Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

Inquiry into Recreational Fishing

As I said last month, Anthony Heiser and I were off to Griffith on the 27th May for the NSW Government Inquiry into Recreational Fishing. As we reported at the June meeting it all went well, and overall I think we did well providing evidence. Anthony has submitted a report which will be elsewhere in this newsletter. We've now got the job of reviewing the transcripts to correct any errors, and then I guess we wait and see what the outcomes of the inquiry are.

AGM

As I said earlier, there are a few things happening in the near future, one of them is the Annual General Meeting on the 10th August. If you would like to become part of the Committee, either as a Committee member or as part of the Executive, the best way to do this is to get a written nomination into the Public Officer 28 days prior to the AGM. We'll make sure there are some nomination forms available at the next Club meeting, or print the one towards the end of the newsletter. Your nominations will need to be supported by two Club members. It's very rewarding and worthwhile if you would like to contribute more to your fishing club.

To be elected to the Committee, or vote at the AGM, you need to be a financial member of the Club. Memberships are due on the 1st July. To make it easy to join, there is a Membership form towards the end of the newsletter as well.

Canberra Carp Out 2011

As mentioned at the last Club meeting Sunday March 20th 2011 will be the date for the Canberra Carp Out 2011. Reminder: Local Lakes & Googong Dam boat permit renewal.

For all members that hold boating permits for the local lakes and Googong dam please check your expiry date on your permit.

Don't fall into the trap like I did that you will receive a renewal for this permit and then realise the day before your planned fishing outing that the permit has expired and you can't get it renewed in time. A call to Environment Protection & Heritage Licensing & investigation on 02 6207 2138 and talk to the licensing officers may assist you in this case as they kindly did for me but don't always bank on it.

I have attached a copy of the form for apply for or renewing of the license. Permits are required if your petrol motor cannot be removed.

Lake Burley Griffin Boat Permit!

If you are interested in putting you boat on Lake Burley Griffin this is controlled by the National Capital Authority. I have application forms at each meeting. You require a permit if you boat petrol motor cannot be removed.

You will be required to have an inspection done by the water police as part of the permit application but once you have been approved and receive you permit and stickers the NCA automatically send you out new stickers for your boat each financial year. So happy boating on the local lakes and dams.

Last month I talked about how it would be nice to have an online forum/blog that members can communicate together putting up ideas, talk fishing and arrange impromptu fishing outings. We have starting this process rolling and working towards a members only area of the website. 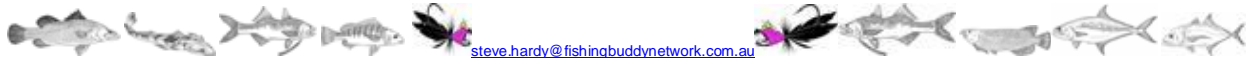
To the General Membership of the Canberra Fisherman's Club: C/o the Secretary Chris Head,

Hi All

Winter has finally set in and the number of captures coming in has started to decline. Don't forget June 30 is the last day to catch a fish for the 2009/10 season. After that you have two weeks to get the last of your capture forms in which is the day after the July club meeting.

Also if you won any trophies last year don't forget to return the perpetual trophies. The next meeting would be a good opportunity if you can possibly make it along.

Also you might wish to consider nominating for a Committee position, or if that's not your cup of tea perhaps just nominate someone for a Joke Trophy or as a Most Improved Angler or Most Improved Junior Angler.

May Outing: Jervis Bay: Only 6 Club Members attended the May Outing to Jervis Bay. Those who attended gave the location the thumbs up, however perhaps due to a lack of popularity it's not on our calendar for next year. Despite the big seas there was still some good fishing to be had in St Georges Basin. Captures for the Outing included 4 Dusky Flathead, 2 Tailor, 2 Yellowfin Bream, and 1 Luderick.

