Presidents Report

2012-2013

Hi all,

I think the first thing I did as President this year was to thank last year's committee for leaving the Club in a great position in terms of our standing:

- Our standing in the Canberra community as the hosts of the annual Carp-Out and the largest stockist of native fish in our local waterways;
- Our standing in the angling community, for our fishing knowledge and as holders of many records; and
- Our standing financially.

I think it's only appropriate that I should end the Club year in exactly the same way. This year's committee has many new faces on it – and the energy and enthusiasm they brought to the committee, combined with the experience and knowledge of the 'old hands' that remained, was absolutely fantastic. All members of the committee deserve our thanks – you've done the Club proud.

The Canberra Fisherman's Club managed two major events this year that raised the Club's profile in the community. Firstly, the Club ran another successful Burrinjuck Convention (the Club's 38th Annual Convention). This would have to be one of the oldest freshwater conventions in Australia, with one of the Club's newest committee members as this year's Convention Chairman – Sarah Borman. Thank you Sarah, for a wonderful job.

Sarah received support from experienced Burrinjuck legend Brian Stacy, who seemed to always have the answer to every question, no matter how left-field. Thank you Brian – I don't think you realise how much we appreciate your wisdom in the committee.

The other big event that the Club managed this year was the Canberra Carp-Out. This is a major public event that raises the profile of the Canberra Fisherman's Club and anglers in general, in the Canberra community. It is our chance each year to show people that anglers not only care about our local environment and community, but we're willing to do something about it.

I have been a member of the Club for over 30 years now, and it was easily my proudest moment in February this year, when we released native fingerlings into Lake Burley Griffin. I was interviewed by ABC radio and was able to say that our Club stood for doing something constructive about the state of our local lakes, rather than just whinging about it.

A big thanks must go to Chris Head as the driving force behind the Carp-Out – our Club owes you a great debt.

The key to the Club's success in running these events is the number of committed members that turn up and do a shift on the day. The big thing that separates our

Club from others is the willingness of our members to be involved and help out a good cause. A big thanks to the many that helped out – you are what makes our Club strong.

As well as these events, the Canberra Fisherman's Club punches above our weight in terms of the input and influence we have on fishing politics. This year the committee sought feedback from members regarding the NSW DPI's proposal to reduce bag limits. The feedback was analysed by Anthony Heiser and compiled into a detailed submission to DPI on behalf of our membership. In addition, Anthony prepared detailed and professional reports on the results of the Burrinjuck Convention and the Carp-Out for our sponsors.

The standard of these reports is outstanding and puts the Club in a strong position when we seek sponsorship and grants. Thank you Anthony, for your huge contribution to the Club.

The last Committee member that I would like to single out for special mention is John Bosch. John joined the Committee for the first time this year and took over the Recorder's role. The Recorder's database was sorely in need of an overhaul and John had the IT skills required. This new database will be a great asset to the Club for years to come. Thank you, John.

I'd like to now like to move to the most important aspect of Club life – our standing in the angling community! 2012-13 again saw Canberra Fisherman's Club mixing it with the best in NSW and the country.

In September last year, Chris Lemmon broke the NSW line class record for a 4.28kg Atlantic Salmon at the Club's Kalkite Outing. In March this year, Shane Jasprizza led a Canberra assault at the Narooma Convention, taking out the beach division with an awesome Frigate Mackerel on 1kg line, while Keith Smith achieved the inshore Holy Grail by coaxing his bag limit of legal kingfish past the seals at Montague Island.

Special kudos goes to Jamie Stanfield, who drove up from Melbourne with his son Tom to fish the Narooma Convention. Jamie landed an awesome 8kg Banjo Ray on 2kg line, but didn't enter it in the Club Competition because he would rather release it unharmed (Tom was too young to officially witness the fish being weighed on the beach).

For me, the fishing highlight of the year was watching Kyle Walton once again showing the adults how it's done with an awesome 2kg Dusky Flathead at the Bega/Brogo/Tathra outing. It's great to see keen young anglers out there mixing it up with the grown-ups. I reckon the future of our Club is looking very bright!

Finally, I'd like to say a big thank you on behalf of the Canberra Fisherman's Club to past president, Pat Brennan for upstaging Santa at the Club's Christmas Party - Pat made a surprise appearance in a fire truck with lights flashing and sirens blaring. It created an immediate stampede as all kids in the Black Mountain Peninsular vicinity ditched their own parties to be part of the fun. It was a truly magical moment.

