Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sportfishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

## *Aims of the Club*

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing

## *Club Recorder's Report*

Hi All

The 2008/09 season is almost over so it's time to make those last minute captures, or plan a trip for the start of the 2009/10 season. There will be no Championship listing, Board Fish, or Best Fish in the Newsletter this month. There are several Championship categories that are extremely close, for example as I write this only 89 points separate 1<sup>st</sup> place from 5<sup>th</sup> place in the Saltwater Championship. **“So one last minute trip to the coast could put you over the line!”**

### **ANSA NSW 12 Month Comp Changes**

There have been some changes to the 12 Month Competition to accommodate for the shift towards length based captures. Several categories have been modified or combined and Handline has been abolished. New categories are:

Length Only – Trout (All Species)

Length Only – Australian Bass

Length Only – Bream (All Species)

Length Only – Flathead (All Species)  
Length Only – Australian Salmon  
Length Only – Yellowtail Kingfish

We also have our Club based Total Length Trophies for Flathead (All Species) and Golden Perch. So as a result I would encourage all members to start measuring and weighing all captures, this way I can determine what works best for you, the more information I have the better. Of course if you are on top of everything you can tell me exactly where you want your captures to go.

#### **NSW amendments to Trophy Lengths**

ANSA NSW has made several amendments to the trophy lengths to make them relevant to NSW waters.

Watson's Leaping Bonito - reduced from 60cm to 40cm (they were under Bonito – All)

Mangrove Jack - reduced from 60cm to 50cm

Snapper - reduced from 80cm to 70cm

Tailor - reduced from 60cm to 50cm

Brook Trout - reduced from 60cm to 40cm (they were under Trout – All)

#### **June Outing – Narooma**

Twelve members and one visitor attended the June long weekend outing to Narooma and recorded 25 fish. This included 8 Australian Salmon, 4 Striped Tuna, 3 Dusky Flathead, 3 Snapper, 3 Yellowfin Bream, 2 Silver Trevally, 1 Bonito, and 1 Estuary Perch.

Brian Stacy accounted for a couple of the Stripies the best was 4.34kg on 6kg line, Glen Malam landed another one of 4.30kg on 24kg line. Listening to the reports at the last Meeting there were several slightly bigger 'Tuna' lost over the weekend, a couple of members commented they were possibly decent Albacore.

Good fun was had with plenty of Salmon caught from the beaches, Steve Bailey caught the largest at 1.88kg on 3kg line, Brian Stacy landed one of 1.39kg on 2kg line, and Glen and Mitchell Malam landed identical Salmon of 1.43kg on 1kg line.

Mitchell also accounted for a Yellowfin Bream of 1.03kg on 1kg line from the beach, which in my eyes was the standout capture for the weekend.

Jamie and Tom Stanfield caught several pretty little Estuary Perch up the Tuross River and had some good looking photos to prove it.

#### **Recent Captures**

Steve Bailey submitted captures from a recent trip to Queensland. Fish from Swain's Reef included a Narrow Barred Mackerel of 24.00kg on 24kg line, a Chinaman Fish of 3.50kg, and a Gold Spot Trevally of 3.42kg. A couple of All-Time Board Fish Captures there!

Steve also gave us a run down of his trip on the audio visual equipment in our meeting room at Eastlake's during the May meeting. You can now be quite creative with your fishing reports if you wish.

Anthony Heiser continued to fish the Kalkite area of Lake Jindabyne and was rewarded when he caught a Brook Trout of 1.15kg on 1kg line. It was taken casting a Brown Trout pattern floating Rapala.

After Anthony's efforts with the Brook Trout we both headed up the weekend after with high hopes of tangling another ex-brood stock fish. Anthony was able to land another Brook which was quite small, but still a good effort as they can be a rare capture for some people, I included.

I managed to land a Brown of 1.18kg on 1kg line, and a Rainbow of 1.26kg on 1kg line. It was a long day of slugging lures, with a lot of casts between fish but at the end of the day it was well worth it and something I plan to do more of in the future. I was quite happy to get both Brown and Rainbow lurecasting masters out of the way on the same day as I've heard horror stories of members trying to get these and coming up agonizingly short time after time.

Don't forget any 08/09 Captures forms need to be in my hand no later than the 14<sup>th</sup> of July, which coincidentally happens to be the day of the July Meeting so don't forget to bring them along. Good luck over the next month, hope you all manage to get out and catch some fish! "Cheers Steve".
