# Executive Reports

## President's Report

2015/16 was another good year for the Canberra Fisherman's Club. We continued to maintain a good community profile in the ACT and the fishing community in general and, our membership base was stable.

This past year saw us host our annual Burrinjuck Convention with 11 fishing clubs and 169 anglers making the trip to help us celebrate the 41<sup>st</sup> year of our major club fund raising event. It was great to see so many of our regular attendees and some more new faces at the event having a great time as always. I would like to thank all our club members that volunteered their time to help out leading up to and during the weekend, without your support we just could not run the event. The support of our great sponsors allowed us to again run the great raffles which is where we make the money to run the club for another year as the entry fees pretty much break even with our running costs. We have started the planning for the 42<sup>nd</sup> Burrinjuck Convention and sponsorship is the usual challenge but I am sure with all the members chipping in again we can put on another great event and fund the coming club fishing year.

2016 meant that the Canberra Carp-Out was in its 9<sup>th</sup> year. This year we were faced with the challenge of the loss of our major sponsor. As a result, we had to trim back some of our running costs and also contribute some club funds to supplement the costs of prizes. That said, the Club still managed to pull off another great event that saw 720 people register and manage to fish out just over a tonne of noxious carp and redfin. The event raised net proceeds of just on \$10,000 between entry fees and the fish stocking raffle which was a great effort. Again I would like to thank all our club members that volunteered their precious time in the lead up to the event and the time spent on the day, we could not have done it without you.

Over the last 9 years of the Carp-Out we have raised over \$32,000 which has been donated to The Cancer Support Group Eden Monaro's Own and over \$56,000 to native fish stocking of our local lakes. This is a great effort by our club that everyone should be very proud of. So I really hope that the club continues to support the concept of the Carp Out event as it really puts the club on the map in the local Canberra community and I would love to see a 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the event. I for one will be happy to again contribute my time to making the 2017 event successful.

We continued to try and keep on top of our new technology and social media with our website and Facebook maintaining a good following. I think our mass mail out of our newsletter and information via mail chimp connected to the website is working and just need to invest the time to train a couple more people in how it all works. Xero our cloud based cashbook/accounting system in the long term is making the treasurer role much easier as we get to know it better.

So nine years on the club committee has come and gone, I still remember Keith Smith nominating me from the floor all that time ago. I jokingly thanked Keith as had no idea what I was in for. It clearly wasn't as bad as I first thought, I ended up filling various roles over this time and enjoyed every aspect of the club that I got involved in.

Now it is time for me to have a break for a while as the next 12 months I have a lot of other commitments and I would not be able to put my all into the club so I look to other members to step up and take on a committee position and guide the club through the coming year.

Finally, I wish to thank the members that volunteered their valuable time to be on the committee this year, it was challenging as life seems to get busier and busier. Everyone contributed and shared the load as best they could and we got through another year with money in the bank and a successful club that we can all be proud of. Thank you all.

