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like Burrinjuck and the Carp-Out, and that the new committee will need to make sure that the Club meets the needs of the members.

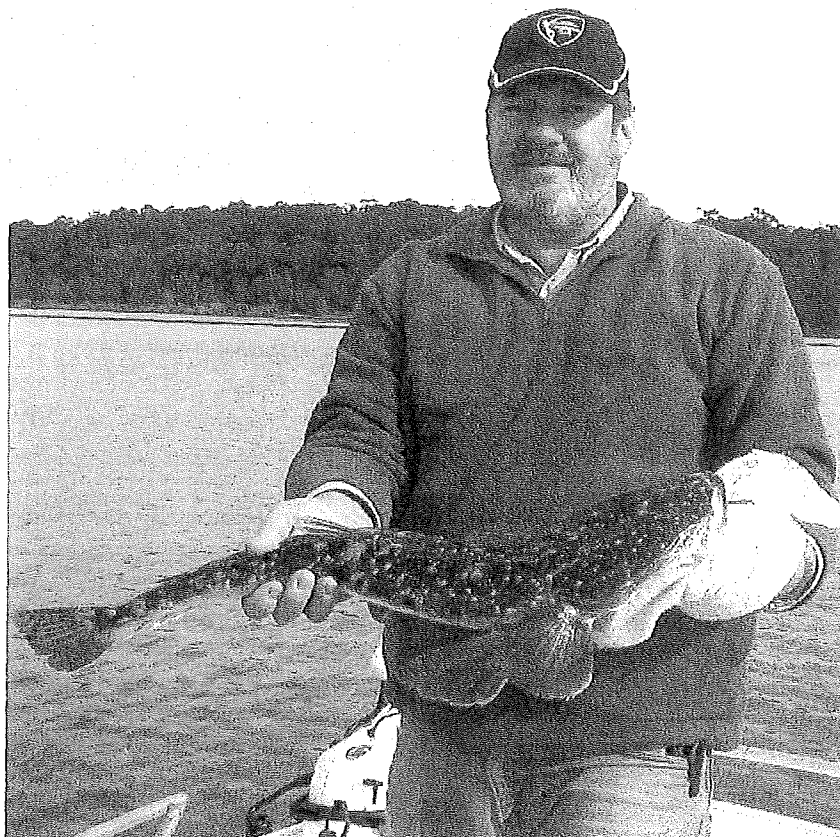

~ SECRETARY'S REPORT ~

2009 – 2010

Well another year has come and gone and a first for me in a secretary role. I would like to thank all those people that assisted me over the year it was much appreciated.

The club membership this year stood at 91, 65 seniors & 26 juniors compared to 68 seniors & 24 juniors last year. Thanks to all members for a great year and remember the more you get involved the more you get out of the club or that is what I have found this year.

We had some great speakers during the year and look forward to some of them returning in the coming year with more great information. Thanks to Pat Brennan (past member) knots & rigs session, Mick McKenzie (NSW Maritime) life jackets & what's happening on the water, Andy McGovern (member) NZ fishing the stones for big kings, Tim Allard (member) fishing Canada, Steve Borkowskis (member) Talbingo fishing outing information, Ian "Big E" Phillips and Greg Reid Bay & Basin Sports Fishing) secrets to catching big flathead and fishing Jervis Bay. Looking forward to more speaks this coming year.

Burrinjuck was a first for me as a senior member as I attended as a junior member way back in the distance past. Another great event with 171 entries made up of 132 seniors & 39 juniors. We had 8 clubs including CFC and 16 non club member attendees capturing a total of 565 fish weighing in at a total of 980.2kg. I am looking forward to the 2010 event.

The annual Carpathon was well attended this year with quite a number of new faces attending from the general public which was good to see and a few new members as a result of the event. Lets see if we can improve on this result in 2011 as this is a great day out although the carp have been a little quiet, might have to burley up the area weeks in advance.

The Canberra Carp-Out was again a great success and would not have been possible without the assistance of members, sponsors and the ACT Government Canberra Festival grant. There was an increase in numbers again by a couple of hundred entries which took us to 2049 entries (1296 adults & 753 children) who managed to weigh in a total of 1,420.39kg of fish (691 carp @ 1,256.52kg & 883 redfin @ 163.87kg). The feedback from this event was terrific and we are already working on the 2011 Canberra Carp-Out.

We also held a fishing clinic the day before the Carp-Out and found that there was quite a demand for this activity as it took no time to fill 40 positions even with the a fee to cover the cost of the tackle packs and printing that was supplied as part of the package. It would be worth looking at expanding this if resources allow in 2011. We also found that 2 hours was just not enough time and 3 – 3.5 hours would probably be closer to the mark to allow for some fishing time.

