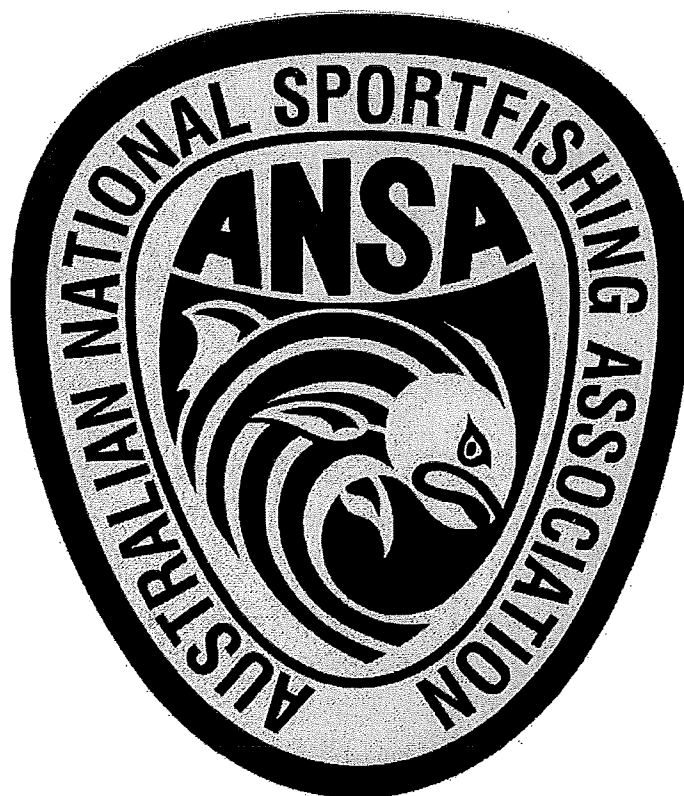

Presidents Report

2010-2011

Hi all,

Once again we're at the end of another year of the CFC Committee. It's with some sadness that I'm making this address, as it's the 3rd and last time I'll be addressing you as the outgoing President. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time as President of this Club, and I think it's a great Club. It's full of good like minded people, and in my opinion it has a lot of miles left in it yet.

The Club is something to be proud of. Not only does it meet our needs for involvement with people interested in fishing, and providing opportunities to go fishing and learn from others, the CFC also does a lot for the Community. We contribute to stocking in the local lakes, so everyone in the Canberra region, and visitors, have a chance to catch native fish. We promote the fantastic sport, hobby or pastime of fishing (whatever it is to you), and in recent years we've been making a significant contribution to the ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group, through profits from the Carp-Out. Each and every member of the CFC should be proud to be a member of this great Club and what it does for the community.

Burrinjuck, in my opinion, was once again a great success in 2010. Maybe that's because I was the Burrinjuck Chairman, not sure. The profit was slightly down this year, partially due to the investment in raffle tickets for the future. I think the introduction of the random number generator for the raffle was a great idea. If you've ever been involved with scrunching tickets at Burrinjuck you'll know what I mean. I'm hopeful that the introduction of a couple more trophies for non-ANSA sections is something that will encourage people to continue to support the event, and possibly even bring in some new entrants. It's got a great atmosphere, and a tradition that should be maintained. To do this however, we need the ongoing support of our members, as we rely on their willingness to put in a big effort over the weekend to make it a success. I'm not going to thank individuals this year, but I do thank all those that assisted with the event. Without your support to set-up on Friday, to prepare and serve meals over the weekend, register entrants, weigh fish, organise the sponsors, sell raffle tickets and do the final cleanup on the Sunday, the event simply would not happen, so thank you.

This year's Carp-Out was a very different event. Although actual participation was down compared to last year's event, we caught more Carp than in 2010. The reasons for the lower attendance this year can be attributed to many reasons, like it was the morning after Sky-fire, and we didn't advertise as early or as well as we had in the previous year. I have no doubt in my mind that the single largest contributor to the reduced participation was the late approval from the ACT Government to use Lennox Gardens as our Carp-Out headquarters. This year it seemed that there was one obstacle after another to getting the approval. To my mind, this delay was the main cause for lower participation, as it prevented early advertising of the event. The second most significant factor was that although we had good sponsorship by the Chronicle again in 2011, it was not the same as the great coverage the event received in 2010. For continued success of the Club will need to make sure we have the approval for Lennox Gardens finalised by the New Year, to allow for a longer lead-in of advertising. This is something for next year's Committee to work on in parallel to Burrinjuck. At the end of the day, even though we had a reduced grant amount, with a small donation from the Club, we still made a donation of \$4,000 to the ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group. I'd like to thank everyone who contributed to this year's Carp-Out. Without the support of our members to register competitors, cook the BBQ, weigh the fish, organise the event etc., then this event could not be done. So thank you to everyone who assisted with the event, whether it was on the day or throughout the lead up to the event. You all should be proud of what we as a small Club achieve for the Canberra community by putting on this event.