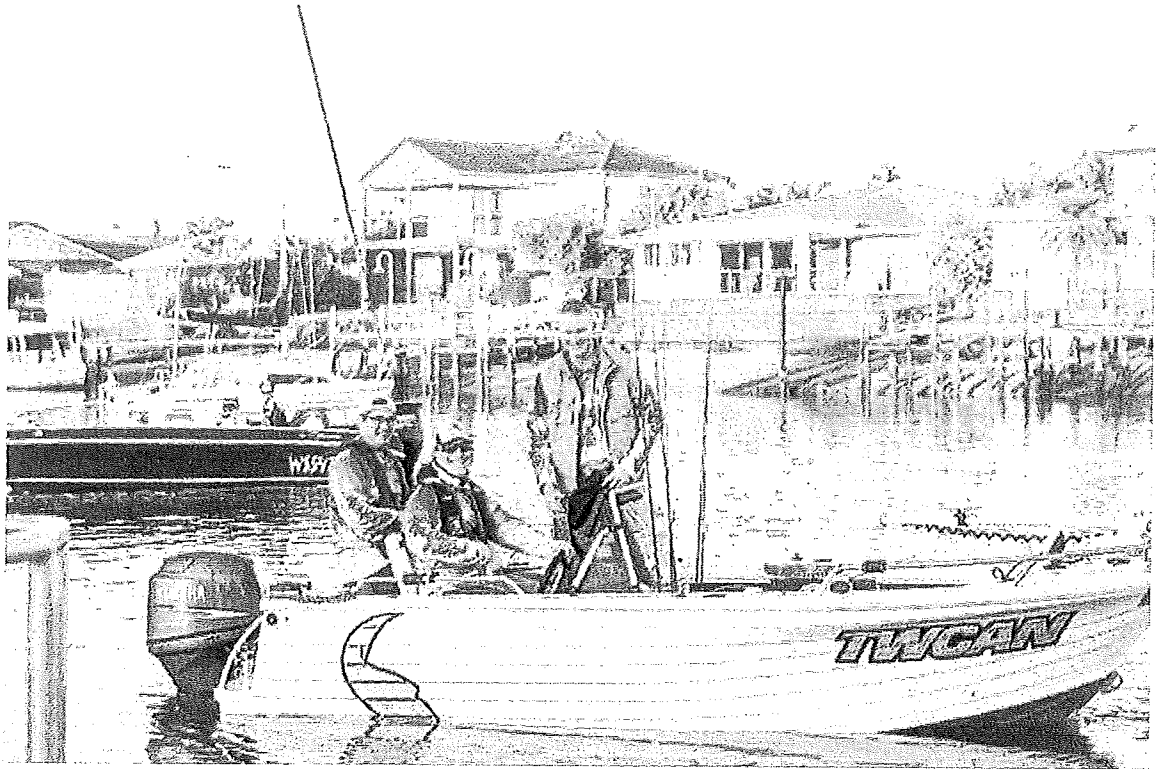

# Secretary's Report

As always this year has been extremely busy for our club and I would like to extend my thanks to all committee members for all of their hard work this year, it has been a stressful year, but working together we have come through it.

Here's a brief rundown of this year:

- We successfully hosted the 41st Burrinjuck Convention in November.
- We lost the annual competition to Morven Fishing Club at Burrinjuck, however, some good fish were caught and so it can be declared a successful cod opening weekend.
- In December the Canberra Fisherman's Club joined up with the National Capital Authority and the ACT Government to carry out fish stocking of over 99,000 native fingerlings into our local lakes. The Clubs contribution was funded by the net proceeds of the annual fish stocking raffle and 50% of the net proceeds of the Canberra Carp-Out 2014. Our club funded 100% of the Golden Perch released in Dunlop and Point Hut Ponds and 25% of the Golden Perch released in Lake Burley Griffin, with the National Capital Authority contributing the remaining 75% of the fingerlings.
- We had a stall at the Convoy for Cancer Fair in January, showing our support for The Cancer Support Group, Eden Monaro's Own.
- That same weekend we also had a display at the Queanbeyan 4WD Show. While the terrible weather destroyed the stall not long after it was put up, the event produced some decent ticket sales for the Native Fish Stocking Raffle.
- In February, thanks to the efforts of Anthony Heiser, we had a combined stall at the Jerrabomberra Wetlands Festival, where we were originally asked to catch carp to cook and let the public eat. We declined that invitation and instead had a great information booth where we also sold some native fish stocking raffle tickets.
- The Club again was a part of the Canberra Connect and Participate Expo at the Bus Depot Markets in March which provided us with a great opportunity to promote our Club to the public.
- Although there were a couple of times that we thought we wouldn't make it, we did host another successful Canberra Carp-Out and Native Fish Stocking Raffle. It was a lot of hard work but thank you to all of those who put in the hard yards prior to the event by selling tickets and promoting the event and running ticket stalls at various shopping centres and events.
- May brought Carpageaddon and the Koi Herpes Virus (CyHV3) and with it Chris Head became a TV star for the ABC and Anthony Heiser a front page star of The Queanbeyan Chronicle.
- In June we had an excellent guest speaker at our monthly meeting. Matt Beitzel from TAMS came to talk to us about the local fish stocking plans and how things are looking in our local lakes.
- Lastly, in June we presented a cheque for \$3,400 to The Cancer Support Group Eden Monaro's Own from the Carp-Out proceeds.

