Executive Reports

President's Report

This year has been a great year of achievement for the Canberra Fisherman's Club. This year has seen the Club raise its profile within the ACT community in terms of our work in support of the Cancer Support Group and our fish stocking efforts. In addition, Club Secretary Anthony Heiser has been a driving force behind the Club's detailed submissions on a large number of proposals by NSW Fisheries. Thanks Anthony!

The professionalism of these submissions has made people sit up and take notice of what we as a Club have to say - we are having an influence on fisheries issues that are really at the core of what is so dear to us as anglers. I have been interviewed a number of times by journalists asking for the Canberra Fisherman's Club views on rec fishing issues and have seen our views quoted in newspapers from the Narooma News through to the Canberra Times and the Sydney Morning Herald. Those members that have competed against our sister ANSA clubs at conventions would understand the exquisite joy I got from seeing the Canberra Fisherman's Club views being printed in the Illawarra News!

This stuff really matters to the future of our sport.

This year saw the Club throw everything at the Canberra Carp-Out, which had been experiencing falling numbers over previous years. This year the date for the Carp-Out was pushed back a couple of weeks and we introduced special tagged fish and big new prize - the chance to win \$20,000 cash! The big prize was partially funded by a \$1,000 "100 Community Heroes" grant from the Calwell, Curtin, Jerrabomberra and Wanniassa Community Bendigo Banks. Advertising for the event was provided by the Cancer Support Group donating air time on FM104.7 and targeted advertising through Facebook.

And the people of Canberra responded: entries were up 45%, with 1.4 tonnes of carp removed from the lake. And the best part - The event ran like clockwork, and that was due to the number of members volunteering to help out. For the second year in a row I was able to put together a roster to give members plenty of time to go fishing between shifts. I've said it often before - I really believe it's the number of volunteers that pitch in and help that sets our Club apart from the rest. Thank you so much to all the volunteers - you are what makes our Club special!

This summer will see thousands of native fish fingerlings released into local waterways as a direct result of all your efforts. In addition, the Canberra Fisherman's Club will be making a \$4,500 contribution to the ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group; also as a direct result

of all your efforts. The funds will help the Cancer Support Group provide financial assistance to cancer patients and their family as they battle the terrible disease that this year took two of the Club's past leaders, Graeme Hibberd and Neville Ling.

Another major leap forward for the Club was the development of the new Club website by Vice President, Chris Head, with help from the Club's resident computer expert and Club Recorder, John Bosch. The new website has a members only area to conduct Club business and an exclusive forum to give members the opportunity to share fishing intel, spots and news without broadcasting it to all and sundry. Thanks Chris – this really is a major step forward!

While it's great to recognise the great leaps forward, it's also important to recognise the committee members that put a huge amount of time into the day to day operation of the Club:

- Sarah Borman not only took on the role of Treasurer this year, but was also this year's Burrinjuck Chair. Once again Burrinjuck ran like clockwork and for the first time in years, there were no Saturday afternoon dashes to Yass for supplies. Thank you Sarah.
- I'd like to say a special thanks to my wife Karen for stepping into the Assistant Secretary role. I promised her it just involved collecting the mail, but she ended up taking the minutes for a couple of committee meetings this year. Thanks Karen – and I apologise!
- Kevin Spriggs took on the role of outings coordinator this year and did a great job finding great accommodation at outings this year, particularly the place at the Nowra Convention that was a cross between a conference centre and school camp – that was really awesome! Thanks Kevin.
- John Bosch's impact on the Recorder's job cannot be overstated. His work on updating and upgrading the Recorder's database saw the results for Burrinjuck Convention and the Canberra Carp-Out finalised in a flash – as President this was a huge thing, particularly when you have hundreds of impatient anglers hanging out for the final presentations. Thank you John!
- Greg Davis was the man responsible for this year's great newsletters. They were a great read – you've really set a high standard for your successor. Thanks Greg.
- Brian Stacy took on the role of Sponsorship Officer for Burrinjuck Convention this year and was responsible for introducing our Club to many new sponsors and making sure the Convention was a financial success. Thank you Brian!

It's good to see all the great things the Club achieves in the community, but it's also important to excel at fishing – after all, that's what the Club's about. In this respect, Brian Stacy was also an inspiration to many of us this year. Although he kept quiet about it, he caught some truly awesome gamefish including Marlin, Mahi Mahi and Yellowfin Tuna.