Other activities that the club and or members were involved in this past year were;

- Tackle World Expo (barbecue)

- Native fish stocking of the local lakes

- Parliamentary enquiry into Recreational fishing

- Upper- Murrumbidgee. Demonstration Reach planting day

- Capital Region Fishing Alliance (CRFA) was formed and the club became a member

I am sure that I have missed a few but as you can see the club was very active throughout the year and I would like to thank all those members that put time aside to get involved.

The club photo competition has highlighted a few keen photographers and I think Patrick Luttrell said that we had about 100 photos submitted throughout the year which I thought was a great effort. Still room for more so in the coming year if you have you camera handy take some snaps and send them in, you just never know when you might come up trumps as a winner.

We have allocated \$6000.00 for fish stocking 2010-11 year.

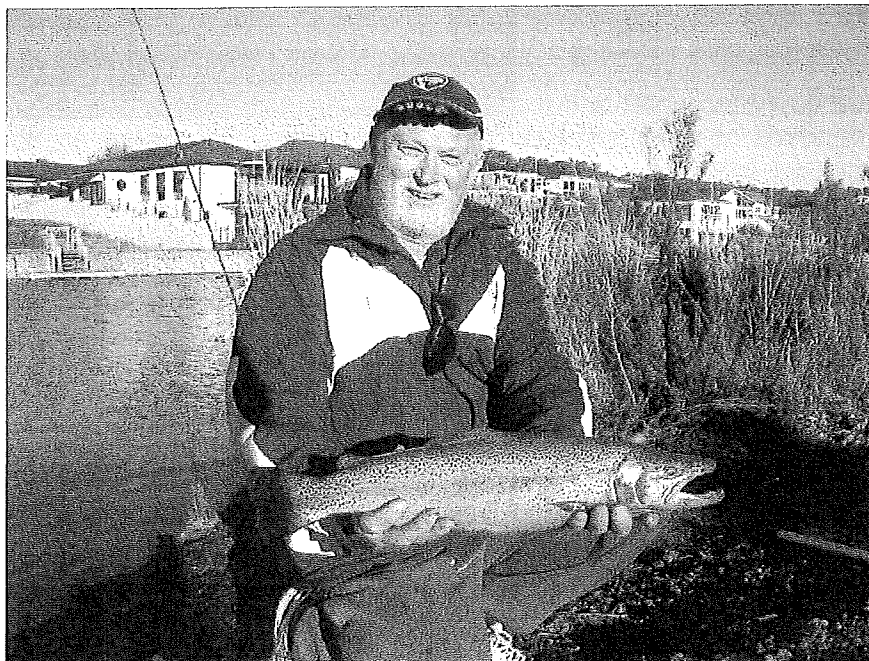
The Club had a successful Burrinjuck Convention with a total profit of \$5,197.00, up by \$1,240.00 from last year.

~ RECORDER'S REPORT ~

2009/10

Hi All

Another great year of fishing has come and gone. There have been a lot of good times had while fishing, and also some hard yards put in to ensure the success of the Clubs activities.

Probably the highlight of the year for me from a purely fishing perspective was a period of a few months over summer where several members would meet regularly on the banks of Lake Tuggeranong. Over this period there were 5 different species of fish caught with 6 new club line class records set (mostly by juniors), and numerous PB's broken. Aside from the fishing it was just a great way to spend a day, sitting in a comfortable chair in the shade of the trees with a few cold drinks while waiting for the next rod to go off. Hopefully we can get something similar happening again this year. There is a big bread eating Murray Cod out there with my name on it!

When it comes to Outings one of my highlights would once again be the April trip to Windamere Dam. I managed to get a few large Golden Perch on the bank this time, as well as the 'occasional Catfish' (make that every occasion!). I won't forget the last ditch attempt Anthony Heiser and I put in to get a Silver Perch on the final morning, we went to the Stanfield's secret spot and scored a big Silver each and several other fish, it was probably my best session of the trip.

The Talbingo Outing was something special, as it usually is. Seeing countless numbers of massive Golden Perch in the crystal clear waters of Blowering Dam was something I will never ever forget it. After hours and hours and thousands of casts at these fish I finally caught one on a lure recommended to me by Ashley Barber, first cast!

The other Outing that stood out for me was the Narooma Convention, particularly a midnight session to coincide with high tide at Cemetery Beach. Shane Jasprizza and I both caught some great Tailor and Salmon and arrived back to the cabin as the other guys were just getting out of bed. Also who could forget the hot Flathead bite that was discovered at Lake Corunna, to be able to anchor up and bag out without even moving was unbelievable. I won't forget the torrential rain that drenched us while we were being towed back to the ramp by the Clark Brothers.