This past fishing year of 2015/16 we only reached a membership of 88 which included 45 ANSA members, 17 female members and 14 juniors. This was a little down from 2014/15 when we had 94 members, which was again down from 108 the year before. We did get some new members this year and I hope you have enjoyed any club outings and meetings that you have attended.

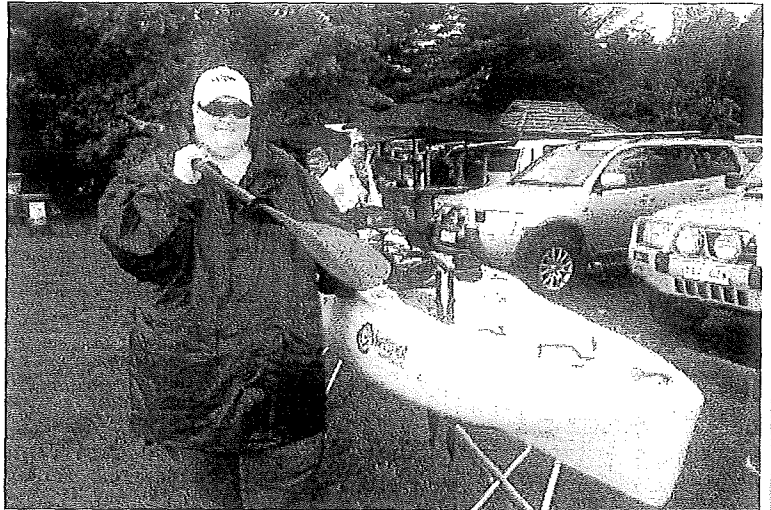

# Treasurer's Report

According to the XERO profit and loss statement, the Club is currently sitting at a net loss of \$3,395 for 2015/16. This is compared with a net loss of \$10,926 in 2014/15, and a net profit of \$6,625 in 2013/14. The loss is taking into account the investment rolled over from the 2014/15 financial year, being \$7.2k into fishing stocking, and the \$2k donation to the Cancer Support Group Eden Monaro's Own. Also our profit and loss statement goes up and down from year to year because we use cash basis accounting.

The Club ran a successful Burrinjuck Convention in 2015, making a profit of \$5,901, compared with profit \$9,594 in 2014. I would like to at this point thank everyone who volunteered their time at the Convention, this event generates the revenue needed to meet our Club's operating expenses each year.

The 2016 Canberra Carp-Out raised \$5,999, \$3,400 of which was donated to The Cancer Support Group Eden Monaro's Own and was presented before the 30<sup>th</sup> June 2016. Mel is always very grateful when receiving this, and thanks everyone for the clubs ongoing support.

The Club also raised \$4,627 for fish stocking activities. The Club used monies raised from previous fund raising activities to release 4,000 Golden Perch into Dunlop pond, and another 4,000 Golden perch into the Point Hut Pond. The club also plans to release \$3k worth of Murray cod fingerlings into Lake Burley Griffin in 2016.

Thanks to John's efforts the Club invested into office 365 this past year. This software package involves a scheduled payment monthly of \$85 and has currently cost the club \$850. This is in response to requests from committee members to improve our document management software. Office 365 has already proved to be very valuable and time efficient. Using this software has also removed conflicted copies of documents and now multiple people can work on the same document at the same time, from different locations without getting in each other's way or having to save separate copies.

The Club's financial position continues to be very healthy, with net assets totaling approximately \$25k. We had no other fund raising activities in 2015/16.

The Club's accounts have been audited, please read on for the details. The accounts that were presented at the AGM were found to be accurate, largely due to the precise reporting capabilities from our XERO accounting software. This has been the first year using the new cloud-based accounting software and I am truly happy with the outcome and ease of use.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone for their support and efforts at Burrinjuck and the Canberra Carp-Out. Due to life commitments, I will be handing my position with the committee over, but I wish the new treasurer all the best, and I look forward to more fishing adventures to come.

# Notes to the Financial Statements

Canberra Fisherman's Club Inc.

For the year ended 30 June 2016

## 1. Statement of Significant Policies

The financial statements have been prepared on the basis that the Club is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial reports. This financial report is therefore a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in order to meet the needs of members.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below which the Board have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of members. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of this report are as follows:

### 1.(a) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in, first-out basis and include direct materials, direct labour and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overhead expenses.