Other members that have also led the way in terms of fishing expertise include Keith Smith for his huge Brown Trout and Atlantic Salmon last winter and his Mulloway in summer.

Colin Clark should be congratulated for his awesome estuary Kingfish of almost 8kg and his Australian Salmon of 3kg, as well as his Narooma Convention winning Tailor (his brother Chris won the largest Australian Salmon prize). Kevin Spriggs showed us how big Dusky Flathead grow; weighing in one that was a massive 5.6kg!

Fish of this quality are uncommon; and for so many to have been caught by members of our Club, it's clear that our level of expertise is very high and shows that we could do great things at Conventions and other competitions. I'll certainly be giving it a go next year.

Looking forward, I think it is important for the Club to encourage a healthy turnover of people through committee positions to encourage new ideas and enthusiasm. It's now time for me to take a break – and after two years, the Club would probably benefit from a new face at the front of the meetings!

Thank you for all your support over the last 2 years. I think the Club is in great shape and wish the new committee all the best for the year ahead.

Secretary's Report

This year has been a successful year for the Club on a number of fronts:

- We successfully hosted our 39th Burrinjuck Convention in November.
- We not only held a successful Canberra Carp-Out in March but we increased attendance by 45% from last year.
- The Club participated at the inaugural Canberra Connect and Participate Expo at the Bus Depot Markets on 29 March 2014, providing an opportunity to promote the Club to the public.
- We had had some great guest speakers at our monthly meetings including:
 - Darryl Head, Bay and Basin Sportsfishing, who gave a fantastic presentation on Lowrance sounders and the Insight Genesis Mapping System at the June General Meeting
 - Anita Brademann, the Upper Murrumbidgee Demonstration Reach Coordinator, who gave a presentation on the Upper 'Bidgee project, including carp trapping and radio tracking, at the July General Meeting.
- We made three submissions to the NSW Department of Primary Industries on:
 - Proposed changes to bag and size limits for recreational fishing
 - Proposed changes to bag and boat limits for Southern Bluefin Tuna
 - Proposed expansion of commercial netting activities in the estuaries
- We held a successful new members night in December which saw nine new members join that night with additional new members joining shortly afterwards.
- We held the first CFC-Basin Lure and Fly Anglers Club inter-club competition in Nowra at the April Outing.
- We won the CFC-Morven Fishing Club inter-Club competition at the December Outing.
- We have updated the Club's Constitution to improve the financial management of the Club.

Like Glen, I also want to highlight the hard work by Chris Head and John Bosch to finally make the long awaited Members Only Forum a reality on our new website. This came about because many members over the years wanted a forum in which they could invite other members to go fishing with them. In the past, a member might initiate a carp chasing session at the Jerra Duck Pond or Lake Tuggeranong by sending text messages to other members. But if you were a new member or not on that person's contact list, you were left out of the loop. So with our new website, I hope to see more members using the forum to go fishing together.

The Club had 108 members in 2013/14, including 54 ANSA members, 24 female members and 25 junior members. That is down slightly from 2012/13 when we had 127 members. Ten years ago, the Club had 82 members so our current membership is quite healthy and part of the cycle of peaks and troughs we've experienced over the years. While our membership is slightly down from the previous year, we had a number of new members join including nine at the New Members Night in December last year. And it has been great seeing new faces at our monthly outings. For our new members, I hope you have enjoyed our Club outings and monthly meetings.

While membership has gone up and down in the five years I have been on the committee, the Club has never been short of active members. For example, the number of members willing to help out each year at the Carp-Out and Burrinjuck has been fantastic and, as Glen also mentioned in his report, this year was no exception. Thank you to all the

members, their wives, husbands, partners and other family members who assisted in the lead up to the Canberra Carp-Out and on the day. Some family members flew all the way from Queensland to help out.

Previous Presidents and Secretaries have sometimes finished their reports with a 'where to next?' question. 50% of our members are ANSA members but our Club was under-represented in the results of the 2013/14 ANSA 12 month competition. We will host the ANSA NSW AGM and Presentation Night on 27 August 2016. It will be nice if the host Club claimed a few trophies in 2016. This will require more members fishing the ANSA 12 month competition from now on. So should we be exploring ways to encourage greater participation in the ANSA 12 month competition in the lead up to 2016? I will leave everyone with that thought.

I thank everyone for supporting the Canberra Fisherman's Club and its Committee and I wish everyone well for the 2014/15 fishing year.

