# Executive Reports

## President's Report

Another year has come and gone and the Canberra Fishermans Club continues to maintain a good level of membership and profile within the ACT and fishing community.

I wish to thank the members that volunteered their valuable time to be on the committee this year. With over half of our committee new to the roles and finding it challenging at times to fit into busy work and family schedules I'd like to say all did a fantastic job in keeping the club moving forward.

This past year saw us host the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Burrinjuck Convention. Such an achievement is a fantastic milestone for any organisation and to have 14 fishing clubs and 195 anglers from ACT, NSW and Victoria make the trip to help us celebrate the occasion was terrific. It was great to see all of the regular attendees and some new faces at the event having a great time. We tried a few new things this year to try and improve the efficiency of the administration, of which some worked and some did not but you have to try new things. I would like to thank all our club members that volunteered their time for the event, without your support we just could not run the event in the efficient manner that we do. We were happy to see the event turn a profit again and through the support of our great sponsors, we were able to run the great raffles which when it is all said and done, is where we make the money to run the club for another year, not through the entry fees as these pretty much break even with our costs. We are well into the planning for the 41<sup>st</sup> Burrinjuck Convention and with a tough year that it has been, businesses sponsorship is proving to be a challenge but I am sure with the great team we will again come through with flying colours.

The Canberra Carp-Out celebrated its 8<sup>th</sup> year this year and again, organising this event had its own challenges to the point where a number of us, including myself, started to wonder if all the effort was really appreciated and worthwhile. Showing the resilience that only a bunch of fishos can, we picked ourselves up and soldiered on to again run a great event that saw over 800 people register and manage to fish out over 1.2 tonnes of noxious carp and redfin. The event raised over \$8000 between entry fees and the fish-stocking raffle, which was a great effort. Again I would like to thank all our club members that volunteered their precious time in the lead up to the event and time spent on the day. We could not have done it without you.

It helps to look back over the last 8 years of the Carp-Out in that dire time were you start to question is it all worth it, and reflect on what has actually been achieved. To put it into perspective, we have raised over \$29,000 that has been donated to The Cancer Support Group Monaro's Own and over \$49,000 that has been put towards native fish stocking of our local lakes. This is something our club as a whole should be very proud of.

This past year, we also ventured forward into the realms of technology. Firstly with the upgrade of our website into a new platform with a lot of bells and whistles for members. To be truthful, we are still coming to terms with what it can do but we have had positive comments not only from membership but third parties as well to how good the site looks. We also ventured in the realm of mass mail out of our newsletter and information via Mail Chimp that is connected to the website to try and reduce our administration time. Finally we have just ventured into the cloud with a cashbook system that will greatly help our treasurer over the next year.

Reading back over the words above I see a lot of commitment that the club has put into the community with these great events, but we should never lose sight of what we are really about and that is recreational fishing. We are a group of fishermen and woman who have passion for the sport and are always wanting to learn new things about fishing, fish new locations and to have someone to share these experiences with. I think the Canberra Fishermans Club has managed to broadly cater for all types of fishing and fishing people throughout the year and hopefully the membership has enjoyed the year as much as I have.

I usually don't like to single people out, as I believe that we all put into the club what we can when we can and I very much appreciate the efforts that all the committee and members have put into the club over the past year. I would still like to thank to my Vice President Anthony Heiser who has tirelessly kept us on track in all areas of running the club. It just seems there is nothing he cannot do and in most cases, he does it with great passion even in the most tiresome of times I am sure. His professionalism is noted at all times with what he does and especially in the reports he puts together for us. To this end I have to mention that one of the prospective sponsors that we sent a request for the up and coming Burrinjuck Convention. He wrote back to me to say that after reading the sponsors package we had sent him, he could not help but send us a response in appreciation of the professionalism of the report. It was of the like that he has ever seen from an organisation and he noted that his business sees thousands of these requests. He said that even though his business may not be able to help us out this year, he wanted to let us know that our efforts in putting together such a quality package were going unrecognised. To this end I thank you Anthony for this professional recognition that we have received due to your efforts. You have raised the bar very high and having given us templates, hopefully we can maintain this professionalism into the future.