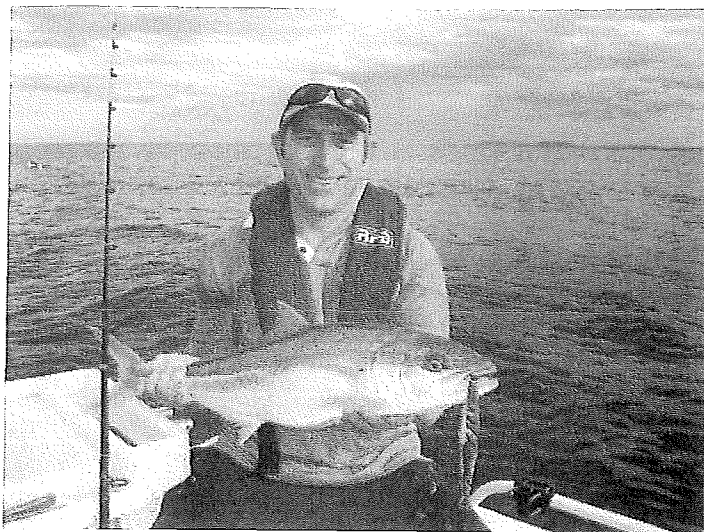

Secretary's Report

2012 – 2013

It's almost a year now since I took on the position of Secretary at last year's AGM, and what an interesting year it has been. Having never been the secretary of an organisation before, I found myself on a very steep learning curve as I found out what various tasks I needed to do. Thankfully, I had the support of more experienced committee members to help me along my way.

The year started off with a number of new committee members, who quickly worked together in managing the Club on behalf of the members. Getting started on the organising of the Burrinjuck Convention was one of the first tasks, along with planning out the coming year. On the membership front, we ended up with 127 members, 35 Juniors and 92 Seniors.

As in previous years, we had a number of great guest speakers, who we hope will come again this year with more great information. I would like to thank:

Alan Hocking from ACT INFLATABLE LIFEJACKET SERVICES who has rejoined the club after being a CFC member back in the 1980 -90s. He gave a very informative talk on life jacket usage, maintenance and how the regulations affect those of us who fish from boats.

At the November meeting, James Morgan aka Kooka from Tackleworld Canberra gave a very instructive talk on reading and fishing beaches. I for one learnt a great deal from this one, especially finding out how many "mistakes" I'd been making on previous beach attempts.

At the December meeting, Andy McGovern, along with Pat Brennan, gave an incredible presentation about their "fishing safari" to Northern Canada. They followed up with a two part report about the trip in the April & May Newsletters. If you weren't there on the night, I would highly recommend reading about this amazing trip on the Club's website.

In May, Pat Brennan gave a detailed presentation offering some new (and old) tricks on the use of soft plastics, blades, jigging, and new trolling techniques for trout for the coming winter.

November's Burrinjuck Convention was my first experience of this great Club annual event.

Registration opened at 2 pm on Friday. The Convention attracted 212 competitors (compared with 183 in 2011) from Canberra, Queanbeyan, Yass, Wee Jasper, Wagga Wagga, Narooma, Wollongong, Botany Bay, Sydney, Newcastle, Budgewoi, and even Victoria. All up, some 586 kg of carp were removed from the dam, along with about 9 kg of Redfin. Sixty-nine Golden Perch were caught, weighing in at 90 kg, with the majority of them being released. I was really impressed with the professionalism in the way the convention was organised, a fact that was commented on by a number of

attendees, something that Sarah & the rest of the organising committee should take pride in.

The Carp-a-thon in January was well attended with just over 18 kg of carp caught. The winning team, "captained" by Tom Harrington, caught 7.19 kg of carp. Jon Vogel caught the heaviest carp in the Senior Division, weighing in at 2.47 kg (catching it just 10 minutes before the end of the competition) and the Junior winner was Amath Fall with a 2.22 kg fish. Karen Malam won the Ladies trophy with a 0.57 kg carp.