Now for my favourite part of the CFC, the outings. As I've said in previous years, outings are why I first I joined a fishing club. I needed a way to get out and go fishing, and the CFC fulfilled that. These days I usually only get to fish at outings, and I look forward to each and every one that I attend. I consider the outings to be the heart of the Club, and I look forward to seeing others in action and learning new things from other club members. And those that have seen me at outings will know that I enjoy the social side of outings! As well as the great social aspect outings also

Even though we are getting new members, our membership is in decline. We have more people failing to renew their membership than new members. The Club will need to identify new and exciting things to keep the membership interested, and also come up with some new ways to attract new members. If the Club can make headway on these items, I'm sure that the Canberra Fisherman's Club will continue to prosper.

Secretary's Report

2010 – 2011

Well another year has come and gone and second for me in a secretary role. I would like to thank all those people that assisted me over the year it was much appreciated.

The club membership this year stood at 70, 51 seniors & 19 juniors compared to 91, 65 seniors & 26 juniors last year. Thanks to all members for a great year and remember the more you get involved the more you get out of the club or that is what I have found again this year.

We had some great speakers again during the year and hope to see some return in the coming year with more great information. I would like to thank;

- Pat Brennan (past member) talking to us about fishing for bone fish & peacock bass in exotic locations.
- Roman Dicoski & Barry Anderson Googong Green & Gold presentation on catching Murray Cod in our local backyard.
- Adam Samios on his TV fishing reports of the local fishing scene.
- Mick McKenzie from NSW Maritime bringing us up to date on the latest in Life Jacket regulations so we could pass this information onto our Burrinjuck attendee's
- Finally Matt and Kooka from Tackle World Canberra for their great tackle display/sale and an insight into their fishing tackle, tips and tricks, I know me for one wish I had more cash on the night to spend.

Hopefully I have not forgotten anyone.

Burrinjuck was another great event again this year with 157 entries made up of 129 seniors & 28 juniors. Out of these entries we had 122 ANSA and 35 non ANSA attendee's capturing a total of 349 fish weighing in at a total of 545.96kg. Looking forward to the 2011 event

Although I did not attend the annual Carpathon this year it was still well attended with a few new faces from the general public. This is always good to see. Once again the carp were a little quiet, but still seemed to generate a few stories for the rat.

The Canberra Carp-Out was again successful and would not have been possible without the assistance of members, sponsors and the ACT Government Canberra Festival grant. This year we were down on numbers due to a number of factors which were beyond our control but still managed 1,181 entries (765 adults & 416 children) who managed to weigh in a total of 1,444.09kg of fish (886 carp @ 1,361.04kg & 445 redfin @ 83.05kg).

Thanks to the participation of all at this event we managed to raise a total of \$6,457.50 which was a great effort. Again 50% of the money raised was put aside for stocking of native fish in our local lakes. Again the additional 50% of the money raised is to be donated to the Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group, but this year the club agreed to add to the donation amount and round it up to a donation of \$4,000.00 which I am sure will be gladly accepted.

The feedback from this event was again very positive and we are already working on the 2012 Canberra Carp-Out.

We also held the fishing clinic the day before the Carp-Out again and found that there was still a great demand for this activity as it took no time to fill 40 positions. A fee again was charged to cover the cost of the tackle packs and printing that was supplied as part of the package which all participants were happy to pay. We also extended the clinic to 3 hours this year which allowed time for fishing which actually saw a junior participant catch a fish which was great. And thanks to Tackle World this capture was awarded with a rod and reel combo. I again would thank all the members that assisted with running the clinic and to Kooka from Tackle World who eventually agreed to be our presenter on the day

Other activities that the club and or members were involved in this past year were;

- Tackle World Expo (barbecue)
- Native fish stocking of the local lakes
- Upper- Bidgee Carp muster

I am sure that I have missed a few but as you can see once again the club was very active throughout the year and I would like to thank all those members that put time aside to get involved.

