## *Aims of the Club*

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the *Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing*, which endorses:

1. Taking no more than our immediate needs
2. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
3. Supporting and encouraging activities that restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
4. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
5. Using established roads and tracks
6. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damaging sensitive areas
7. Reporting environmental damage and pollution to the relevant authorities
8. Avoiding interactions with threatened species and their critical habitats
9. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catches to the water
10. Using only legal tackle, attending our gear and valuing our catch
11. Practicing courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
12. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering land
13. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing

At the AGM held over the weekend, the following people were elected as your ANSA NSW Committee for the next 2 years:

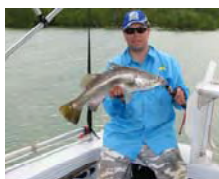
- President – Stan Konstantaras

At the NSW Committee meeting, also held in Sydney last weekend, the issue of Trophy Lengths were discussed. It was agreed to propose several changes to the lengths for fish caught in NSW to ANSA National for ratification. The proposed changes include:

- Watson's Leaping Bonito – a separate Trophy Length of 40cm
- Snapper – reduced from 80cm to 70cm
- Brook Trout – a separate Trophy Length of 40cm. Brown and Rainbow stay at 60cm.
- Tailor – reduced to 50cm from 60cm.

It was a shame that I was the only representative at the ANSA NSW presentation dinner, as we had quite a few recipients of certificates. Get in touch with me to arrange collection. Thanks to the Botany Bay club for hosting a great evening.

## Recorder's Report

Hi All

There haven't been any Outings since the last Newsletter so there is nothing to report on that front, however there has been some truly exceptional captures in the last month.

Andrew Butt did a mid week trip to Jindabyne in late August and caught some excellent trout; the best Rainbow went 1.30kg on 1kg line (trolling). Andrew also caught a Brown of 2.50kg on 1kg line (630mm), which was taken lurecasting with soft plastics.

Only a few days later Andy McGovern was up at Jindabyne as well, and he caught some unbelievable fish! The best was a Brown of 4.78kg on 1kg line (710mm). **Yes that's right it's not a typo 4.78kg.** It didn't stop there; Andy also caught Browns of 3.20kg, 2.88kg, and 2.69kg all on 1kg line. He also caught several small Brooks the best was 0.54kg on 1kg line. Apparently the 3.20kg Brown had 16 yabbies and 2 small trout in its stomach.

Dave Walton ventured up to the Nambucca River and managed to extract a huge Dusky Flathead of 5.10kg on 4kg line (890mm).

Brian Stacy did some beach fishing around Durras and caught a few small Australian Salmon; the best was 0.86kg on 2kg line.

Brian Stacy, David Stacy and Keith Smith did a follow up trip to Braemar and David weighed in a Rainbow of 0.78kg on 2kg line. Nice one David!

There are definitely some Most Meritorious Capture nominations among that lot.

After seeing the captures coming in from Jindabyne I'm very excited about the September Outing to Kalkite this weekend. What other motivation do you need to get out there and give it your best? Hopefully the Trout decide to play the game!

If you aren't attending the Kalkite Outing I hope you have some luck where ever you decide to fish, I'm looking forward to seeing those capture forms coming in at the October Meeting.

