Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sportfishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

President's Report

Hi all,

Well, what a busy month it has been. We've had the Narooma Convention, The 2010 Carp Out and a Fishing Clinic the day before, and there has been a great deal of work gone into the Inquiry into Recreational Fishing.

On Saturday the 13th March we held a fishing clinic for those that wanted some tips on knots, technique and fishing in general for the Carp Out. There was a great turnout with just under 40 people attending. Admittedly, the clinics are aimed at kids, to get them involved in fishing; however it was great to see some adults enrolled as an introduction to fishing. It looks like fishing is still up there as a pastime, hopefully some will become fanatics like us. We had to turn some away from the day, and there is definite interest for other fishing clinics. Overall the clinic went well and I think all went away with more knowledge and skills than they come with, and had a great time. I think one of the highlights was the fish fighting demonstration. Darren Hossack goes quite well on 4 Kg, although his fast runs don't compare to Tuna! I'd like to thank Pat Brennan for putting the time aside in his busy schedule for the clinic, and thanks to all those members that put the time aside to assist with the clinic.

And what a great success the 2010 Canberra Carp Out was. We were still getting ready on Sunday morning and people were lining up to register. Registration was meant to open at 8:30 am; however we had to start just before 8:00 am, as people were champing at the bit to get fishing. We had just over 1,500 entrants registered before the day, and the final figure of registered entrants was just over 2,000. We were still taking entries at 2:00 pm! Its obvious people were keen to win that boat package. From 8:00 am until around 10:30 am was an absolute blur, with three of us registering people quite a lot of the time. To be honest I didn't even get to see the faces of some of the people I registered, it was head down for a solid 2 ½ hours.



I think the additional preparation this year, with networked laptops in the registration tent assisted in this whole process. At times there were three people just punching in entry information. I'd like to thank Rose Davis, Sally Pinder, Kirstie Head and Lisa Baker for a great effort here. Natalie McKenzie was assisting for a while as well, thanks Nat, and Happy Birthday. At the other end of the day the networked laptops again assisted in getting the data from the two weigh stations into the database.

I won't get involved here with the results of the Carp Out, I leave that up to Chris. I will thank those that assisted on the day, hopefully I won't forget anyone. Thanks to Chris Head, Brian Stacy, Shane Jasprizza, Keith Smith, Jamie Stanfield, Steve Borkowskis, Colin Clarke, Glen Malam, Anthony Heiser, Ben Lemmon, Albert Magassy, Pat Luttrell, Bruce Murray, Gary Cairns and the Tackleworld crew, for assisting with the set-up and the general running of the day. Specific thanks go to Shane for assisting with the registration and admin stuff all day, Jamie and Glen for cooking on the BBQ all day, Steve for sitting in the smelly Carp tent all day, and Albert, Ben, Anthony, Colin, Kirstie, and Rose for long stints in the weigh stations as well. I'd also like to thank Colin Head for monitoring the gate access to Lennox Gardens for us all day. A big thanks goes to Gary and the Tackleworld crew for assisting all day long and manning the drinks stall, with a special mention to Kooka for another sterling effort on the Casting Comp. Last but not least (and I really hope I haven't forgot anyone) is a great big thankyou to Chris Head for all the efforts over the last few months for getting this whole day organised. The day was a fantastic success, and Chris organised the majority of it. Well done mate, and thank you.

At the Carp Out we also drew the Fish Stocking raffle. Congratulations to the winners, Nathan Sibley, Mark Sutti, George Dugandzic. We had some great prizes and the raffle was a great success, The Club raised over

\$2,000 for fish stocking from the raffle. I like to thank Shane Jasprizza for suggesting the raffle and getting it all together. I'd say there is a good chance we'll run another one next year in conjunction with the 2011 Canberra Carp Out.

A few of us have been busy preparing the CFC submission to the Select Committee on Recreational Fishing, which was submitted on the 18th March. I've include the 19 recommendations put forward by the CFC elsewhere in the newsletter so you can see what has been put forward. Thanks to all those who assisted in the preparation of the submission. A special thanks goes to Anthony Heiser for putting in some extraordinarily long hours in the preparation of the submission. **(Summary of Recommendations on last two pages):**