These are my memories of 2009/10, but enough about me and onto the important details.

There were 658 fish submitted for 2009/10 which is well up on previous years, with just over 400 fish in each of the previous two seasons. I put a lot of this down to increased participation in the Club total length trophies. We had 128 Flathead captures submitted this year which is up by 89. There were 544 fish weighed and/or measured, and 114 fish measured only. The 544 fish that were weighed came to a total of 983.12kg which is up 294.73kg on last year. The average fish weight for 2009/10 was 1.81kg which is down from an average of 1.94kg in 2008/09.

There were 3 All Time Board Fish records broken in 2009/10, these were:

There were no Masters achieved this year however I believe we should see some in 2010/11 as several members are closing in on different Divisions.

There were 43 Club line class records set this year which is up from 36 last year. These included 20 new Open records, 18 new junior records, and 5 new Ladies Records. Of the 25 'senior' records, 4 were set by juniors, so 22 of the 43 records were set by juniors. I believe this is a fantastic result because as every year goes by these records can only get harder and harder to beat.

A total of 20 Senior Members accounted for 190 Masters-Class Captures of 100 points or more, and 7 Junior Members accounted for 56 Masters-Class Captures of 80 points or more.

The Heaviest Fish weighed in was a Barramundi of 26.00kg caught by Chris Lemmon at Kinchant Dam in Queensland.

The Highest Pointscoring Fish was a European Carp of 8.78kg caught by yours truly on 1kg line from Lake Tuggeranong for 702 points. The Highest Pointscoring Fish caught by a junior was a Brown Ray of 9.72kg caught by Mitchell McGovern on 1kg line from Lake Tuross for 486 points.

The longest fish was a Barramundi of 1240mm caught by Chris Lemmon at Kinchant Dam. Chris Lemmon also set an ANSA National Record of a Barramundi of 25.50kg on 6kg line for the Gamefishing Division.

In the Saltwater Captures of Dusky Flathead were up (+87) this was largely due to the big numbers taken at Lake Corunna, and a less than expected number in 2008/09. Tailor were also up (+37) this was influenced by a Fraser Island trip by Anthony Heiser and quite a few from the Clark Brothers beach sessions. There weren't any real standout decreases in 2009/10; however it seems unusual to me that we had very low numbers of Snapper weighed in with only 1 for 2009/10.

In the Freshwater most of the 'Local' species were up, Carp (+38), Rainbow Trout (+25), Redfin (+32), Golden Perch (+12), Brown Trout (+6), Eel Tailed Catfish (+10), Murray Cod (+7). We had no Brook Trout or Atlantic Salmon weighed in for 2009/10.

That's about all from me, thanks to our sponsors who look after us each year, especially our major sponsor Tackleworld Canberra; I think they really look after us as a Club and as individuals. Finally thanks to all our Members, I look forward to fishing with you all in 2010/11.