The club photo competition had about 100 photos submitted again throughout the year, with a couple of months being a bit light on and members needing some prompting to send the photos in. There have been some great shots again and I know Matt from Tackle World found it hard to choose a winner from time to time. So remember to carry the camera each fishing trip and if you need some advice about waterproofing your picture taking device and or want a one on one competition on who can take the most photo's in a session well just go and have a talk to Anthony or Rat for the year.

The newsletter a challenge at the best of times, I would like to thank Patrick and Greg for their effort in helping to piece together the monthly newsletter at times I know it was nearly all too much. Remember anybody can contribute to the newsletter no matter how small. I put it to all members that everybody should have a go at submitting something for the newsletter in the coming year.

The website has had some new additions and changes over the year and I hope members have found this a valid resource. I was hoping over the past year that I would have had more time to put into updating and improving the site but it was not to be. I hope to be able to focus on this for the club in the coming 12 months.

Looking back over the last 12 months I see a club that has again achieve a lot, we are financially sound and are in a very good position going forward for the next 12 months, but if we don't start to have more members getting involved this could quickly change which would be a real shame.

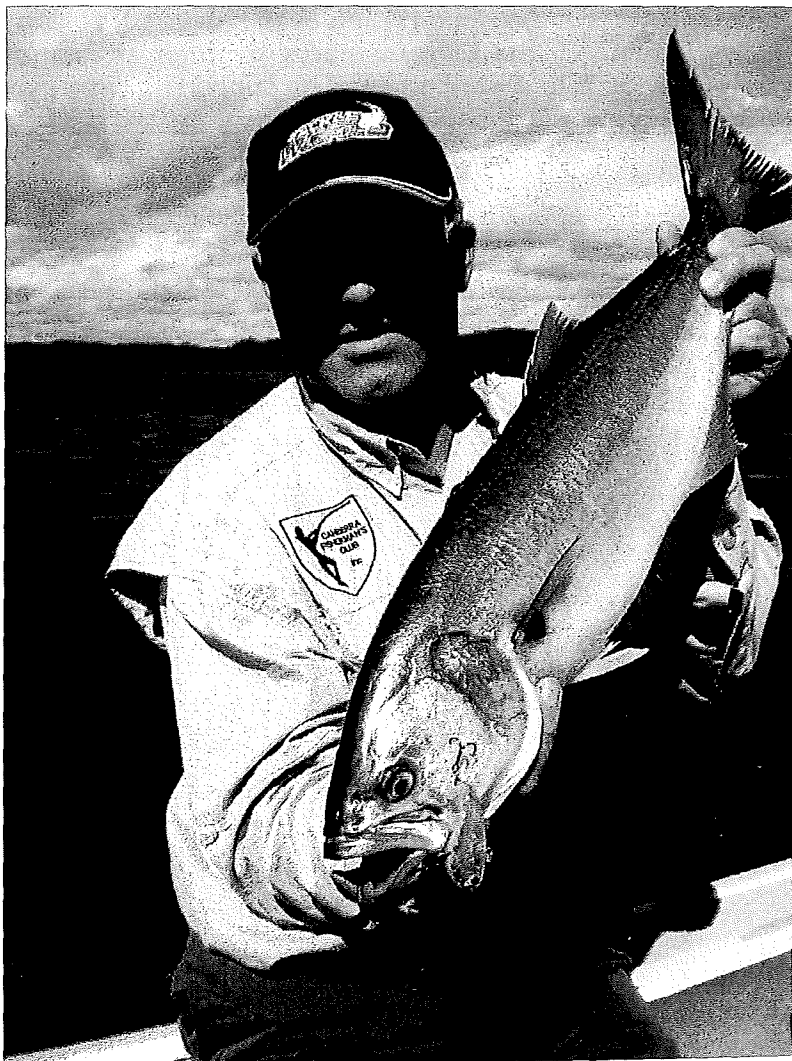

Treasurer's Report

2010-11

In the 2010/11 financial year, the Club made a profit of \$901.68, compared with \$11,938 in 2009/10.

The Club ran a very successful Burrinjuck Convention in November 2010 making a profit of \$5,035.93. Thank you to our sponsors and to all who helped make it a successful Convention.