Outings

The Narooma Convention outing was another great outing. It was slightly more expensive than we're used to for that outing due to the type of accommodation we had, but I'm pleased to say that we have an Olympic Cabin booked for 2011. We had a great BBQ on the Sunday night, despite the rain, and there was great interaction between all the members that attended. It was a very enjoyable weekend. Fishing was hard in Wagonga Inlet, however the beaches were reasonable productive. Outside was a bit uncomfortable, however there were some reasonable fish caught. Livies were a bit scarce on some days, so there was heaps of jigging being done. The most productive spot was Corunna Lake, being Flathead heaven that weekend. All the fresh from the recent rain had driven the Flatties down towards the entrance, and there was a large concentration of fish, with a few people bagging out. It was good fun, with several little competitions merging over the weekend. There were some good fish amongst them too, I got one at 55 cm, and Charlie Curtis got one at 62 cm. There were some other notable fish caught over the weekend, a full round up of them should be in Steve's Recorder's report.

The next outing is to Windamere over the ANZAC long weekend, 24th – 26th April. It looks like a few people are heading out earlier to make the most of the weekend. If you're keen to go and get amongst some good Catfish, Silver Perch or Golden Perch, let I or Keith Smith know and we'll include you in the accommodation arrangements.

After that it's off to Jervis Bay for the weekend 15th and 16th May. Hopefully the weather will be a bit kinder to us this year. Last year we got blown of St. Georges Basin. Let Keith or I know if you wish to attend this outing.

Secretary's Report

Hello all members & visitors,

Well all, I have no idea where the last month has gone as the Carp-Out just seemed to be ever consuming and I am sure my partner Natalie would agree. (Nat is glad it is over for another year) But not quite still finalising the financials and statistics from the event, between work and family commitments but hopefully will have the full account by the next meeting.

What can I say but thanks to the insight of Tackle World (our Major Sponsor) and the 2007/2008 Canberra Fisherman's Club committee, the Canberra Carp-Out continues to grow from its foundation in 2008 with entries well exceeding expectations of a few hundred to reach 1411 entrants in its first year.

Now in its third year the Canberra Carp-Out 2010 had many of us hoping we would reach our 2009 entrant number of 1799 and maybe even cracking the 2000 entries. Well once again this event has exceeded our expectations with the total number of registered entrants reaching 2049. This was made up of;

- 960 Adults Male
- 336 Adult Female
- 504 Junior Boys
- 249 Junior Girls

Early Bird entries were a new element this year and at the close of the early bird period on the 5th of March we had received 928 entries a further 572 entries were received in the last week.

As Greg has alluded to, we had people lining up early to register well before our registration opening time of 08:30am. We had 549 people register on the day which really tested out all those who were tasked with registration duties.

Then the focus turned to the weigh station with people starting to line up with captures well before the nominated weight station open time of 10:00am. But we elected to open up and start weighing and the captures just kept on coming in.

A total of **1,420.39kg** of pest fish (European Carp and Redfin) were removed from Lake Burley Griffin:

- **1,574 fish** caught in total (**691 Carp and 883 Redfin**), compared to 1,653 fish caught in 2009 (543 Carp and 1,110 Redfin) and 793 fish in 2008 (336 Carp, 457 Redfin);
- 1,256.62kg of carp caught;
- 163.87kg of Redfin caught;
- Heaviest Carp = 9.39kg, heaviest Redfin = 0.94kg;
- Adults caught 1,175 fish (1,132.65kg) and juniors caught 399 fish (287.74kg).

At the end of the day all the hard work that was put in by our volunteers turned a good family day out into a great day out for all the families, friends and children who strived to catch that elusive fish that could win a prize.

RECORDER/TAGGING OFFICER'S REPORT

Hi All

It has been a hectic start to March with the Narooma Convention from the 5th-8th, the Club Meeting on the 9th, and the Carp Out on the 14th. I think I need a break from all this fishing..... Not!

The Carp Out was a massive success with more than 2000 competitors, over 1200kg of Carp weighed in, some big ones too the best was 9.39kg. I won't go into too much detail as I'm sure we'll have a full report.

Outings

March Outing – Narooma Convention

The Narooma Convention was a 4 day Outing, which included the 3 days of the Convention plus the Canberra Day holiday on the Monday. The 13 Members who attended had plenty of time to catch fish and recorded the following; 39 Dusky Flathead, 14 Yellowfin Bream, 12 Australian Salmon, 9 Tailor, 5 Australian Bonito, 4 Yellowtail Kingfish, 4 Common Shovel nosed Ray, 3 Silver Trevally, 3 Fiddler Ray, 2 Sand Whiting, 2 Slimy Mackerel, 1 Striped Tuna, and 1 Snapper.

