## *Aims of the Club*

- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing

# **RECORDERS REPORT**

Hi All

Well things have started to heat up and I'm not just referring to the fishing, several mid thirty degree days certainly have put us right into summer weather.

## **Outings**

### **Talbingo Convention**

Eleven Members attended the Talbingo Convention this year, which is probably an average turn out judging from the last few years. As per usual the fishing was tough, Steve Gyles from WWBCA reported that it was one of their most successful Conventions in regards to numbers of fish caught, but sadly our Club didn't contribute to this number a great deal, but we did catch a couple of fish. Seeing at though the fish were few and far between for our club I might as well mention them individually.

First off I think would have to be Tom Stanfield's Rainbow Trout of 0.18kg on 2kg line (26cm), this won Tom the heaviest Trout in the Junior ANSA section, and the Champion in the Junior ANSA section. It just goes to show that you should never assume that a fish isn't good enough to weigh in. Tom received a nice looking rod and reel combo for his efforts. He also caught a couple of small Redfin which saw him score the most All Tackle points for the outing.

Anthony Heiser fished with Chris Head down at Blowering. Anthony managed to land a Golden Perch of 3.33kg on 1kg line by fishing a yabby on a jig head while drifting. I think Anthony was very pleased with his capture, it was released and entered into the catch and release section where he placed third. Anthony was also 'done' by a big fish whilst trolling, apparently it took quite a bit of line before popping his 1kg pretest and taking off with his lucky Predater Boomerang he found at Googong.

I also fished Blowering with my Dad Eric. We saw an amazing amount of large Golden in the shallows (well I did, Dad left his Polaroids in the car). It was tough work I was getting sore from casting so much before finally I hooked up only to drop it soon after. Several hours later I was on again, this time I was using a \$7 Lipless Crankbait known as a Prism Murrin recommended by Ashley Barber. It was a Golden which weighed in at 4.65kg on 1kg and took out the Heaviest Native in the ANSA section.

Sara De La Rue weighed in a Rainbow Trout of 0.41kg on 2. Chris and Sara fished Talbingo while all of our other boats fished down at Blowering. I didn't hear much about how Talbingo was fishing, but there were no exceptionally large trout weighed in.

Overall it was an enjoyable outing as the Talbingo Convention always is and the predicted wet weather held out until the drive home.

### **Burrinjuck Convention**

Tom Stanfield weighed in 10 Carp with the best going 1.42kg on 1kg, there was also reportedly a rather large Carp lost that was almost in the net. Jamie weighed in a few, his best going a respectable 3.41kg on 1.

Chris Head landed a Golden Perch of 1.59kg on 1 trolling his lucky Bassman Spinnerbaits across the lake from the Park.

Mitchell and Kelsey McGovern caught a few Carp as well. Mitchell's best was 2.38kg on 1 lurecasting, and Kelsey managed to land a few while no-one was looking which weighed 1.82kg and 1.83kg on 1.

Shane and I focused on 'Carp on Plastics' which Shane had scoped out with Darren earlier in the week. After a slow start we managed probably 25 odd between us, Shane also caught two on fly. Shane's best went 2.13kg on 1, and my best was 3.50kg on 1 (which scored us 1 point for the Convention!!!)

Kate Johnson weighed in 4 Carp with the best at 2.07kg on 1, which sees her leading the Ladies Championship.

#### Recent Captures

Andrew Butt, Dave Walton, Steve Bailey, and Chris Lemmon have returned from their annual Queensland Impoundment trip with a lot of fish to report, there was a ridiculous amount of Barra caught over 1 metre. Here is what they submitted which is only a small percentage of the fish caught:

Ben Lemmon fished the Clyde River with Pat Brennan and managed to land an impressive Mulloway of 11.50kg on 10kg. It was taken at night fishing a deep hole with soft plastics.

Chris Head and I fished the Molonglo River on Melbourne Cup day and Chris scored a Golden of 2.42kg on 1, he also had a few other follows. We also had an adventure trying to make it back to the ramp in the wind. We had two electrics and a paddle going flat out and were still going backwards. Chris lost his favourite hat and we weren't able to retrieve it. It was like Tom Hanks in Castaway seeing his friend 'Wilson' slowly drift away.

Andrew Butt and Kate Johnson fished Windamere Dam and caught 8 Goldenes between them. Andrew caught 6 with the best going 570mm, while Kate caught one at 2.00kg on 2kg and another at 500mm. Apparently Andrew had some success fishing Jackalls in deeper water once he figured out a retrieve that was successful.

Andrew McGovern also fished Windamere and caught rather large Golden of 6.48kg on 1 (674mm). He also landed one other Golden at 2.14kg on 1. Apparently it was one of the toughest trips Andy has had to Windamere, the fish didn't want to play.

That's about all this month, apologies if you have submitted a fish that hasn't rated a mention it has been quite busy. Good luck over the next month, the local fishing options are looking good with the Natives on the chew and the Cod season opening on December 1<sup>st</sup>, so get out there and have a go!!! We have the Local Lakes Outing and Christmas Party coming up on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> of December, and the next meeting is on Tuesday December 8<sup>th</sup>.