The Club joined Tackle World Canberra to run a successful Carp Out in March 2011 as part of the Canberra Day Festival. Despite the grim weather and the other difficulties leading up to the event, the Carp Out still made a profit of \$6,666.49 to be shared equally between fish stocking for 2011/12 and the ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group. The Club donated \$4,000 to the ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group by supplementing the 50% share of profits with some of the money raised from drink and food sales at the Carp Out.

The Club put \$1,650 into fish stocking in 2010/11 (fish stocking expenses totalled \$4,165 as the Club was not invoiced for 2009/10 fish stocking activities until July 2010). The Club raised \$5,130.95 for fish stocking activities for 2011/12. This consists of \$3,331.24 from half of the net proceeds of the Carp Out, \$1,616.91 of the net proceeds of the fish stocking raffle, and \$182.50 from the proceeds of the Tackle World Barbecue on 4 February 2011.

We had no other major fund raising events in 2010/11 and the accounts have been audited. Finally, I thank all the Club members for their assistance throughout the year and to our major sponsor Tackle World Canberra for its support. I wish everyone all the best for the coming fishing season.

Scope

I have audited the attached financial report of Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated for the year ended 30 June 2011 comprising a Balance Sheet and Statement of Receipts and Expenditure.

The Committee is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report and the information contained therein, and has determined that the basis of accounting used is appropriate to the needs of the members. I have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members. No opinion is expressed as to whether the basis of accounting used is appropriate to the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee's accountability requirements. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates, to any person other than the members, or of any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

My audit procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether in all material respects the financial report is presented fairly so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the Association's financial position and performance as represented by the results of its operations.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Qualification

Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated derives its income from various activities. As effective control over most transactions is not established until they are entered in the accounting records, I have been unable to independently verify whether amounts receivable from these sources have been completely accounted for. Accordingly, my audit in relation to income was limited to amounts recorded on the bank statements and accounting records.

Audit Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects on the financial statements of the matter referred to in the above paragraph, the financial report of Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated presents fairly the financial position as at 30 June 2011 and the results of its operations for the year then ended.

Recorders Report

2010-2011

Another year has come and gone, and as they say time flies when you're having fun. It seems like there is never enough time to do all those fishing trips you have thought about over the year.

This year I focused on achieving a few personal fishing goals. As you know Carp fishing is a bit of a passion of mine and I put in a lot of time and effort trying to improve over the last year. Having a focus on a single species isn't really compatible with competing strategically for the Club Championship, and having won last year I decided to let others battle it out. I managed to better my Carp PB three times over the year with fish at 10.79kg, 10.84kg and 11.22kg. The highlight would be knocking over the All Time Boardfish which has been one of my goals. Another goal is a 30lb Carp which is something around 13.60kg, it's not going to be easy but it's something to aim for.

A highlight of the year for me was a trip to Windamere Dam with Jamie and Tom Stanfield. We were hoping to get a mixed bag of Catfish, Silvers, and Goldens. After a slow start to the first day I hooked into the first fish of the trip which turned out to be a Cod around 10-12kg. I fought it for 20 minutes on 1kg braid until the hook pulled with the Cod just about ready to be netted. I was gutted at the time, but it didn't matter too much, we went on to land stacks of large Golden Perch. One day of the trip I just couldn't do a thing wrong, anywhere I cast was an instant Golden it was one of those days you dream about.

Another great trip was a weekend to Lake Jindabyne with Shane Jasprizza, Darren Hossack and Chris De La Rue. We caught a fair few trout, but I don't think I've laughed so much in ages. Shane was bitten on the lip by ants that found their way into his sandwich, and dinner at the Pub was hilarious. Shane scored us new jobs as 'dish-pigs', it was funny, but probably one of those 'you had to be there' things.

Enough about me and onto the important information, there were 565 fish weighed in for 2010/11, which is a little less than last year but still up on long term averages. The length trophies have a lot to do with this and I think with the introduction of Australian Salmon and Trout - All Species this year will see this figure jump up massively.

There were 448 fish weighed, and 117 measured only. The 448 fish weighed in came to a total of 920.63kg, this makes the average fish weight 2.05kg which is slightly up on previous years.