Treasurer's Report

The Club made a net profit of \$6,625.66 in 2013/14, compared with a net loss of \$12,888.22 in 2012/13.

The Club ran a very successful Burrinjuck Convention in 2013, making a profit of \$6,364.69, compared with \$9,426.03 in 2012. A significant increase in the cost of running the Convention contributed to the decrease in profits. These include the need to purchase major prizes for the Convention. Thank you to everyone who volunteered their time at the Convention, as this event generates the revenue needed to meet our Club's operating expenses each year.

The Club partnered with Tackle World Canberra and to run a very successful Canberra Carp-Out on 31 March 2014. The event enjoyed a 45% increase in attendance from 2013 thanks in part to the buzz generated from the tagged carp competition. Thank you to Bendigo Bank for its \$1000 Community Heroes Grant which contributed to the costs of the tagged carp competition.

The Canberra Carp-Out raised \$7,704.52, to be shared between The Cancer Support Group ACT Eden Monaro's Own and fish stocking activities. The Club will donate \$4500 to the Cancer Support Group at the Presentation Night on 13 September 2014. This includes a contribution of \$485.32 from the Club's general revenue.

The Club raised \$8,581.23 for fish stocking activities. This consists of \$3,689.84 from the Canberra Carp-Out and \$4,891.39 from the net proceeds of the Fish Stocking Raffle. This represents the largest sum raised by the Club for fish stocking activities and the most successful fish stocking raffle ever. The Club used monies raised from previous fund raising activities to release 9,091 Golden Perch fingerlings and 5,245 Murray Cod fingerlings into Canberra's urban lakes in 2013/14.

You may notice in the Club's income and expenditure statement that website costs increased from \$402.00 in 2012/13 to \$2,381.09 in 2013/14. The Club has invested just under \$2,000 this year in setting the new website. A final instalment of \$1700 for the establishment of the new website will be payable in 2014/15.

The Club has invested this money in response to many requests from members over the years for a 'members only forum'. The new website is also designed to make registration and payment for the Carp-Out, Burrinjuck, and club membership fees easier for both the members and public as well as the Committee.

The Club has also transferred its bank accounts from ANZ to Bendigo Bank in 2014/15. This is because Bendigo Bank charges lower fees and offers a range of facilities to help not for profit organisations manage its financial affairs more efficiently. In addition, the Club has experienced disappointing service from ANZ over the past few years.

The Club's financial position continues to be very healthy, with net assets totalling \$39,487.15. We had no other fund raising activities in 2013/14. The Club's accounts are yet to be audited. However, the accounts have been reviewed by the Secretary and I am not aware of any significant issues that may raise concerns by the auditor.

The delay in submitting the accounts to the auditor arose due to unforeseen circumstances concerning my Mother's health earlier this year. Given those circumstances, I would be grateful for everyone's understanding.

Finally, I thank everyone for their support and for their efforts at Burrinjuck and the Canberra Carp-Out. I also thank our major sponsor Tackle World Canberra for its sponsorship and support throughout the year. And I wish everyone well for the 2014/15 fishing season.

Scope

I have audited the attached financial report of Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated for the year ended 30 June 2014 comprising a Balance Sheet and Statement of Receipts and Expenditure.

The Committee is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report and the information contained therein, and has determined that the basis of accounting used is appropriate to the needs of the members. I have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members. No opinion is expressed as to whether the basis of accounting used is appropriate to the needs of the members.

The special purpose financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee's accountability requirements. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates, in any person other than the members, or of any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

My audit procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether in all material respects the financial report is presented fairly so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the Association's financial position and performance as represented by the results of its operations.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Qualification

Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated derives its income from various activities. As effective control over most transactions is not established until they are entered in the accounting records, I have been unable to independently verify whether amounts receivable from these sources have been completely accounted for. Accordingly, my audit in relation to income was limited to amounts recorded on the bank statements and accounting records.

Audit Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects on the financial statements of the matter referred to in the above paragraph, the financial report of Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated presents fairly the financial position as at 30 June 2014 and the results of its operations for the year then ended.

Official Items

Recorder's Report

2013-14 was my second year as the club recorder and the enjoyment of the position hasn't diminished. Seeing some great capture sheets handed to me at Club meetings and seeing the number of captures at some of the outings tells me that the Club is pulling its weight in the fishing community.