Regrettably, I must move to a low note. As you are all aware we lost one of our long-time club members and a great fisherman recently. Patrick Walter Luttrell born 5 April 1944 and was unfortunately taken from us Tuesday 14 July 2015. Pat was a member of the Club for many years and was a well-liked and active member of the Club. Not only was he a regular face at our meetings, outings and other events, but he also served on the committee from 2007-08 to 2010-11 as both Editor and Assistant Secretary. He was the Club's second longest serving Editor and shared the title of longest serving Assistant Secretary with Chris Lemmon. Pat was the keeper of the club trailer until the last few years, making sure it was in good working order and made sure the barby was always ready for the next sausage sizzle. Pat was a very keen angler. He won the Freshwater Total Length Competition in 2012-13 and claimed the trophy for Champion Male at the 2015 Carpathon. Pat Luttrell will be sorely missed. The Club extended its deepest condolences to the Luttrell Family.

Finally, it was great to see some quality fish come to our anglers this season with some true milestones achieved. One that sticks in my mind was a trio event that I was lucky enough to be involved in as a crewman on Brian Stacy's boat with Greg Davis at the Tollgates Island Classic back in January. Greg and I managed to hook, tag, and release our first ever striped Marlin and this was a first for Brian's Boat, DayOff2. To complete the trio, Brian also hooked, tagged, and released a striped marlin of his own. It was just fantastic and something that I will never forget and I was glad that I was with Canberra Fisherman's Club members to share the great high with. It was one that I may not have achieved if I had not been a member of the Club...

I would like to wish all members tight lines in the coming fishing year and urge all members to continue to support the club. Together we can move the club into the future and continue to represent our great city in our fishing circuit. I thank all of you for not only being members of the club but also for being great mates to me over this past year as president and I wish the new committee a great year to come.

- We held another great Canberra Carp-Out in March with this year's Native Fish Stocking Raffle being the most successful to date.
- The Club again was a part of the Canberra Connect and Participate Expo at the Bus Depot Markets on 29 March 2014, which provided us with a great opportunity to promote our Club to the public.
- We had some great guest speakers at our monthly meetings over the past year that included:
  - Anita Brademann from NSW Fisheries informed us of her efforts in improving the native fishery on the Upper Murrumbidgee Demonstration Reach
  - Alan Hocking of ACT Inflatable Life Jackets gave us a presentation on the importance of life jacket maintenance – with a few surprises from some of our members when he opened up their jackets
  - Our own Shane Jasprizza gave an informative session on ANSA rules and regulations
  - Australian Fly-fishing Champion, Rick Sunderland gave us an inside look at the national fly-fishing circuit but also had some universal lessons everyone appreciated no matter their fishing style
  - Peter from U-Make-Em-Soft-Plastics, gave us an excellent demonstration of how to use his products to make our own soft plastic and spinnerbait lures
  - Scott Heiman of Heiman Habitat, gave us a very informative presentation on basic survival skills
  - Matt Brown from Canberra Marine Centre gave us a much-needed lesson on the dos and especially the don'ts of proper boat trailer maintenance.
- We have had several new members join the club over the year that includes females and juniors.
- We won the CFC Vs. Morven Fishing Club inter-club competition in December for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row.
- We have also recently invested in new cloud based software for finance and general administration, which will improve and streamline the management of the Club.



Finally I would like to thank everyone for supporting the Canberra Fisherman's Club and its Committee and I wish everyone well for the 2015/16 fishing year. Before I finish up, I would like to take this opportunity to express my deepest condolences to the family of Pat Luttrell. Pat helped ease me into my first go at Assistant Secretary when I took the position over from him in 2012/13, I was then and am now very grateful for that. He always went out of his way to make a new member feel welcome and was always there to provide any advice needed. Pat was a part of the club's 'furniture' and will be missed so very much.

# Treasurer's Report

The Club is anticipating a net loss of between \$8k and \$10k in 2014/15. This is compared with a net profit of \$6,625.66 in 2013/14, and a net loss of \$12,888.22 in 2012/13.

The loss is taking into account the investment rolled over from the 2013/14 financial year, being \$9.5k into fishing stocking, and the \$4.5k donation to the Cancer Support Group. Additionally, our profit and loss statement goes up and down from year to year because we use cash basis accounting.

The Club ran a very successful Burrinjuck Convention in 2014, making a profit of \$9,594.94, compared with \$6,364.69 in 2013. Thank you to everyone who volunteered their time at the Convention, as this event generates the revenue needed to meet our Club's operating expenses each year.

The Club partnered with Tackle World Canberra to run a very successful Canberra Carp-Out on Sunday 29 March 2015. Good weather came in time for the event, which helped boost ticket sales and entries, and there was again big hype over the chance to win \$20,000.

The Canberra Carp-Out raised \$3,458 to be shared between The Cancer Support Group and fish stocking activities. The Club will donate \$2,000 to the Cancer Support Group on the presentation night being held on Saturday September 26th.