### 1.(b) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost, independent or directors' valuation. All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings, are depreciated over their useful lives to the club.

Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the profit and loss. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the asset charged to the profit and loss and depreciation based on the asset's original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Board to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted in determining recoverable amounts.

### 1.(c) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates, to any person other than the members, or any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

My audit procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and any other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether in all material respects the financial report is presented fairly so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the Association's financial position and performance as represented by the results of its operations.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

*Qualification*

Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated derives its income from various activities. As effective control over most transactions is not established until they are entered in the accounting records, I have been unable to independently verify whether amounts receivable from these sources have been completely accounted for. Accordingly, my audit in relation to income is limited to amounts recorded on the bank statements and accounting records.

*Audit Opinion*

In my opinion, except for the effects on the financial statements of the matter referred to in the above paragraph, the financial report of Canberra Fisherman's Club Incorporated presents fairly the financial position as at 30 June 2016 and the results of its operations for the year then ended.

# Official Items

## Recorder's Report

Four years down and it is time to take a break. This will be my last annual report for a while as I'd like to do a bit more fishing and less administration this coming year. I do still enjoy seeing capture sheets and hearing the stories of people's latest accomplishments, but it's time to hand the recorder's baton over to Michael Peel for a while.

Once again, the Narooma outing takes the top ranking for sheer number of fish caught with 84 captures. Tuross followed up with 65 captures in a weekend. Outings accounted for 298 captures in total, meaning a little over half of all captures for the year came from outings.

In total there were 455 captures this year, which is only one less than last year so our consistency is excellent! With European Carp no longer being the Freshwater length there were only 15 captures of this recently popular fish. I can see more captures this coming year as the possible release of the Carp Herpes virus in 2018 may make your Carp masters considerably more difficult. This year's 455 captures were spread across 42 species (35 last year) with 47 anglers capturing at least one fish (41 last year). Bream were the most popular species this year accounting for 151 of the captures.

This year saw 15 masters awarded in total with just one exceed 250 points. That's considerably lower than last year's 27 total and 5 above 250 points. The single 250+ masters went to Chris Lemmon. Of some note, only 97 captures were on pre-test line this year. This means that less than a quarter of our captures were eligible for our own points based competitions and the ANSA NSW 12-month competition.

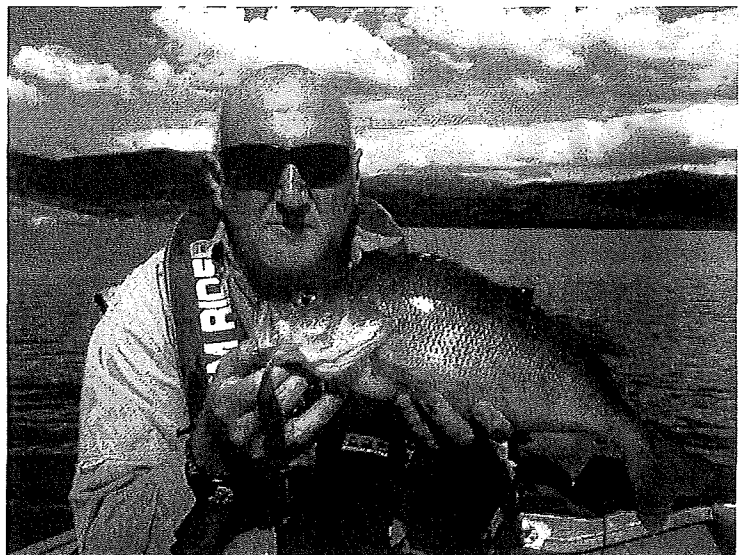
Two new entries were made to the all-time board fish listing this year - Chris Lemmon's impressive 6.88kg Whip Tail Ray and Mitchell McGovern's outstanding 7.1kg Rainbow Trout. The All-time Length board continues to flesh itself out with 18 new entries being added this year. A 1010mm Fiddler Ray to Colin Clark, a 930mm Banjo Ray to Susan McNeice and an 820mm Mulloway to Chris Clark being the stand out captures.