Anthony Heiser had the standout capture of the Outing a Tailor of 1.50kg on 1kg line. It was caught free lining an unweighted pilchard down to a bait school Greg and Anthony found on the sounder.

Tom and Jamie fished with Bay and Basin Sportsfishing Charters and picked up several Dusky Flathead and Yellowfin Bream, if you are interested in fishing with these guys you might like to have a chat to Jamie and see what he has to say. Also we have a voucher for a free Charter with Bay and Basin Sportsfishing which will be raffled as a major prize at the upcoming Club Presentation night.

June Outing: Narooma: A total of 16 members attended the Narooma Outing over the June long weekend. Captures included 12 Dusky Flathead, 6 Australian Salmon, 2 Striped Tuna, 2 Yellowfin Bream, 1 Tailor, and 1 Silver Trevally. Greg and Rose Davis weighed in 9 Dusky Flathead between them, the best going to Rose at 0.51kg (450mm). Tom Stanfield also caught a couple of Flathead at 0.57kg and 0.53kg on 1kg line.

Steve Bailey picked up a respectable Yellowfin Bream of 0.78kg, and the only Silver Trevally caught at 0.48kg, both on 1kg line.

Shane and Glen Jasprizza caught a couple of nice Striped Tuna on heavy gear. Shane's went 3.50kg, and Glen's was a touch bigger at 4.00kg. The Clark Brothers had a quiet time on the beach compared to their usual efforts, however Colin picked up a masters Salmon of 1.80kg on 2kg line. Glen Malam also picked up a few Masters Salmon off the beach on 1kg line.

Other Captures Brian Stacy recently landed a School Shark of 5.00kg on 6kg line, I haven't spoken to Brian about the capture but it was entered in the Bluewater section so perhaps it was an incidental capture while Bottom Bashing? I'm sure Brian will fill us in on the details at the next meeting. There is a photo of the fish up on the Club Website.

Shane Jasprizza fished the Bermagui Yellowfin Comp with Gary Cairns and managed to catch his first Marlin. It was a Striped Marlin that was estimated at around 100kg. The fish was tagged and released. This capture gets Shane up to 9 captures for his Game fishing Masters.

Mitchell McGovern has been at it again with some great captures to his name, a Tailor of 1.26kg and a Fiddler Ray of 3.34kg off the beach at Potato Point. He also caught another Brown Ray of 3.24kg on 1kg line at Lake Tuross. The McGovern's really have Brown Rays worked out.

Well that's about all for me this month. Time to start thinking about last minute captures to get a few extra points, or maybe start thinking of a game plan for 2010/11. Either way I hope you find the time to get out and wet a line.

CFC at the NSW Government Inquiry into Recreational Fishing

Greg Davis and I travelled to Griffith on 27 May 2010 to appear on behalf of the Canberra Fisherman's Club at the New South Wales Parliamentary Inquiry on Recreational Fishing. This in itself is a pleasing outcome given that Inquiry received over a thousand submissions and, as far as I'm aware, the CFC is the only non-NSW fishing club to be invited to appear before the Inquiry.

The CFC lodged an ambitious 24 page submission containing 19 recommendations. The submission was a collaborative exercise by CFC committee members lasting two weeks. The first week was spent brain storming a range of issues and doing some research while the second week was spent drafting the submission. A list of the 19 recommendations in the submission was published in the March newsletter.

The hearing at Griffith was one of ten hearings scheduled around New South Wales and it was a good opportunity to put forward suggestions for improving the management of NSW fisheries. We used our 45 minutes before the Committee to restate our two main concerns being the need to (1) enhance the inclusiveness and transparency of the consultation and decision making processes to ensure enhanced outcomes for recreational fisheries and ensure that all stakeholders have confidence that those processes are fair and equitable; and (2), the need to establish an independent peak body that is adequately resourced to represent the interests of recreational anglers in New South Wales.