Captures of note this year include Brian Stacy's 25.1kg Yellow Fin Tuna, Kevin Spriggs 5.6kg Flathead and Glen Malam's 4.69kg Flathead. Also, Mel Marlborough's return to the Club with a 5.62kg European Carp on 1kg line proved she still has the touch. The Clark brothers continued to show their skills as beach and estuary fishermen by lodging several large Australian Salmon, Tailor, Rays, Bream and even one large estuary King Fish.

535 captures were recorded this year, well down on last year's 800+. However, only 96 of this year's captures were European Carp compared to last year's 440. So, overall, the number of captures of non-carp species was roughly the same as last year. For those with a statistical bent those 535 captures were spread across 40 different species of fish and among 43 anglers.

This year saw 7 fish of 250 points or more and 38 fish between 100 and 250 points. Masters certificates for 250+ points captures went to Glen Malam, Brian Stacy, Tim Jones, Chris Clark and yours truly. 11 regular masters' certificates were also awarded this year with Karen Malam leading the charge with 2 awards. Of special note was a master's certificate awarded to young Connor Davis for the capture of a cracking 1.9kg Yellow Belly on 1 kg line during last year's Burrinjuck convention.

One addition was made to the all-time board fish ledger this year with Anthony Heiser's capture of a 0.57kg Tarwhine while holidaying on Fraser Island while Glen Malam's capture of a 4.69kg Dusky Flathead on 1kg line during the Nowra outing was this year's only addition to the club records.

I won't go in to too much detail on Burrinjuck and Carp out as others have already covered most of the details. I will say that carp out saw 818 fish captured totalling a bit over 1.4 tons, with 281 of 909 attendees registering a capture. The addition of the \$20,000 prize certainly seemed to bring in a large number of additional anglers. Burrinjuck saw 289 captures over the weekend from 191 attendees.

For the upcoming year I am hoping that the clarification that pre-test line is required for the club competitions will also see more anglers submitting their captures to the ANSA 12 month competitions. The Canberra Fisherman's Club has been underrepresented of late and it's time we stamped our mark on the competitions again.

I will be continuing the role in the 14-15 year so I hope to see some even more impressive captures in the future. I also have some ideas on how we can use our new web site to make information such as masters progress, division and section captures and the like

more available to members. I will be working on that while getting my stuff together for the upcoming Burrinjuck and Carp-Out.

Here's a final congratulations to all of the trophy winners. Keep up the good work.