There were 4 new All Time Board fish set this year (and one equalled) these were:

▪ Dave Walton	Barramundi	27.00kg

▪ Andrew McGovern	Golden Perch	7.04kg

Shane Jasprizza was the only person to achieve a Masters this year. Shane caught a 7.42kg Yellowtail Kingfish near Montague Island to complete his Gamefishing Masters.

There were 33 Line Class Records set this year, which consisted of 20 Open Records, 1 Ladies Record, and 12 Junior Records. This was down from 43 records set in 2009/10 but it's about average over the last 4-5 years. This year we didn't have too many members weighing in exotic species from QLD or the NT, and lets face it these records can only get harder to beat as the years go by.

A total of 18 Senior Members accounted for 118 Master Class Captures of 100 points or more, this is well down from last year at 20 Members and 190 Captures. Three Junior Members accounted for 35 Masters Class Captures of 80 points or more. This is also down from 7 Juniors and 56 Captures last year. This might be something we need to keep an eye on, as it would not be good to see this trend continue.

The heaviest fish weighed in this year was a Barramundi of 27kg caught by Dave Walton at Kinchant Dam in Queensland.

The longest fish submitted was a Striped Marlin caught by Steve Bailey at 1900mm, and second longest was a Hairtail caught by Chris Clark at 1600mm.

Tom Stanfield broke several NSW and Australian Records this year for species such as European Carp, Brown Trout, Australian Salmon, and Australian Bonito. Almost too many to mention really, very well done indeed.

In regards to saltwater species Dusky Flathead were top of the list in terms of numbers of fish submitted with 116. I believe this has a lot to do with the Length Trophy, and next year I suspect Australian Salmon might be up there. There were also increases in Bonito and Kingfish, this would have a lot to do with the success of the Kioloa Outing, but I believe it was a pretty good season for these species on the South Coast. Tailor dropped back noticeably perhaps due to Anthony not going to Fraser Island this year. Silver Trevally were also well down the list with only one weighed in.

In the freshwater things were up and down. Catfish were down but there was no Windamere Outing this year. Redfin and Rainbow Trout also dropped significantly for no apparent reason, we even had an extra Outing to Jindabyne.

We've run another successful Burrinjuck Convention and Carp Out, which will keep the Club and its projects well funded in the near future. A worrying sign is that our Membership seems to be slowly eroding. We've picked up a few new active Members but these guys are not enough to cover those that are disappearing. Also we seem to be lacking participation by Ladies and Juniors lately too.

I believe we need to be doing more to attract our current membership to participate in relaxed social events, such as casual local fishing, as well as investing time in attracting new members who will bring fresh ideas and enthusiasm into the Club. If we're going to ask more and more from fewer members we need to be giving something back for their efforts. I also believe we need to move with the times, modern anglers don't need to meet at a Club once or twice a month to get the latest fishing reports or ask questions from experienced anglers. THE YEAR IN REVIEW 2010-2011

Venue:

Kioloa/Ulladulla 24-25 July 2010

For the first time in many years, the opening outing to the competition year was a resounding success. At least as far as captures went. Only six members fished the outing but between them, they accounted for over 60 fish. Wairo Beach had good Salmon and Tailor in the gutters and outside there was some good Kingfish and a heap of Bonito. Jigging proved the best method on the Kings and Bonnies, particularly as catching live bait proved almost impossible. Best King went to Greg Davis with a fish of just over 4kg. Greg also accounted for the best Salmon of 1.55kg. The biggest Tailor was 810 grams.

Anthony (I don't need a Grant's guide), Heiser calling Brian's capture as a Rat Cobia only to find that it was a toadfish. Brian (Navigator) Stacy's GPS plotting the kingfish reef a few kilometres inland.

Venue:

Buckenderra 14-15 August 2010

The Friday afternoon lead-in to the actual outing produced the best weather for the whole weekend. It turned out also the biggest fish for the trip (Steve Borkowskis caught a 1.57kg Brown on worms suspended under a float). The seven hardy attendees needed every stitch of warm clothing to survive the arctic winds and squally conditions. Boat launching was impossible with heavy rain in the lead up days making the banks boggy and the makeshift boat ramp at Buckenderra itself was out of commission and being relocated. Due to the conditions, all fishing was off the bank. Over the actual competition time, 12 fish were caught (all Rainbows) with Steve Borkowskis accounting for 8 of those. Best fish was a 1.2kg Rainbow taken by Chris Head. Some large yabbies were also dug up around the bank with Tom Stanfield enjoying a small feast back at the cabin.