A few club members took advantage of the holes in the records list with a total of 8 new club records being set throughout the year. A Common Stingray of 4.2kg on 2kg line claimed records in both the ladies and junior classes for Macy Walton while her brother Kyle claimed Junior and Open class records with a 4kg Dusky Flathead on 2kg line.

That's it from me for a while. I give a final congratulation to all trophy winners and to those who have achieved masters or other awards as the year rolled on. Even if you didn't win something, well done on getting out there and having a go at it. It certainly beats working!

Good luck to you all in the coming fishing year.

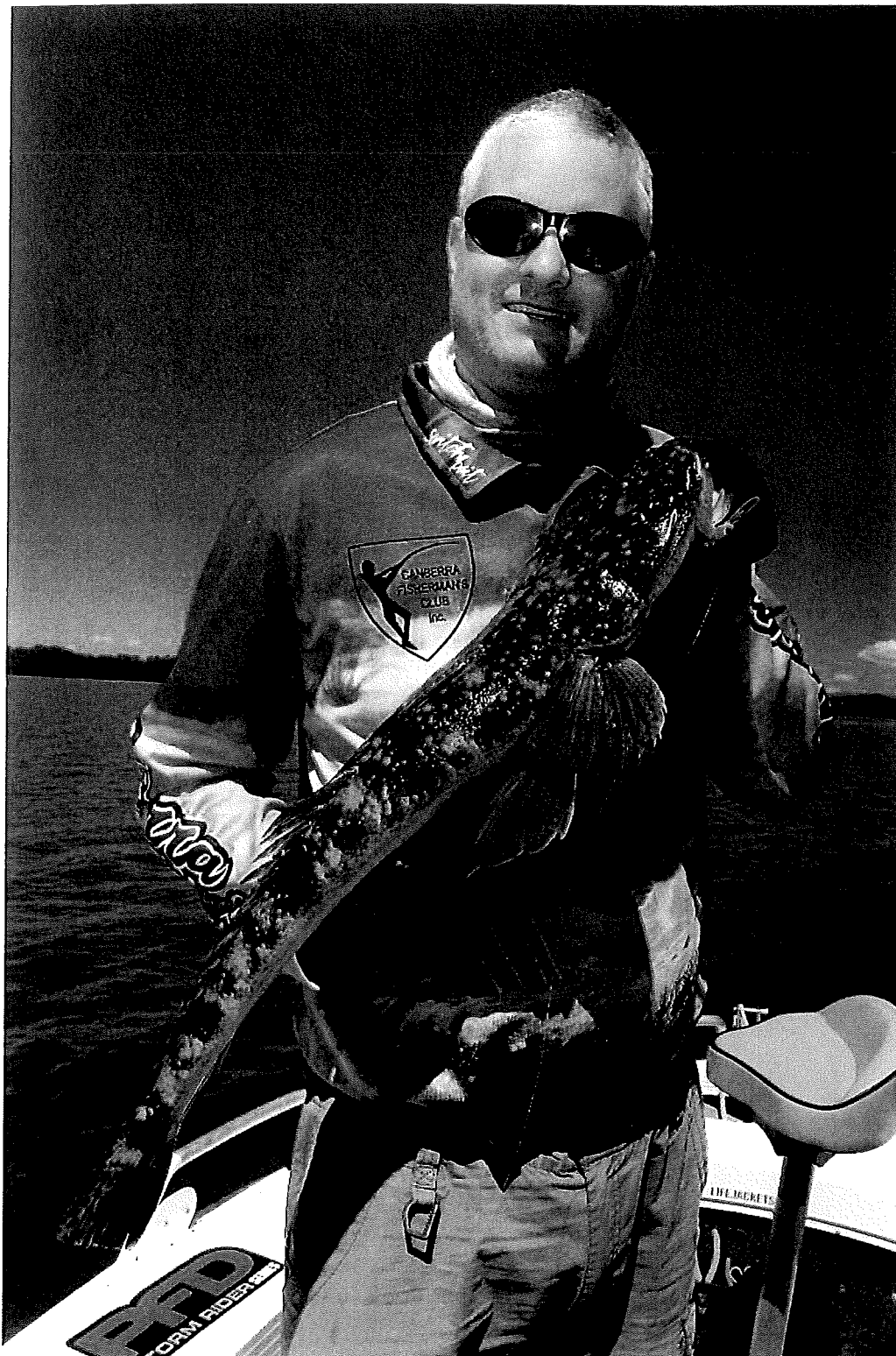

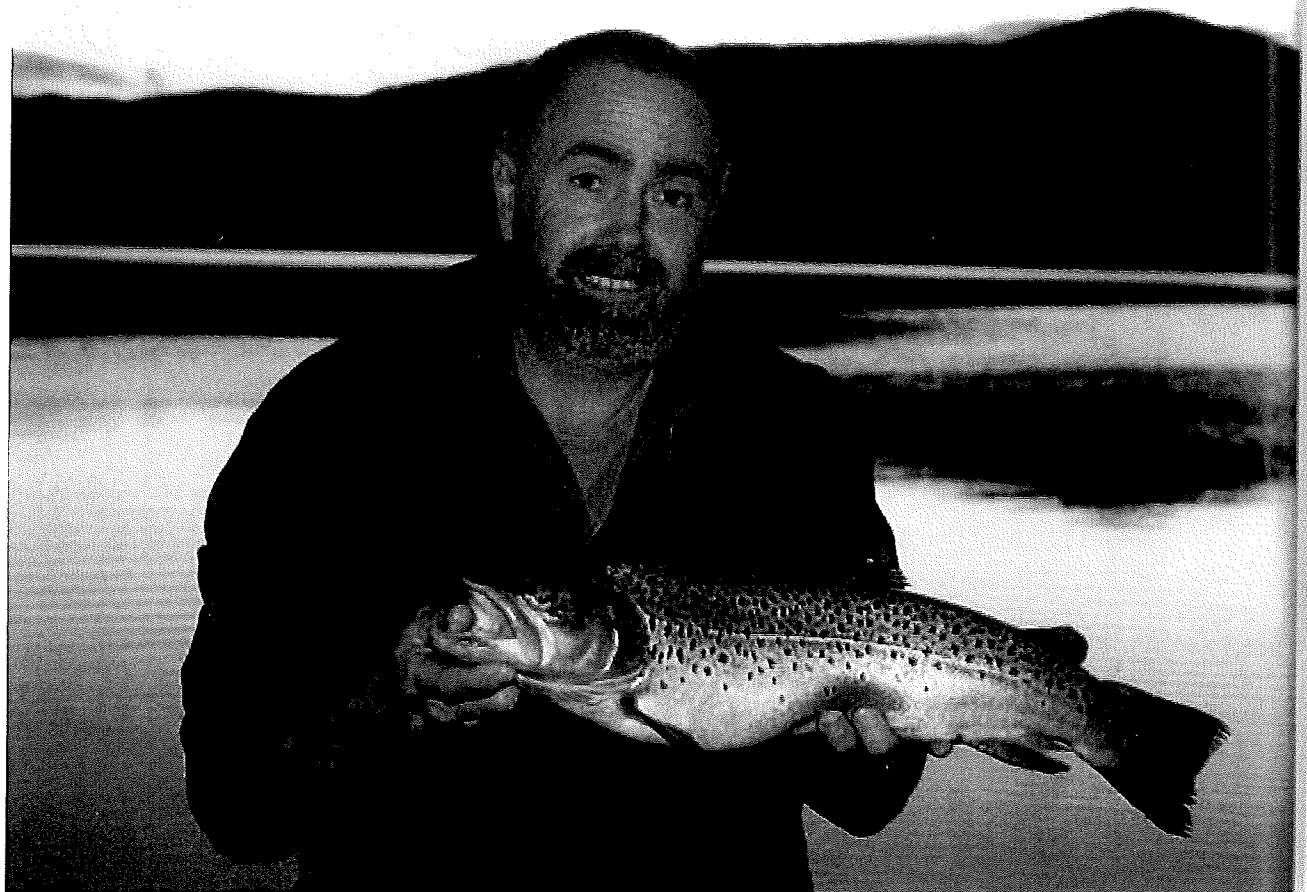