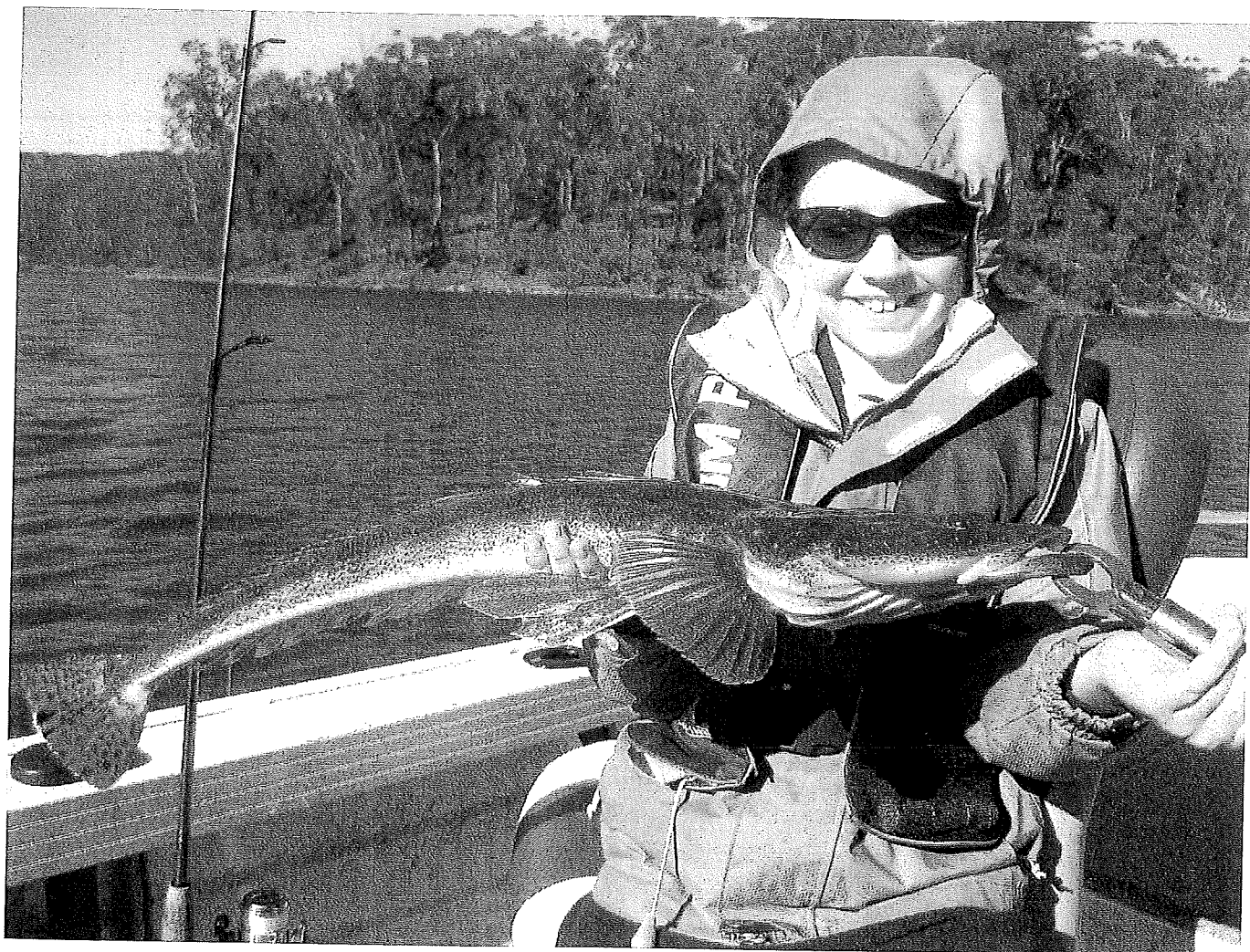

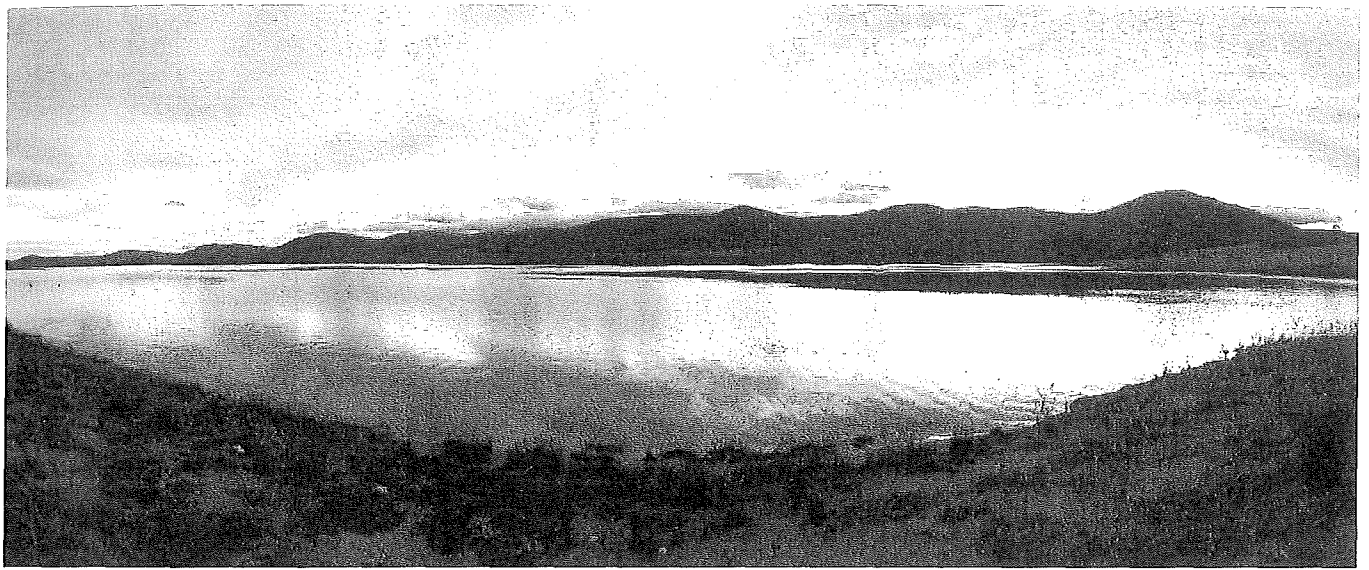