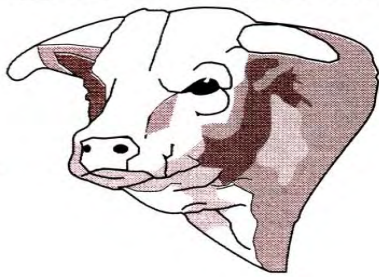

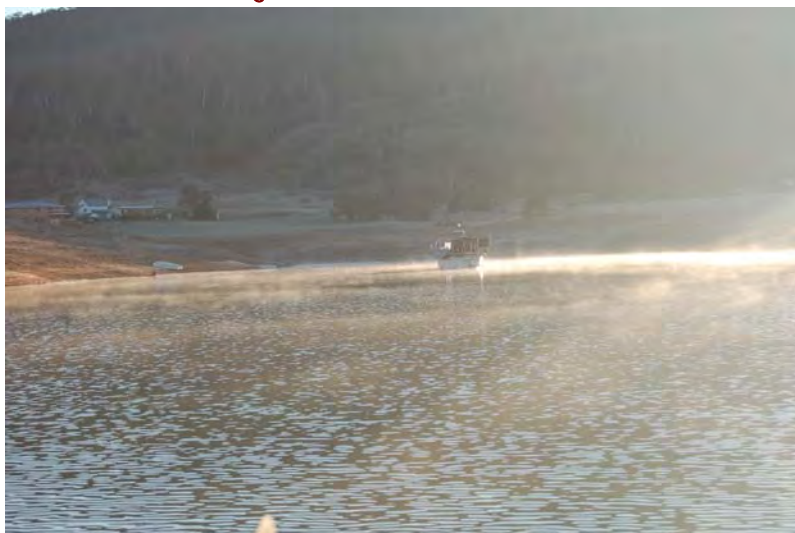

# *Outings Officer's Report on KALKITE*

## Kalkite Outing – 12 – 14 September 2008

Kalkite is always a popular outing; healthy 2kg plus Brown Trout are often caught along with plenty of Rainbows. The Club has been going to Kalkite, since our popular member Graham Butt (now deceased) discovered the Kalkite Villas around ten years ago. It is Ski accommodation that reverts to predominantly fishing purposes early September when the skiers are able to find accommodation closer to the slopes as the season draws to a close. The Villas can accommodate sixteen and are fully serviced, towels and linen is supplied along with washing machines and driers – too good for fishermen used to camping in swags on lakeshores. Depending on numbers the cost is around sixty dollars for the two nights accommodation. We are always able to arrange a 12.00pm check out to maximise Sunday's fishing.

The camaraderie of Kalkite is a feature of the outing, everybody bunks in the two adjoining villas (eight in each) the evenings are taken up swapping fishing stories and after dinner trying to watch a Saturday night footy finals on very ghostly television supported by a glass or two. There are always a few hardy fishers who opt for an evening fish, and even more hardy souls who elect to camp in tents or swags on the bank. If this option is of interest contact the outings officer for details of where and how to do this, as there are no formal camping facilities at Kalkite.

Kalkite is on the northwestern end of Jindabyne, below the village is Taylors Bay, and it offers some protection from the wind in adverse conditions. Fishing choices are numerous, the Eucumbene River, along the southern shore and up the Snowy Arm for some nice Browns. The clay banks down towards East Jindabyne are good for trolling and lure casting. Bank fishing is often very productive on the points jutting into the lake.

Boat launching at Kalkite is fair, the ramp is well gravelled, and two-wheel drive launching is usually safe. Just to be sure it is best to co-ordinate launching and retrievals with other members to provide a back up in case of trouble.

Directions to get there: Turn right about 10km before Jindabyne at the Kalkite sign, take the next turn on the left (about 2k along) and follow the road down to the lake. Kalkite Villas are the first dwellings seen coming into the village, continue on to the first left (Gardenia St) and the next left (Magnolia St) and follow the road up to the Villas. The entrance is on the first bend; take note of the light pole very close to the driveway. It has been hit numerous times when backing out of the drive.

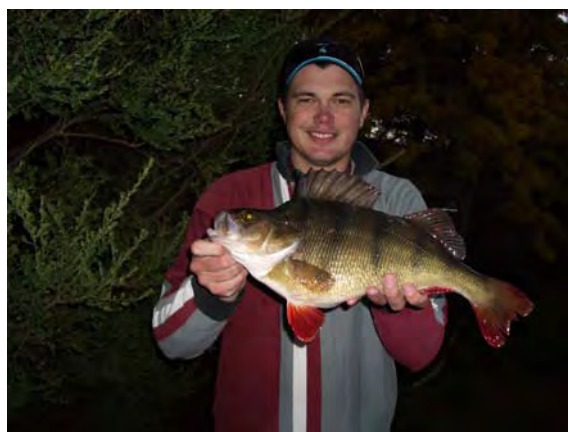