The Committee also asked questions about the CFC participation in the Batemans Marine Park consultation process, what fishing spots were lost through the creation of sanctuary zones, initiatives for improving the safety of rock fishing, the CFC Carp-out and fish stocking activities, better consultation and communication with respect to marine parks, and about the Public Right of Fishing.

The transcript of the hearing is now up on the NSW Parliament website and Greg and I may be asked further questions in writing from the Recreational Fishing Committee. There will be two more public hearings in Sydney on 30 August 2010 and 3 September 2010 and then the Committee will hand down its report on 25 November 2010. It is important to remember that although there are three ALP members on the Committee, it is up to the NSW Government to decide whether to accept the recommendations in the Committee's report. The NSW Government will have six months to respond to the report.

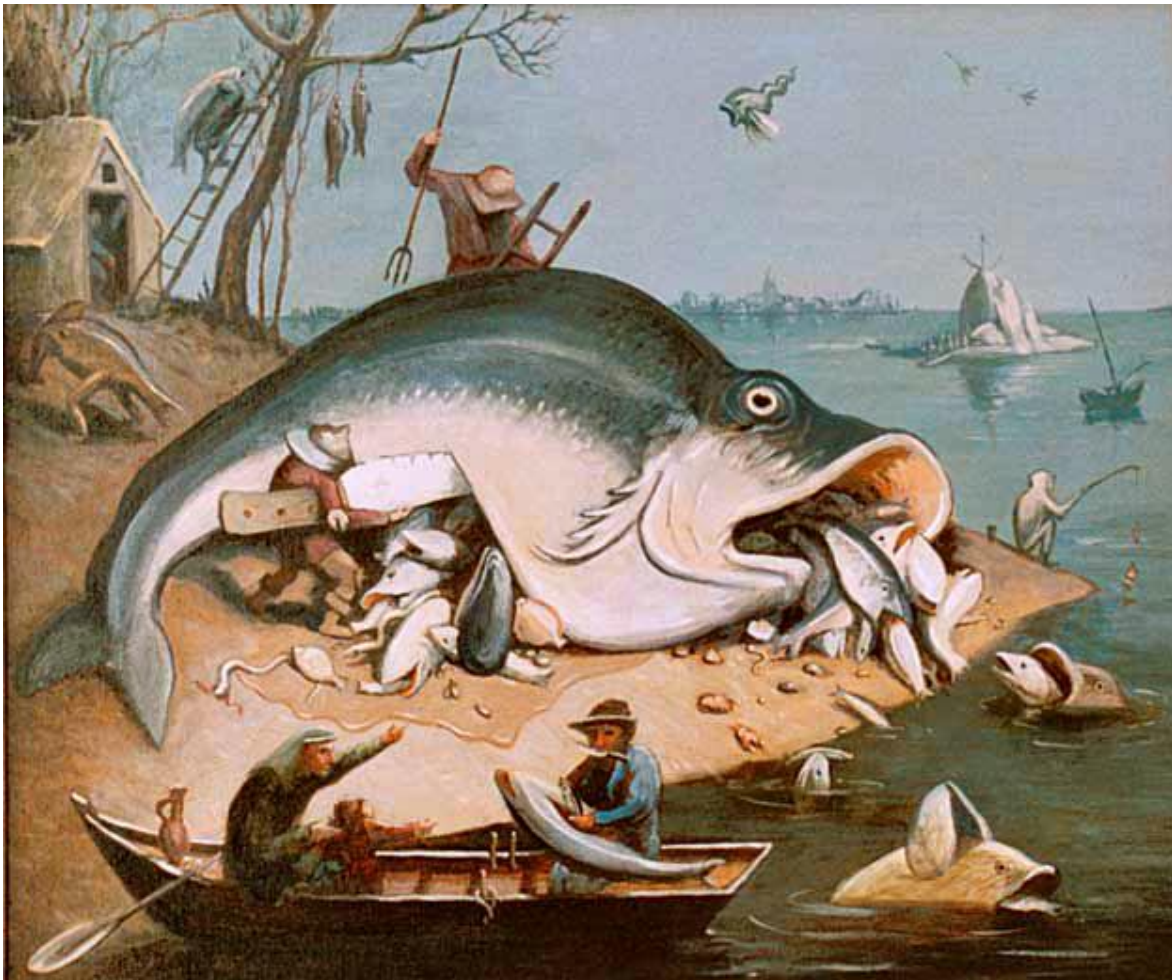

Please note that the attached Application form "Permit for the use of a Power Boat on Canberra's Urban Lakes and Ponds" is the current application form for use of Electric Boats on Canberra's Lakes and Ponds (covering Lakes Tuggeranong and Ginninderra)

No fees apply for this permit.

Fishing is also allowed (but **NOT the use of any type of boat**), at Dunlop Ponds 1 and 2, West Belconnen Pond, Yerrabi Pond and Gungahlin Pond, Point Hut Pond, Gordon Pond, Isabella Pond, Lower Stranger Pond, Upper Stranger Pond and the Tuggeranong Weir.

Non-motorised boating (for fishing or recreation) is allowed on the full length of the Molonglo Reach. If however, you want to access the area from the Reach to the Sylvia Curley Bridge (the area where waterskiing is allowed-you are **required to book time with the water ski booking area on either 6207 9777 or 13 22 81, who will be able to assess if your presence will disturb or cause inconvenience to the skiers**).

