## *Aims of the Club*

4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing

# **RECORDERS REPORT**

Hi All

As I write this the rain is falling and it seems that is the way it has been for much of October. To go with the rain it has also been quite cold, so that means a lot of members haven't been fishing or have had plans washed out or called off. Hopefully the rain makes a difference to the water levels in some of the major storages, although I feel like we will need a lot more rain to see this happen but any little bit helps.

The October long weekend saw the opening of the trout season but there were very little in the way of reports from our Members at the October meeting. Colin Clark was the only one who reported fishing the rivers, he fished Thredbo and had one hit, and sighted one other fish, and caught a lure. Apparently according to some fly fishers he met on the river bank the fish were there but hard to tempt.

## **Outings**

We haven't had any Outings to report on since the last Newsletter, but we have a couple of Outings coming up before the next meeting:

October Outing – 23<sup>rd</sup>-25<sup>th</sup> October – Talbingo Convention

November Outing – 6<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> November – Burrinjuck Convention

## **Recent Captures**

Brian Stacy and Keith Smith have been down to the South Coast a couple of times and Brian has submitted a few captures for Australian Salmon in the 1.30kg – 1.70kg range. They were caught from the rocks at Nuggan Head and also from Brou Beach.

The Stanfield's had a wash out at Tuross; apparently they managed to get out for a few hours which were enough time for Tom to get a Flounder of 0.34kg on 1kg. The rest of the time was spent indoors.

Still a few Rainbows coming in from the Secret Lake, although I'm not so sure it's that secret anymore. Brian Stacy caught one at 0.86kg on 2kg, Chris Head caught another at 1.11kg on 1kg, and Anthony Heiser lost one trying to land it on 1kg without a net.

I've tried several locations for Golden Perch including Googong and Yerrabi but have so far been unsuccessful, still a bit on the cold side perhaps. Apart from that I've caught a few decent Carp. The best were from Lake Tuggeranong at 7.10kg on 1kg, and 8.78kg on 1kg. Also a few nice ones from the Queanbeyan River at 5.96kg on 2kg, and 6.58kg on 2kg.

That's all from me this month, I'm sure I'll have plenty to report on next month as the weather warms up, hope you get among the fish.

## *Upper Murrumbidgee Demonstration Reach – Tree Planting*

### **18-10-09**

On Sunday, 18 October, two CFC members were among a group of over 30 people to assist with tree planting on a section of the Murrumbidgee River near Tharwa. The planting was part of the on-ground works for the Upper Murrumbidgee Demonstration Reach (UMDR) project (see info below).

Our participation in the planting came about via a request to the Capital Region Fishing Alliance, no more than a few weeks after the formation of the group. Word spreads fast! Other participants came from fishing clubs in the region, as well as local Waterwatch groups. A couple of people even turned up after reading about it on fishing chat boards.

It was pleasing to see a number of people bringing their kids along to get involved as well. Most seemed to enjoy themselves, especially digging up worms and watching a few centipedes that were uncovered. One of the kids even said “this is much more fun than the Playstation”.



Luke Johnston, the coordinator of the UMDR, said there would be further opportunities to get involved in the UMDR project. Hopefully more CFC members can get involved down the track.

#### **About the Upper Murrumbidgee Demonstration Reach**



A demonstration reach is a river rehabilitation project aimed at integrating available techniques and tools to ‘fix’ a stretch of degraded river in a way that:

- a) Makes it a better place for native fish and other plants and animals to live; and
- b) Works with the local community to showcase how effective integrated river management can be.

The UMDR extends along 80km of the Murrumbidgee River between the Bush Heritage Trust Scottsdale properties at Bredbo, downstream to Kambah Pool adjoining the southern suburbs of Canberra.

Throughout the year, a detailed long term plan for the reach will be developed along with on-ground activities. Improving and monitoring river health with riparian restoration, willow removal, fencing, off-stream stock watering points and monitoring after quality will all be undertaken.

An education package and community field days will also help increase understanding and further raise awareness of

river health issues and the aims of the demonstration reach.
