11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing

We even pumped up some nippers and used them as bait on the sand flats, and even though I could see whiting, they were not interested in the nippers.

Work is continuing on the Carp-Out, the applications for the venue are in, and we're just waiting for the go ahead and we can start advertising the event. Should be a good one in 2010!

Christmas holiday's usually signals more family fun times fishing so let's make it a safe time for all. A couple of things that I have raised at our last couple of meeting plus the safety equipment you should be carrying are below:




A New Boat Safety label replaces the previous capacity plate and must be displayed on all powered vessels, so if you do not have

The new green label in you boat already, I suggest you get one before heading out for the Christmas fish. The label indicates

The maximum number of people to be carried on a particular vessel, as well as important safety information.

If you can't make it out to the Maritime at Queanbeyan I have a few left over so give me a call if you need one.

Life Jackets have an expiry date and or inspection requirement so check them before heading out if unsure head into Ken's Marine who are one of our sponsors and have a chat to them. As I have found out they can service the new manual or auto inflating jackets (which most have an annual inspection requirement) for a small sum & worth the piece of mind

Marine Parks

If you are heading down the coast remember to grab a copy of the current marine park map just to make sure you don't end up in a "no fishing zone". ACORF are still in consultation with the MPA with regards to permits for clubs holding outing in the park and the next meeting is expected to be early next year so will keep you posted of any eventuation's.

Freshwater Sanctuary Zones?

RecFish Australia have sent through the attached news clipping that suggests freshwater marine conservation zones, Should be created, what do you think about this? Here are a few words from Frank Prokop from Recfish Australia:

I am most concerned about the recent call for freshwater sanctuary zones to protect Murray cod. Part of the problem is with academics seeking to increase their public profile and then presumably their funding. They are not accountable through the management of the relevant fisheries and can talk absolute rubbish like this to generate some interest from the lunatic fringe in the community that isn't smart enough to find out the facts or the complexities of managing our fisheries. It is always easier to ban something than to manage it and we are seeing this increasing trend with end users such as recreational fishers feeling the brunt of this philosophy.

The truth is that it is the recreational fishing sector, with support from some enlightened scientists that have made the real difference in fresh water management. Trout cod and Eastern freshwater cod are the two most spectacular species rehabilitation programs in Australia - all funded through recreational fishing driven initiatives.

Murray cod themselves have made an enormous recovery (they were virtually unheard of in the Lachlan for example in 1992 before the closed season, bag limit and size limit reforms came in with not a sanctuary zone in sight!!) and no one is actually talking about the coincidental mortalities of big cod in South Australia straight after the electro-fisher goes through. We have protected Macquarie perch, grayling, and catfish in rivers, lungfish, and river blackfish. In short, where there has been a major population problem, anglers have gone on the front foot and have acted conservatively and proactively to address the problem. There have been a huge number of conservative management measures put in place for bass, estuary perch, barramundi, silver perch, Murray crayfish and other spiny crayfish, marron in WA, and the list goes on and on.

Anglers were responsible for agitating for re-snagging the Murray, for supporting Martin Mallen-Cooper's work on fish passage in the Murray-Darling system and other good work in Queensland and on the Shoalhaven, not to mention the excellent fish production work at Narrandera by scientists such as Rowland, Barlow, Rimmer, Ingram etc.

It is because of this type of populist misinformation proposing freshwater sanctuaries as the one true solution that Recfish Australia has asked FRDC to support the preparation of a desk top study to detail conservation projects and initiatives developed, promoted, supported or adopted by the recreational fishing sector. I would expect that there would be a lot of freshwater focus, but also note that initiatives such as the total protection of saw sharks in Western Australia, or my favourite, that the Barry Wrasse from Pew's Nemo style attack on fishing is already totally protected and was strongly supported by recreational fishers.

It is really important that we as a group do not let clear misrepresentations such as this that sanctuary zones in freshwater will address the fundamental environmental declines that have been primarily responsible for fish depletions, do not go unchallenged.