Lake Burley Griffin and Scrivener Dam are controlled by the Commonwealth and clients are advised to contact the Water Police on 6245 7393 for further information and/or permits for these areas.

Please destroy any previous ACT "boat permit" application forms that you may have and use only the enclosed application form.

Conditions of use of a Power Boat on Canberra's Urban Lakes and Ponds

General

- (i) the person in charge of the boat is over the age of 16 years and is competent to supervise the operations of the boat;
- (ii) any crew carried in the boat are competent to perform the duties required of them;
- (iii) the driver obeys all reasonable commands of a member of the ACT Water Police boat, Rangers boat or an inspector under the Act;
- (iv) the boat and minimum safety equipment is made available for inspection upon request;
- (v) the approval holder indemnifies the Territory against any claim for damages or expenses incurred through the use of the said boat;

Electric/Steam

- (i) the identification Permit issued with an authority is shown at all times while the boat is in use;
- (ii) the boat is used primarily for recreational purposes;
- (iii) the boat does not exceed 5 knots.

Patrol (Rescue, Research or Special Events)

- (i) the identification Flag issued with this authority is shown at all times while the boat is in use;
- (ii) the boat is used primarily for the purpose the authority is issued under;
- (iii) the boat does not exceed 13 knots except for proceeding to a rescue;
- (iv) the Club/Organisation is responsible for ensuring that the person using the boat hold a current boating licence;
- (v) the number of persons carried, except for rescued persons, shall be at least two or two less than the designed capacity of the boat where the designed capacity exceeds 4 persons.

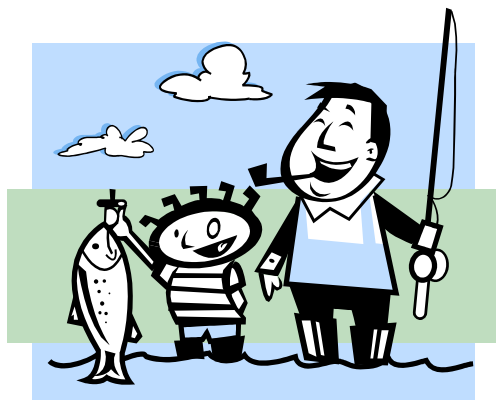

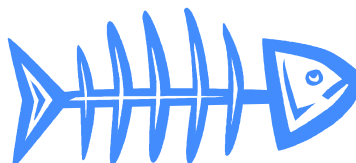
