the Narooma Convention, well done to all the Members who attended, especially those who braved the conditions and weighed in some fish! It's a shame Shane and I missed the Presentation.

I'd also like to thank Darren for filling in on the Recording duties at the Burrinjuck Convention.

Most of the Championship categories were highly contested this year. Only a few hundred points separated most categories, which is really only one or two good Captures. It's fantastic to see the spirit in which the Championship is run, especially in regards to Outings with Members sharing information and helping each other catch fish and improve each others angling skills.

There were 24 Club Line Class Records set this year. This included 19 new Open Records, 3 new Junior Records, and 2 new Ladies Records.

David Jenkins was the only Member to do any tagging this year, with 10 Albacore to his name.

The biggest fish of the year was a Cobia of 26.00kg caught by Ben Lemmon at South West Rocks.

Mel Marlborough caught another Australian Record, this year it was a Teraglin of 3.22kg (All Tackle).

The number of captures for 2007/08 was 401, which is down from 507 in 2006/07.

In the Freshwater captures of Natives were up, Golden Perch (+13), Silver Perch (+14), and Eel Tailed Catfish (+14). Where as captures of introduced species seemed to be down, European Carp (-52), Rainbow Trout (-39), and Redfin Perch (-9). The increase in Natives is due to many anglers fishing Windamere this year.

In the Saltwater the Estuary species such as Dusky Flathead, and Yellowfin Bream are a regular capture, and will probably remain so with the popularity of soft plastic fishing. Australian Salmon are always a common capture and this year was no different.

The combined total weight of all fish weighed in for 2007/08 was 795.91kg, this is down 120.85kg on 2006/07. The average fish weight was 1.98kg which is up from 1.82kg in 2006/07.

Of the 401 captures for the year, 22 Senior Members accounted for 142 Masters-class captures of over 100 points. Junior Members submitted 17 Masters-class captures of over 80 points, including 12 over 100 points.

There were 29 captures over 250 points, and 2 of these were over 500 points. The highest pointscoring fish was a Smooth Ray caught by Andrew McGovern which weighed in at 11.40kg on 1kg for 570 points. This was closely followed by Dave Walton with a Golden Perch of 5.20kg on 1kg for 520 points.

Next year will see the introduction of the ANSA All-Tackle Masters, which is a length based Masters (non line class) hopefully this will appeal to potential new Members as well as a new challenge to existing Members.


The CFC is also introducing two new length based trophies, one for Flathead (all Species) and the other for Golden Perch. The idea being the longest total length of all Flathead or Golden Perch wins the respective trophy. Quantity can win over quality in this case, so you don't need to catch a fish of a lifetime to take out the trophy.

That's about all from me, If had a great time being Club Recorder in 2007/08, and If voted in by my fellow Members I'm more than willing to remain on the Committee and fill the role of Recorder again in 2008/09. There has been a lot of preparation getting the Database ready to take length based captures, and I'm keen to see the transition run as smoothly as possible, I'm sure there will be some unforeseen challenges ahead!

I'd like to thank all of our Clubs Sponsors, especially our Major Sponsor Tackleworld Canberra who have been fantastic as always. Finally I'd like to wish all Members well for 2008/09, I hope you stay safe and catch some outstanding fish.