The Club raised \$6,959.38 for fish stocking activities. This consists of \$1,594.33 from the Canberra Carp-Out and \$5,365.05 from the net proceeds of the Fish Stocking Raffle. The Club used monies raised from previous fund raising activities to release 18,000 Murray Cod fingerlings into Lake Burley Griffin on 19 December 2014.


The Club has invested in cloud-based finance software, Xero that cost \$214.50 for first set up and an ongoing \$10 per month. This is in response to requests from committee members to improve our financial management software. On July 1 2015, XERO was implemented and has already proved to be very valuable and more time efficient, it will also help in easier reporting and handover to future committee members.

The Club's financial position continues to be very healthy, with net assets totalling approximately \$30k compared with \$17,065.74 in 2008/09. We had no other fund raising activities in 2014/15.

The Club's accounts are yet to be audited at the time of writing, but are in the process of being completed and will be ready in plenty of time for the annual report publishing. However, Anthony has reviewed the accounts and we both are not aware of any significant issues that may raise concerns by the auditor.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone for their support and efforts at Burrinjuck and the Canberra Carp-Out. I also thank our major sponsor Tackle World Canberra for its sponsorship and support throughout the year. I wish everyone well for the 2015/16 fishing season.

## Scope

I have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members. No opinion is expressed as to whether the basis of accounting used is appropriate to the needs of the members.

The special purpose financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee's accountability requirements. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report in which it relates, to any person other than the members, or of any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

My audit procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether in all material respects the financial report is presented fairly so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the Association's financial position and performance as represented by the results of its operations.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

## Qualification

Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated derives its income from various activities. As effective control over most transactions is not established until they are entered in the accounting records, I have been unable to independently verify whether amounts receivable from these sources have been completely accounted for. Accordingly, my audit in relation to income was limited to amounts recorded on the bank statements and accounting records.

## Audit Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects on the financial statements of the matter referred to in the above paragraph, the financial report of Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated presents fairly the financial position as at 30 June 2015 and the results of its operations for the year then ended.

Where has the time gone? This year was my third as the club's recorder and I think I'll be getting the hang of the job soon enough. I definitely enjoy seeing capture sheets and hearing the stories of people's latest fishing accomplishments.

The most memorable capture for me this year was the triple-header Striped Marlin tagging by Brian Stacy, Chris Head and Greg Davis. The sheer number of fish caught during the Narooma outing by those who took up the Nitro charter caused me a few hours of keyboard entry but to hear of the fun that was had by all made it worthwhile. For myself, my personal best 74.5 cm, 6.45 kg Murray Cod during the Morven challenge was the highlight.

All up 456 captures were recorded this year, which is a little down on last year's number and considerably lower than the year before. However, similar to last year, only 92 Carp were caught compared to 440 in 2012-13. For the statisticians (Anthony) the 456 captures were spread across 35 species (40 last year) and caught by 41 anglers (43 last year).

This year saw 5 masters certificates award for fish worth 250 or more points out of a total of 27 masters captures. 250+ point masters went to Brian Stacy twice and Tim Jones, Steve Bailey and Kyle Walton once each. 125 captures were on pre-test line and, therefore, eligible in the club's points based competitions.

This year saw just one addition to the all-time board fish listing with Coralie Teer's capture of a 2.42 kg Morwong during the Kioloa outing. Two new club records were set this year when Kevin Spriggs landed a 5.6 kg Dusky Flathead on 4kg line and Glen Malam claimed a 3.11 kg Mulloway on 3 kg line. There are a few holes in the records list if you spend a little time looking through the list. Occasionally there will be a species and line class combination that hasn't been entered so it can be a good way to get your name on the books.


The new coming year sees the introduction of a yearly and an all-time length board. I am hoping that this will give our non-pretest and/or go-alone fisher people a couple more options for entering fish in the club competitions. I also hope to see more length-based classes in the future so if you have an idea, talk to me.

The committee hasn't met and actually decided it yet, but I am planning to continue on as the recorder for the 2015-16 year. Unfortunately I didn't get to the additions to the web site that I mentioned in last year's annual report. Hopefully I will get to them this year and we can provide more information on people's masters, division and section standings throughout the year.

That's it from me. I give a final congratulation to all trophy winners and to those who have achieved masters or other awards over the year. Even if you didn't win something, well done on getting out there and having a go at it. It certainly beats working!


Pat was the keeper of the club trailer until the last few years, making sure it was in good working order and the barby was ready for the next sausage sizzle.

Pat was a very keen angler. He won the Freshwater Total Length Competition in 2012-13 and claimed the trophy for Champion Male at the 2015 Carpathon.