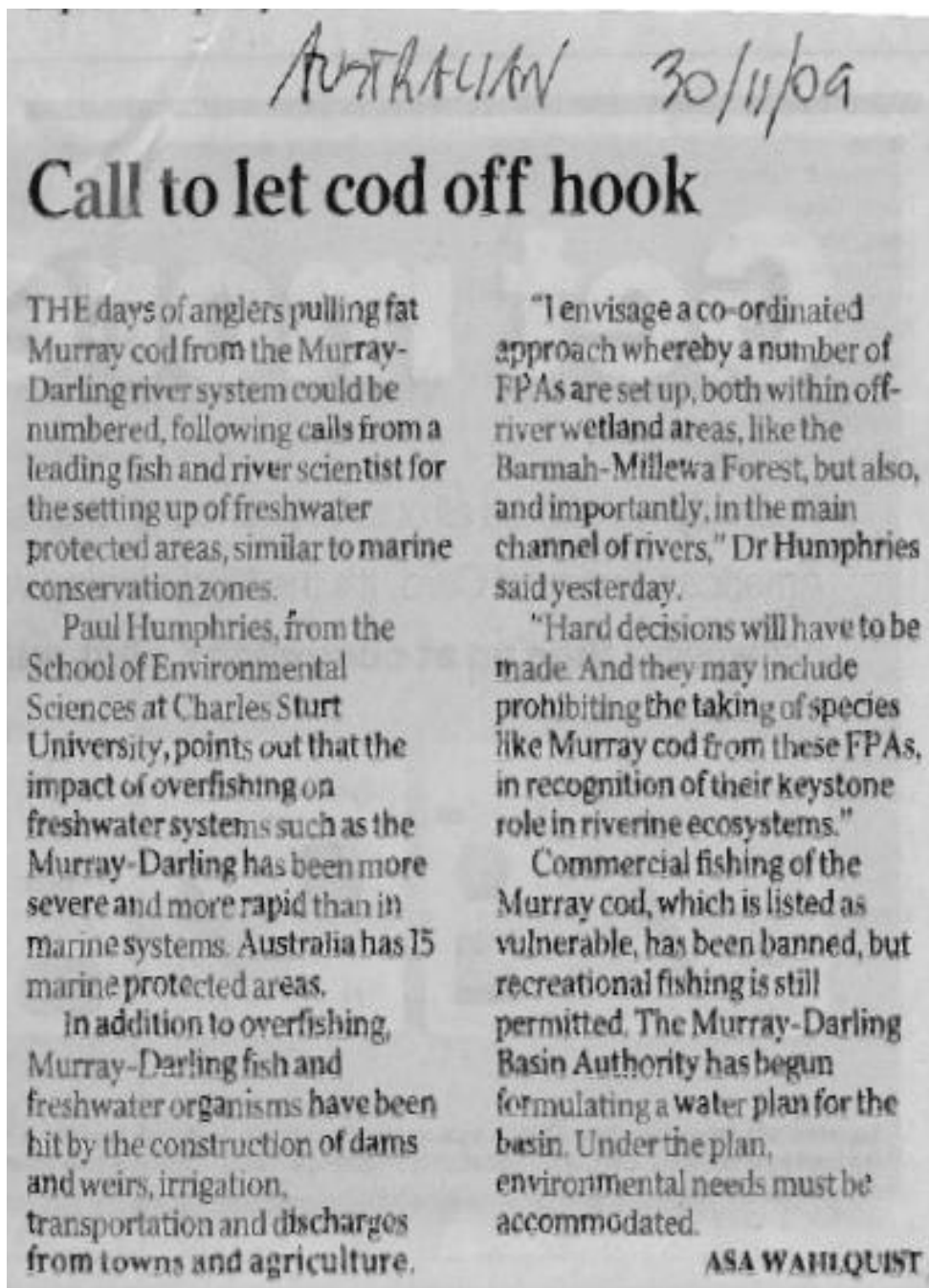

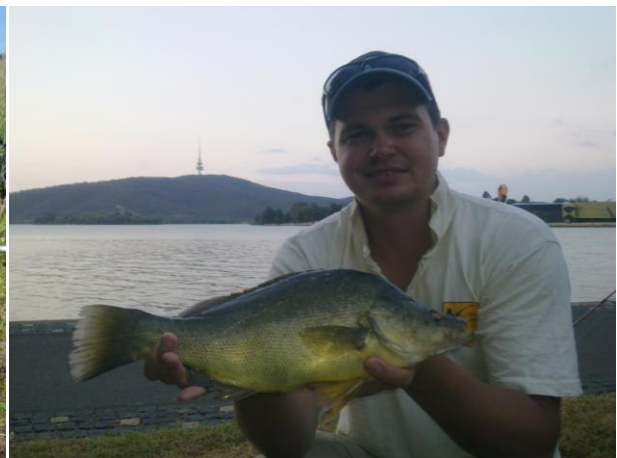

RECORDERS REPORT

Hi All

Over the Christmas/New Year period the captures usually start to pick up, especially the Saltwater captures as people holiday up and down the Coast. You could easily take the lead in Saltwater Championship with one good fish.