Chris and Colin Clark focused on the beaches as per usual and had success once again. Colin took out the Beach Section of the Convention with an Australian Salmon of 2.39kg on 2, a Tailor of 1.62kg on 2, and a Yellowfin Bream of 0.79kg on 2. Chris didn't let the team down with a monster Salmon of 3.23kg on 2. They caught a stack of other fish; Colin landed several Shovel nosed and Fiddler Rays.

Shane Jasprizza and I also had a good session on the beach; we fished from 11pm till 4.30am (either side of a 2am high tide). Shane's best fish included Salmon of 2.07kg and 2.00kg, and a Tailor of 1.81kg. My best fish were a Salmon of 1.56kg and 3.04kg, and Tailor at 1.08kg and 1.28kg. I would have to rate it as one of my most memorable beach fishing sessions.

Charlie, Keith and Albert discovered a flathead hotspot down at Lake Corunna. They caught 50 legal sized Dusky Flathead in 5 hours, plus countless just undersized fish. They were happy to share the location and the next day we had 4-5 Club boats fishing within an area the size of a football field all hauling in fish one after another, you could almost catch as many as you liked. The biggest ones caught (that I can remember) were 65cm by Charlie Curtis and 55cm by Greg Davis. Despite the majority being between 36cm and 42cm it was great fun.

Shane fished a charter on the 'Sherriff' with a bunch of ANSA members from various Clubs. Shane focused on Kingfish and managed to land 4 legal Kings out of 5 landed on the boat. Apparently he was fishing 6kg line and landing fish when others were fishing 3kg and 4kg line and donating them to seals. Most of his fish came on jigs, but levies were also working. They also tagged a bunch of Bonito, Shane accounted for 3 of these.

Darren Hossack and his mate Jamo fished outside and landed 18 Bonito with the best going to Darren at 1.56kg on 2kg line. Apparently there were Bonito everywhere but mostly small ones, Darren tried to come in close to troll up a Salmon but it was tough going trying to get one through the Bonito. They had a bit of a scare on the bar on the way in and didn't venture back out until conditions improved later in the outing when they picked up 4 undersized Kings.

Jamie and Tom Stanfield fished up at Tuross and Tom weighed in a mixed bag of Yellowfin Bream, Dusky Flathead, and Sand Whiting.

Recent Captures

Anthony Heiser has done several day trips to the Coast to fish the Beaches. He has finally taken the plunge and fished 1kg, he has busted off a few times but he did land a Salmon of 0.73kg and a Tailor of 0.26kg. I have a feeling a few Masters Fish from the beach aren't far away.

Anthony also caught another Golden Perch at Googong, his first on lipless crank bait; it weighed 1.43kg (450mm).

Andrew Butt and Kate Johnson spent a couple of weeks down at the coast and fished at Pambula and Tathra. They caught plenty of fish; Andrew's best was a Dusky Flathead of 795mm, while Kate's best was a Black Bream of 1.48kg on 1kg line.

Steve Bailey caught a Yellowfin Tuna of 18.50kg on 37kg line Wide of Ulladulla. He also fished in the Carp Out (don't tell the rat!) and weighed in a couple of Carp the best going 4.91kg on 1kg line.

That's all from me this month; hope to see you all at the next meeting on the 13th of April. The next Outing is at Windamere on the ANZAC long weekend, I can't wait to get up there and chase some of those huge native fish.

Anthony Heiser shares His Mothers Tuna Recipe

Lots of potatoes (with jacket on is ok)
Onion
Salmon
Salt and pepper
Garlic paste
Thai paste or sweet chilli sauce (optional)
Lemon pepper
Bread crumbs
Egg and milk mix
Flour
Oil and butter

Boil the potatoes and mash. Don't overcook the potatoes or mash them to a pulp.
Cook chopped onions on fry pan with oil

Dice the salmon and season with garlic, lemon pepper and Thai seasoning and put in boiling water and take out as soon as it is cooked.
Drain salmon and put in bowl and break up into small pieces with a fork. Then mix with mashed potato and onions and add some bread crumbs so the mixture isn't too sloppy. Add salt and pepper and optional sauces to taste.

When the mixture has cooled down a bit, grab a hand full of mixture, roll into a ball and then flatten.

Coat the rissole in flour, then dunk in egg and milk mix and coat with bread crumbs.

Heat oil in fry pan and add a little butter and heat up the grill. Cook each side of the rissole in the fry pan to get the golden colour. Then place rissoles on tray and place in grill to fully cook it.