Thirteen members headed to Highland Lodge for the weekend. Thankfully, the weather was a fair bit better than the previous outing and some excellent fishing was the result. Over the weekend, 26 fish were weighed in with all species available in Jindabyne being caught. The best fish was a 3kg Brown caught by Chris Lemmon with some other notable captures being a 1.68kg Atlantic Salmon to Glen Malam and a 380mm Brook to Hendrick Maat. Fish were caught trolling, lure-casting and on bait from the bank. The best Rainbow Trout was 920 grams. As is the norm for this outing, a few drinks were consumed around the slow combustion fire and plasma TV on both Friday and Saturday nights whilst catching up on the footy finals in both AFL and NRL.

Venue:**Talbingo ANSA Convention 16-17 October 2010**

From good weather at Kalkite to what can only be described as storms of biblical proportions at Talbingo. With major flooding throughout the area and high winds bringing down trees, etc there were a large number of road closures and just getting to Talbingo proved difficult for many. Shane spent a glorious two hours watching the river rise and then slowly fall at Tumut before being able to cross and he was second car in a long line back towards Gundagai. Whilst the weather did improve slowly as the weekend progressed, the damage had been done in the lead up. The dams were full and overflowing and water clarity was chocolate at best, waterfalls and run off into the dams everywhere. Large logs floated all around and the surrounding hills had a reasonable covering of snow. Overall, there were only 40 fish weighed in for the whole convention. That said, most CFC members did at least manage a redfin or a small Trout. Sara De La rue won the largest trout trophy and Ladies ANSA trophy and CFC won the ANSA Champion club trophy as well.

Venue:**Burrinjuck ANSA Convention 6-7 November 2010**

The 36th annual Convention was held in good conditions. 157 anglers from over a dozen clubs attended and between them accounted for 349 fish. Total catch weight was 545.96 kg with the vast majority being Carp (313 to be exact). CFC members did reasonably well in the trophy stakes with Andrew Butt taking out the Catch & Release section (three fish for 970mm), Shane Jasprizza the heaviest redfin Senior (950 gms) and David Stacy the heaviest redfin Junior (1.18kg). Chris Stolk from the Wollongong club caught the heaviest carp at 4.57kg with Nathan Smedley catching the heaviest native fish of a golden perch of 1.6kg. Interestingly there were a number of small cod caught and released and two Silver perch were also weighed in. Botany Bay won Champion Club, beating Wollongong for the first time in many years, and you could hear the Bell ringing half-way up the mountain road on the way out of the Park as a result.

Memorable Moments:

Running another successful Convention. Seeing the water level at the top of the Boat-ramp for the first time in many years.

Venue:**Burrinjuck Dam 4-5 December 2010**

Once again, there was massive rainfall and localised flooding in the lead-up to this outing. The dam went from 100% to 95% (they emptied it to allow for the coming flood waters) back up to 107% for the outing itself. The fishing was pretty hard, especially for natives. With dirty water and lots of floating timber, etc to avoid, trolling proved fairly ineffective. Some small Cod were encountered by those that persisted however. Steve Borkowskis caught the lone Golden Perch (0.73kg). Baitfishing for Carp was successful but with the rising water levels, there were a lot of snags and many bust-offs on 1kg mono resulted. Small redfin were also caught but not in massive numbers.

Memorable Moments:

Jamie (that rock doesn't look slippery) Stanfield taking an impromptu dip in the Dam on Saturday afternoon. Brian (I am not bored) Stacy drifting off to sleep whilst trolling.

Venue:**Club Carpathon 16 January 2011**

A really disappointing event from the aspect of captures with only four Carp and a small Goldfish caught. With 28 anglers (approx. 50 rods) fishing the end result was extremely poor to say the least. Steve Borkowskis cornered the market catching three of the carp with the biggest going 1.92kg. Kyle Walton caught the lone Goldfish to take out the Junior award for the day. That said it was a great day out on the social side of things giving people the opportunity to chat with other members and many of the passers-by.