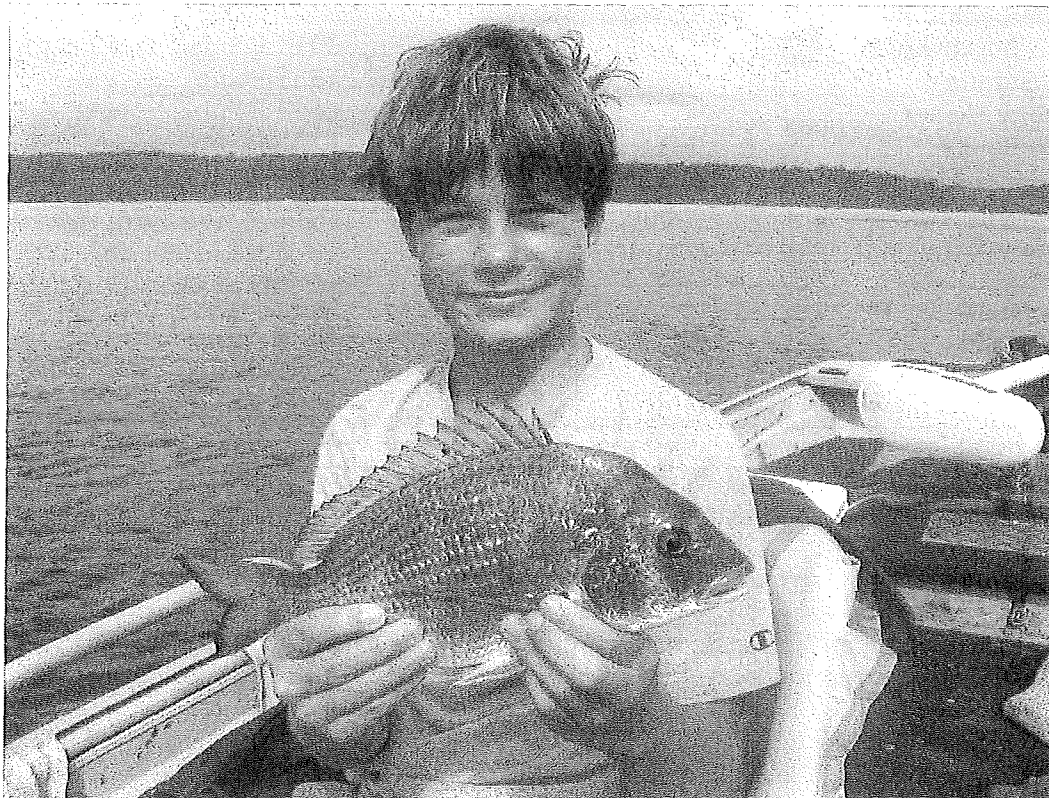

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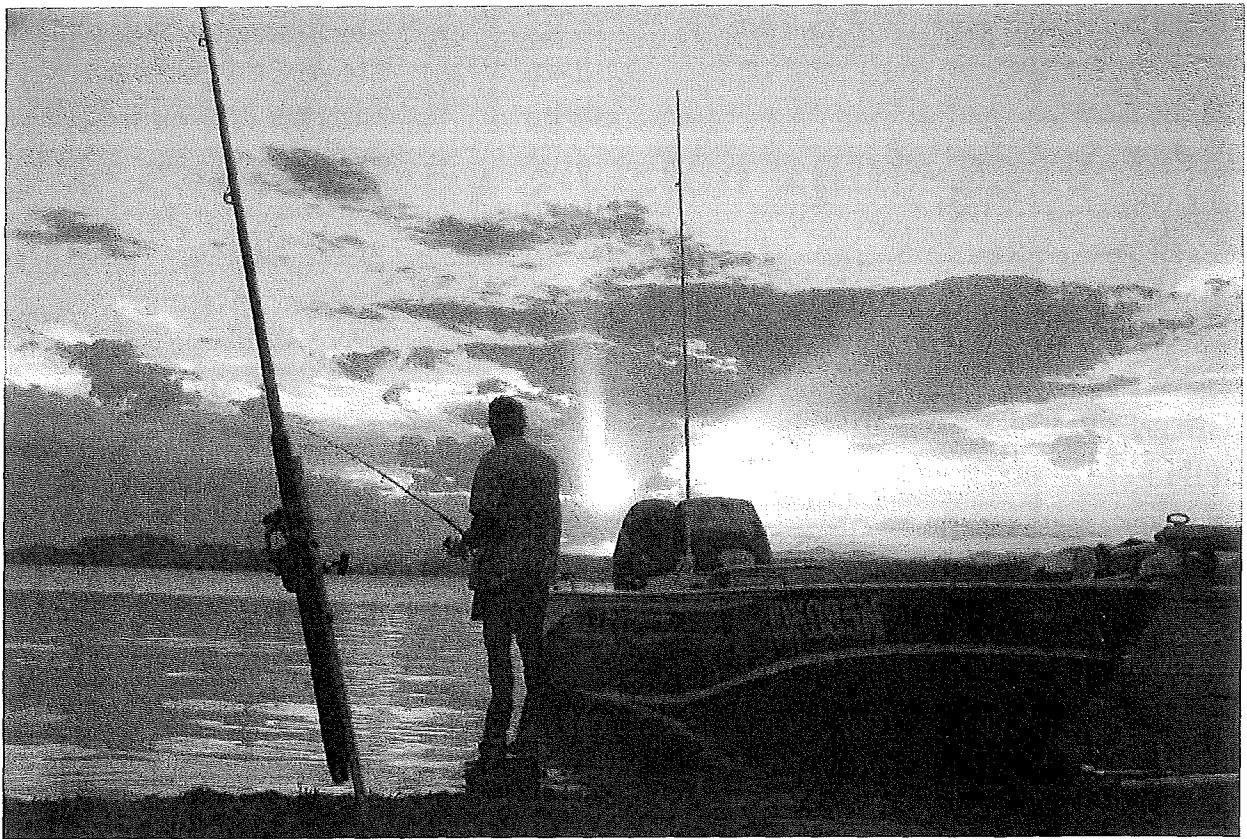