I got 10 salmon patties out of this. Mum uses tin tuna when no fresh available.

Summary of Recommendations

The Canberra Fisherman's Club makes the following recommendations to the Select Committee on Recreational Fishing

1. The Canberra Fisherman's Club Inc (CFC) recommends that there be increased consultation and greater transparency in the creation and management of marine parks. To achieve this, it is proposed that the New South Wales Parliament amend the *Marine Parks Act 1997* to require that:
 - (a) The relevant Ministers consult peak bodies representing the interests of recreational anglers before appointing a person to represent those interests on the Marine Park Advisory Council and the marine park advisory committees for each of the marine parks
 - (b) the Marine Park Authority provides greater transparency in the creation of marine parks and development of zoning plans by publishing the details of people consulted and submissions received, publishing a full risk assessment for each marine park and zone to identify threats to management, and by publishing conservation objectives for each Sanctuary Zone with ongoing monitoring and reporting on the effectiveness of those zones
 - (c) The Marine Park Authority publish the minutes of meetings of the Park Advisory Council and the marine park advisory committees for each of the marine parks
 - (d) the Marine Park Authority makes publicly available on its website all research conducted in relation to New South Wales marine parks (including the outcome of scientific evaluation and monitoring research), and
 - (e) the Marine Park Authority publishes an annual report for each marine park outlining, among other things, the activities of the Marine Park Advisory Council and marine park advisory committees for each marine park, public and private consultation undertaken, status reports of fisheries and aquatic life overall and in each of marine park zones, and scientific and other research completed or in progress within the marine parks.
2. Until the Marine Parks Act is amended, the CFC requests members of the Committee to submit questions on notice to the relevant Ministers inquiring about the matters set out in recommendations 1(a) to (e) on an annual basis.
3. The Marine Park Authority should make more use of angler-based research and monitoring, including log-books and tagging programs. The Marine Park Authority should provide incentives to anglers to participate in this research and it should publish the outcomes of this research on its website.

4. The CFC supports research by the Department of Primary Industries to ensure the sustainability of recreational species (including mulloway) and to continue to ensure that its website maintains its informative level of scientific and other evidence concerning the sustainability of fisheries.
5. The CFC recommends that consideration be given to amending the *Fisheries Management Act 1994* and the *Marine Park Act 1997* to expressly state that the provisions of those Acts and the regulations made under them do not extinguish the public right of fishing.
6. The CFC recommends the Advisory Council of Recreational Fishers (ACORF) takes steps to make itself more accessible to recreational anglers by raising its profile through a series of public forums and by hosting a submission form on the DPI website so that issues or concerns can be raised with ACORF.
7. To improve the transparency of the nomination and selection process of ACORF and all other fishing trust and other advisory council positions, the Department of Primary Industries website should publish selection or suitability criteria for the positions, the list of nominations received, and the short list recommended to the Minister.
8. The New South Wales Council of Freshwater Anglers and Australian National Sportfishing Association should be represented on both ACORF and all other fishing trust and other advisory council positions.
9. That ACORF and all other fishing trust and other advisory councils consider ways it can publish the minutes of their meetings on the Department of Primary Industries website in a more timely manner.
10. The New South Wales Government provides ongoing funding to establish an independent peak group or body to represent the interests of recreational anglers.
11. That the New South Wales Government funds an independent study into the social and economic benefits of recreational fishing in New South Wales every five years.
12. That New South Wales Fisheries make additional funding available to enable local fishing clubs to run Kids Clinics in regional areas.
13. That the New South Wales Government considers starting a fishing program to assist kids with drug problems.
14. The New South Wales Government provide an ongoing commitment to the ANSA Angel Ring Program.
15. That there be an increase in the number of Recreational Fishing Havens, and studies be carried out to identify suitable estuaries. Unlike the previous establishments of Recreational Fishing Havens, the CFC would strongly recommend that the Recreational Fishing Trusts are not used in the buy-back of commercial licenses.
16. A new recreational fishing haven should be established between the southernmost boundaries of the Batemans Marine Park to the New South Wales – Victorian Border.
17. That the New South Wales continues the stocking of native fish in dams, impoundments and weirs.
18. The Recreational Fishing Trust and New South Wales Government must commit to future ongoing funding of the Gaden Trout Hatchery.
19. That the New South Wales Government addresses the impact of landbased pollution and the pressures on aquatic environment by development and industrial activities before imposing further restrictions on recreational fishing..