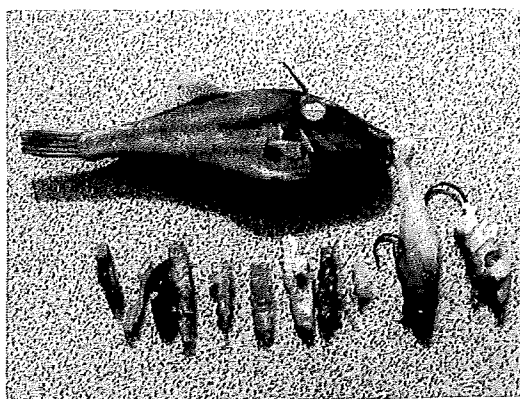

Persistence however paid off with good captures of Striped Tuna (1.86kg) to Shane Jasprizza in the Blue Water section and excellent Salmon and Tailor from the beaches and Mystery Bay rocks. Wagonga Inlet fished pretty tough with a few flathead but nothing really massive. Zane Zhao caught his first "masters" fish off the Rocks with a Salmon of 1.54kg on 1kg mono. Tom Stanfield also had a ball on the rocks catching a Salmon of 2.44kg and a Bonito of 1.14kg, both on 1 kg mono and both ending up Junior Australian records. Corunna had some flathead to 450gms with both plastics and live bait getting results. Anthony Heiser used up 2 full packs of plastics in Wagonga for a small leatherjacket. The CFC ended up coming second to Narooma in the competition with Shane Jasprizza winning Senior rocks, Tag and Release and heaviest Tailor (1.26kg). Tom Stanfield won Junior Rocks and came second in Junior Estuary and Junior Beach (by two points). If his Bream had been 10gms bigger the CFC would have taken out champion club.



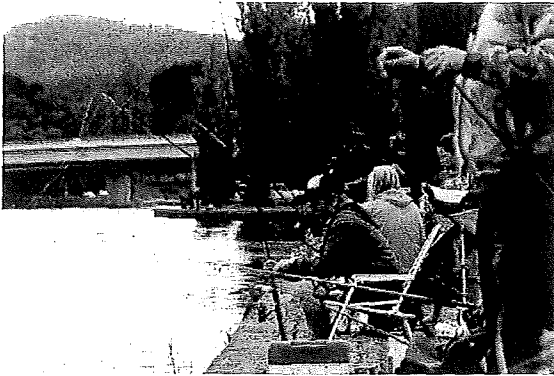
Memorable Moments:

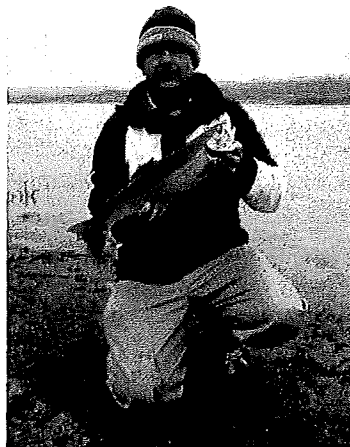
**Memorable Moments:**

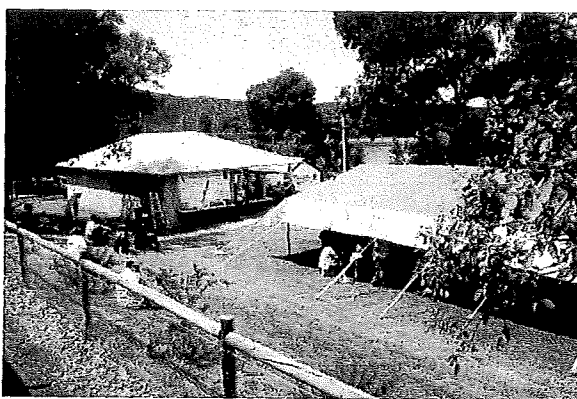
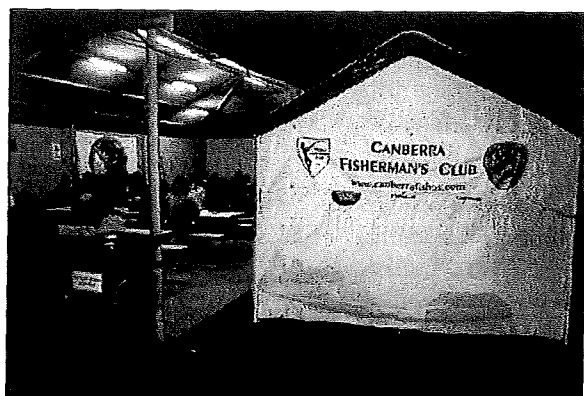