Outings

Local Lakes

This year 19 Members attended the Local Lakes Outing and/or Christmas Party. There were 17 fish recorded for the Outing which included 8 Red fin, 7 Carp, and 2 Silver Perch.

Shane Jasprizza and Darren Hossack fished Lake Tuggeranong and landed a big Carp each. Shane's went 6.52kg on 2 (750mm), while Darren scored his PB Carp of 7.64kg on 2 (770mm). Shane ventured out to Ginninderra in his Hobie later that day and managed some small Red fin.

Jamie and Tom Stanfield also fished Tuggeranong but landed two Silver Perch and two Red fin, but no Carp. Chris De La Rue caught Silver in Tuggeranong the week before, and we've heard of two other Silvers from Tuggeranong recently. As far as we know Silvers haven't been stocked into Tuggeranong, so Shane Jasprizza is investigating. A popular theory suggested by Matt at Tackleworld is stuff up at the Hatchery with Silvers being accidentally mixed in with Golden Perch or Murray Cod, but that is only speculation. Will keep you informed as to what the official word is, if we get one...

Anthony Heiser and I fished the Jerrabomberra Duck Pond and picked up a few Carp each. My best was 2.92kg on 1, while Anthony's best went 2.01kg on 1. Anthony also lost one when his line popped just before it was in net range, the Carp was estimated at 4kg. After this we headed out to Googong to chase Golden Perch lurecasting from the bank. We had several chances but nothing stuck, I lost one in the weed that I couldn't stop with 2 pound Crystal. Later in the day after a break we went out to Yerrabi and could only manage a few Red fin, looks as if they are well and truly established in there now.

Chris De La Rue and Phil Lawrence trolled in Lake Burley Griffin and Chris caught a Carp on a Cod lure.

Recent Captures

Shane Jasprizza and Chris De La Rue competed in the Carp-a-thon that was run by the Vikings Club at Lake Tuggeranong recently. Shane caught 4 Carp at 5.54kg, 5.46kg, 4.94kg and 2.44kg all on 2kg line. Chris De La Rue had a mighty battle landing a Carp of 7.32kg on 2 (Pretest), I think the fight lasted over an hour? Chris also landed Silver which I mentioned previously. The biggest Carp weighed in at the event was 11.80kg, so there are some monsters getting around in there.

Brian Stacy picked up a bag of Sand Flathead off Durras, and a legal Dusky Flathead in the Clyde. He is well out in front and looking good to retain the Flathead Length Trophy.

I've been chasing some Golden Perch recently and have landed a few, Two from Googong with the best going 3.46kg on 1 (545mm), and one at Burley Griffin at 1.34kg on 1 (410mm). I've also lost several but that comes with the territory I suppose. All have been taken on 1/4oz Bass man Spinner baits. I also fished Yerrabi on the evening of Dec 1st with Shane Jasprizza and Anthony Heiser, I lost one big Golden and landed several little Cod. The other guys had a few hits but nothing stuck.

I've also fished the Queanbeyan River several time's, it is tough going with clearer than average water due to the lack of rain and also excessive weed growth. I have caught a couple with the best going 7.36kg on 2 but it's a struggle.

Chris Head, Jake Mackenzie and I also did a bit of Carp fishing at Lake Tuggeranong. Jake landed the first fish of the day at 6.17kg on 3. Jake was then on again but was having a hard time stopping a big Carp on 1kg pretest, after a fight of about an hour the fish had him snagged a mile down the lake. I was on next with a Carp of 5.68kg on 2; this one had been tethered previously as it still had the rope trailing from its mouth. After withstanding the midday heat for a few bite-less hours I decided to duck over quickly and buy us some drinks, and as is always the case while I was gone both

of my rods went off!!!! Chris was still fighting one of them when I returned; it went 6.79kg on 1. Next time I will bring an esky full of drinks!

That's all from me this month; if I don't catch you beforehand I hope you have a Good Christmas/New Year.