This year's Canberra Carp-Out was again a great success. As always, the weekend started out with the Kid's Fishing Clinic, which was attended by seven junior anglers and their parents. Sunday morning started at 6:30am for a number of us involved in the setting up of tents, barricades and the BBQ. There were 672 Carp caught, weighing a total of 1,001.35 kg and 94 Redfin Perch for a total weight of 23.97 kg. The heaviest carp caught was an impressive 9.66 kg. The Carp-Out raised just over \$4,900 for fish stocking in the Canberra lakes and the ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group. The raffle added another \$3,887 towards fish stocking in the local lakes.

Finally, I won't be seeking re-election as Secretary this year as a number of health issues have worsened in recent months and I'm not up to giving the position the time and effort it requires to perform it properly. I hope to continue as a committee member as I believe in being involved in the Club 100%.

Treasurer's Report

2012-2013

The Club made a net loss of \$12,888.22 in 2012/13, compared with a net profit of \$15,736.91 in 2011/12. Some of you might recall me mentioning at the previous AGM that the Club's contribution of \$10,000 towards fish stocking in February 2012 and the Club's \$4,000 donation to ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group would not appear until the 2012/13 financial statements.

For those who are familiar with accounting, the Club's financial statements are done on a cash basis rather than an accrual basis. Had the Club used the accrual basis, it would have reported a net profit of \$1,736.91 in 2011/12 and a net profit of \$1,111.78 in 2012/13. The reason we use the cash basis is that it is far easier to use for a relatively small not for profit organisation run by volunteers.

The Club ran a very successful Burrinjuck Convention in November 2012 making a profit of \$9,426.03, compared with \$9,079.79 in November 2011. Thank you to our sponsors who helped make it a successful Convention. Thank you also to the members who volunteered their time at the Convention, as this is the event that helps the Club meet its operating expenses each year.

The Club joined Tackle World Canberra to run a successful event in March 2013 as part of the Canberra Day Festival. Despite some heavy rainfall leading up to the event, the Carp-Out still made a profit of \$4,914.50 to be shared equally between fish stocking for 2013/14 and the ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group.

The Club will donate \$3,000 to the ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group, at the Presentation Night by supplementing the 50% share of Carp-Out profits with \$542.75 from the Club's general revenue. A cheque for that amount was drawn in June so this has been included in the 2012/13 financial statement.

The Club raised \$6,344 for fish stocking activities for 2013/14. This consists of \$2,457.25 from half of the net proceeds of the Carp Out, and \$3,886.75 of the net proceeds of the fish stocking raffle. The Club, together with the National Capital Authority and ACT Government, jointly contributed towards the release of 82,378 Golden Perch fingerlings in Lake Burley Griffin, Lake Ginninderra, Point Hutt Pond and Dunlop Pond. The Club's contribution of \$8,000 towards the fish stocking has been included in the 2012/13 financial statement.

We had no other major fund raising events in 2012/13 and the accounts have been audited.

The Club's overall financial position is very healthy, with net assets totalling \$32,861.49 and no liabilities. However, the Club's grant account will need a little replenishing. The Club has contributed \$19,850 towards fish stocking activities and donated \$7,000 to the ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group over the last two years. During that time, the Club raised \$20,241.85 from the net profits of the Canberra Carp-Out and fish stocking raffle during that period. Clearly, the Club will need to increase attendance at the Canberra Carp-Out if it is to sustain the current levels of contributions to fish stocking activities.

With this in mind, the outgoing Committee appointed Glen Malam and Chris Head as Carp-Out Chairmen in March 2013 to develop a clear plan for next year's Carp-Out and make an early start on the administration work. I am pleased to advise that their work is already bearing fruit with the awarding of a \$1,000 grant from Bendigo Bank to improve the quality of the prize pool at the 2014 Canberra Carp-Out. Glen and Chris are continuing to pursue other opportunities with our new sponsor, Bendigo Bank. I must also thank Gary Cairns at Tackle World Canberra for helping us secure that sponsorship from Bendigo Bank. I encourage everyone to support the Club at the 2014 Canberra Carp-Out.

I have been Treasurer for three years and it is time to pass on the baton. While I would have liked to have reported a net profit on my last year as Treasurer, the Club is in a strong financial position and I am confident that the incoming Treasurer will report a net profit at next year's AGM.

I thank everyone for their support over the past three years and for their efforts at Burrinjuck and the Canberra Carp-Out. I also thank our major sponsor Tackle World Canberra for its sponsorship and support throughout the year.

I wish the incoming Treasurer all the best in 2013/14 and wish everyone well for the fishing season.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2013

Note 1

ANSA Fees Received - \$269 are for 2013-14 ANSA memberships. This amount will be paid to ANSA in 2013-14

Note 2

The Fundraising BBQ Income relates to BBQ sales at the Carp Out. In previous years, the net profit from the BBQ sales was used as a fundraiser for the CFC. At the 2013 Carp Out, the Cancer Support Group ACT Eden Monaro's Own (formerly the ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group) ran the sausage sizzle and monies raised through BBQ sales went directly to that organisation.

Note 3

As in previous years, a portion of membership fees received relate to membership for the following year. In 2012-13 \$500 of the membership fees received relate to 2013-14 memberships paid in advance in May or June 2013.

Note 4

The CFC and the Capital Region Fishing Alliance have paid 50% each towards the cost of a site at the Queanbeyan 4WD Show in February 2014 to promote the Canberra Carp Out and sell fish stocking raffle tickets.

Note 5

The donations to the Cancer Support Group ACT Eden Monaro's Own were made up of -
(a) \$4,000 out of the 2012 Canberra Carp Out and paid in September 2012; and
(b) \$3,000 out of the 2013 Canberra Carp Out and will be presented to the organisation at the Presentation Night in September 2013.

Note 6

The CFC contributed \$8,000 towards Golden Perch fingerlings in Lake Burley Griffin, Lake Ginninderra, Point Hut Pond and Dunlop Pond on 5 February 2013. The balance represents the CFC contribution to the Murray Cod fingerlings released into Lake Burley Griffin in February 2012. However, an invoice for the Murray Cod fingerlings was not received until 3 July 2012, which was paid for on 10 July 2012.

Note 7

The Committee introduced the Lucky Membership Draw in September 2011 to encourage increased attendance at the Club's General Meetings. The Lucky Membership Draw was awarded to Hendrik Maat (\$350) in the November General Meeting and to Luke Robbie (\$150) in the May General Meeting. As at 1 July 2013, the Lucky Membership Draw remains at \$50 and will increase by \$25 each month (ie \$75 at the August General Meeting) until it is claimed, after which it will be reset to \$25.

Scope

I have audited the attached financial report of Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated for the year ended 30 June 2013 comprising a Balance Sheet and Statement of Receipts and Expenditure.

The Committee is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report and the information contained therein, and has determined that the basis of accounting used is appropriate to the needs of the members. I have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members. No opinion is expressed as to whether the basis of accounting used is appropriate to the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee's accountability requirements. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates, to any person other than the members, or of any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

My audit procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether in all material respects the financial report is presented fairly so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the Association's financial position and performance as represented by the results of its operations.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Qualification

Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated derives its income from various activities. As effective control over most transactions is not established until they are entered in the accounting records, I have been unable to independently verify whether amounts receivable from these sources have been completely accounted for. Accordingly, my audit in relation to income was limited to amounts recorded on the bank statements and accounting records.

Recorders Report

2012-2013

This year was my first as recorder and it's been quite an experience for me. I've seen capture sheets with some exceptional captures come across my desk. Growing up as a mostly fresh water fisherman in far western NSW, I have also learnt something of a number of fish I knew little about beforehand.

Being recorder also places you squarely in the centre of the operational side of the club. You get an insight in to what people are up to in this hobby of ours that few other positions in the club get. It is great to see so many members out and about, enjoying all our waterways offer us.

Of special note to me this year was the choice of European Carp as the fresh water length species. Choosing this fish in particular created the opportunity for some of our members who don't have the opportunity to travel far and wide to participate in the club competitions. I was slightly aghast at the size of the capture sheets I was handed by a few of members on the odd occasion! Glen was correct in his prediction of a 12 month Carpathon in last year's annual report. For that reason, the humble Carp has again been selected as the fresh water length fish for the 2013/14 year. Flathead, a personal favourite, are this year's saltwater length fish after the Bream proved elusive this past 12 months.

This year a total of 835 fish were caught, up 330 on last year. Of those, 440 were Carp so the actual numbers of other fish caught were down a little. 41 anglers recorded at least one capture this year, more than double the number last year. It's great to see more of the membership becoming active participants in the club competitions!

In all, 69 fish of at least 100 points were recorded. Many of these were masters for a number of members. Tim Jones led the way with 9 masters class captures, with Glen Malam and Shane Jasprizza in equal second place with 8 fish of a 100 points or more. There was only a single addition to the All-Time board fish records this year, a 4.28 kg Atlantic Salmon by Chris Lemmon.

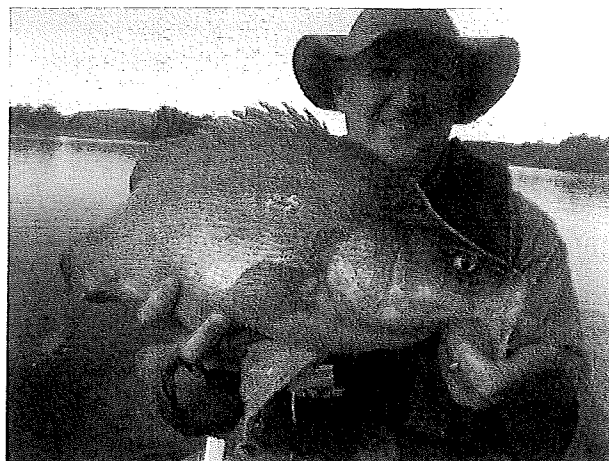

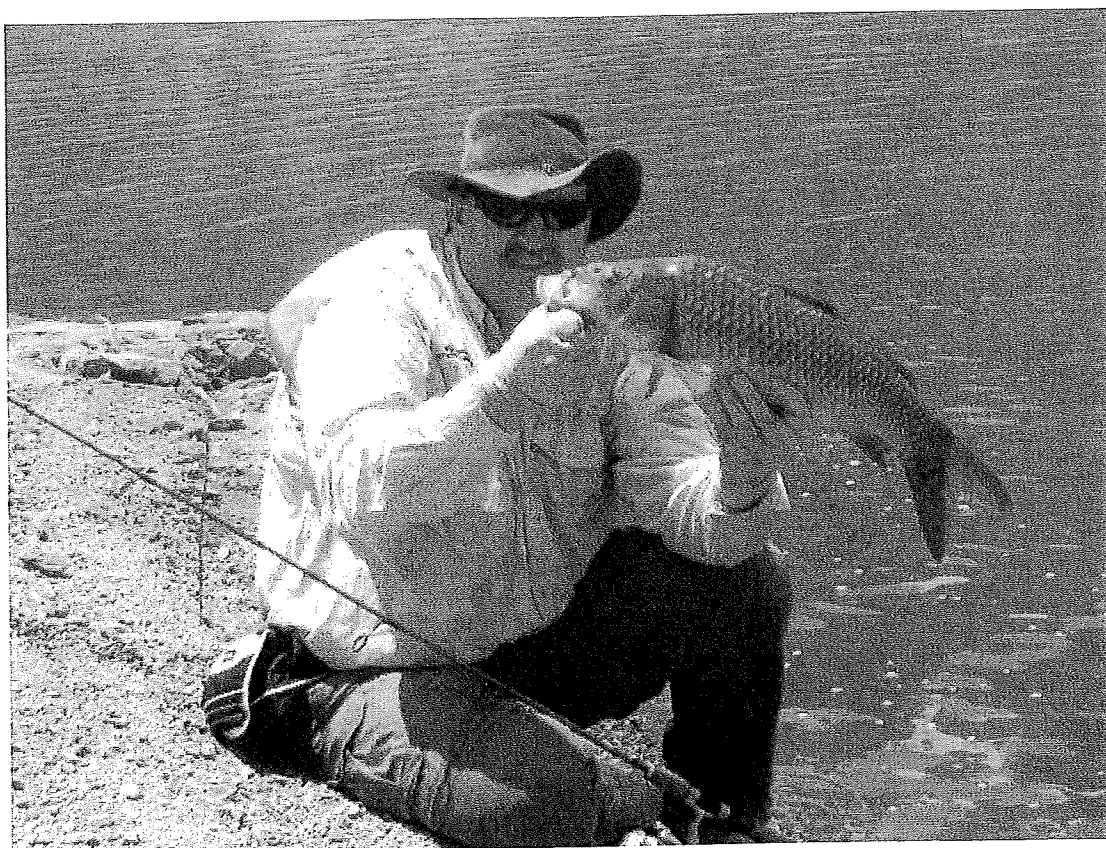
