8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing

RECORDERS REPORT

Hi All

A couple of Outings to report on and a bit of a brief look at the fishing options at the Talbingo Convention from my perspective.

August Outing – Buckenderra (Lake Eucumbene)

Eleven Members attended this Outing and despite the cold windy conditions weighed in 25 Rainbows and 3 Browns. The lake was rising rapidly over short green grass due to recent rains and snowmelt so the Rainbows were quite active around the shoreline.

Lemmo accounted for the best two of the three Browns. The best was 1.50kg on 1kg line, and the other at 1.18kg on 1kg line. Apparently they found a submerged gully and trolled along the drop off, the 'traffic light' Tassie did the trick.

Keith Smith caught the best of the Rainbows at 1.29kg on 3kg line; it was taken on Powerbait on the Sunday morning. Keith also had a bit of a mystery when trolling, he pulled in his line to discover he only had the bib left of his McGrath lure, big fish? Snag? Dodgy lure? We'll never know.

Jamie and Tom Stanfield had quite a bit of success on the Rainbows from the bank weighing in 13 between them. Tom caught the biggest of their haul at 1.08kg on 1kg line.

Brian and I managed to find a granite boulder right out in the middle of the lake with Brian's boat; luckily we were only trolling at the time. We landed a few trout trolling deep diving minnows; Brown Trout colours did the trick.

Overall I think the Outing was a real success, the accommodation was comfortable, and the park Manager was friendly and helpful, he left out boom gate keys for those of us arriving late and even helped launch our boats at 6am on Saturday morning.

September Outing – Kalkite (Lake Jindabyne)

Sixteen Members attended the ever popular Kalkite Outing this year, and weighed in a total of 23 Rainbows and 17 Browns.

There were some quality Browns caught this year. Phil Lawrence caught the heaviest at 2.49kg (615mm), Bruce Murray wasn't far behind with 2.35kg, and Dave Walton was next with 2.30kg on 2kg line (600mm), and Chris De La Rue picked one up the day before the Outing at 2.05kg on 1kg line. There were another 9 Browns over the 1kg mark.

Jamie Stanfield caught the heaviest Rainbow which was 1.18kg on 1kg line. Tom and Jamie were fairly quiet by their usual successful standards; apparently they focused on the Eucumbene Arm on the Saturday which didn't pay dividends.

It was fantastic to see Bruce Murray out catching some fish; he landed 2 Browns and 2 Rainbows (including the 2.35kg Brown).

David Stacy caught a Brown of 1.42kg on 1kg line and a Rainbow of 0.76kg on 1kg line.

Anthony Heiser recovered from dropping several fish under the boat to land a Brown of 1.77kg on 1kg line on the troll, and another Brown of 1.00kg on 1kg line from the bank. Anthony also had a big Brown follow up to the boat while he was changing his lure on the troll.

Ben Lemmon, Anthony Heiser and I fished out of Ben's boat and after a few hours of trolling with not too much action we decided to throw some lures at the snags. I've had some success on blades recently so to mix it up a bit I decided to try a blade instead of a plastic. It wasn't long before I was hooked up on a good Brown of 1.45kg which put on a good aerial display at the boat but we still managed to land it. A dozen or so casts later I was on again, this time a Rainbow. After this Ben changed to a MF40 and Anthony to a Cultiva lipless crankbait. After this we probably had a dozen or more hook-ups in the next hours fishing, including a double hook-up - one Brown one Rainbow. Most action came on the MF40's fished as you would a plastic for Flathead. Let it drop and then give it a rip, and repeat the process back to the boat. It takes a bit of speed to get any action

from an MF40 so a slow roll back to the boat wasn't really an option. I was really surprised just how effective this was, it's a fantastic alternative when trolling just isn't producing the goods.

Upcoming Outing – Talbingo Convention

The October Outing is the Talbingo Convention and I would recommend this Outing to anyone. It does fall close to our Convention which probably keeps the numbers down a little but I would encourage you to go if you can, it's great to go to a Convention when you aren't doing all the work. The raffles of an evening are a highlight.

As for the fishing well you have a lot of options, it's hard to sum it all up in a few words but basically you have three dams to fish. Talbingo Dam, Jounama Pondage, and Blowering Dam.

Talbingo is famous for large trout but in recent years at the Convention it has seemed to only produce plenty of small trout, mostly Rainbows in the 400-800g range, and a few medium sized Redfin. A few years back there was a 3kg Brown taken from the far end of the lake. Trolling tigerworms behind cowbells seems to be a very successful method however this poses problems for those fishing light lines. Beware of the wind the lake can be dangerous.

Jounama is probably my favourite lake of the three and in my opinion is highly underrated. It has some quality Brown and Rainbow trout and shouldn't be overlooked. Don't be tempted to keep any of the Murray Cray's in the lake as they're out of season. Also it is landbased only, no boating.

Blowering is a notoriously hard place to fish and is often referred to as 'lake disappointment'; despite this it has some top quality Trout, Redfin, and Golden Perch. It rewards those who put in the time to learn the secrets of the dam (but don't ask me I don't know them!). Don't let me discourage you from fishing there it's a great place to fish and there are some massive specimens in there. I'm sure if you spoke to Ashley Barber he might give you some tips. I did well a few years back jigging Jackals; I caught a big bag of 500-900g Redfin. This is a great option if you're planning to fish the Open Section of the comp, it doesn't take long to work out if the Redfin are active. A lot of the Golden Perch are taken trolling at night, but being early in the season they can be switched on or off given the conditions, some years a lot are caught at the Convention other years almost none. I'm no expert but as a general rule if the weather is cold and miserable I've targeted Trout and if it's like a hot summers day I've targeted Golden and Redfin and that has worked out okay.

Recent Captures

I've been doing plenty of fishing at a 'secret lake' with Chris Head and Anthony Heiser. Recently I've caught Redfin of 1.36kg, 1.48kg, 1.50kg, 1.56kg and 1.90kg. Chris has caught Redfin of 1.22kg and 1.54kg. I've also caught a few Rainbows casting as well at 1.06kg, 1.14kg, and 1.42kg. Chris Caught a Rainbow of 1.55kg just recently. Consider releasing the fish you catch there as it is a small waterway that is receiving ever increasing pressure. Definitely worth a shot if you have a lazy afternoon spare.

Not a lot of other captures to report, I don't recall receiving any capture forms at the last meeting which was a bit of a surprise, hopefully as it warms up we might see a little more action. Good luck over the next month I hope you manage to get out and do some fishing.

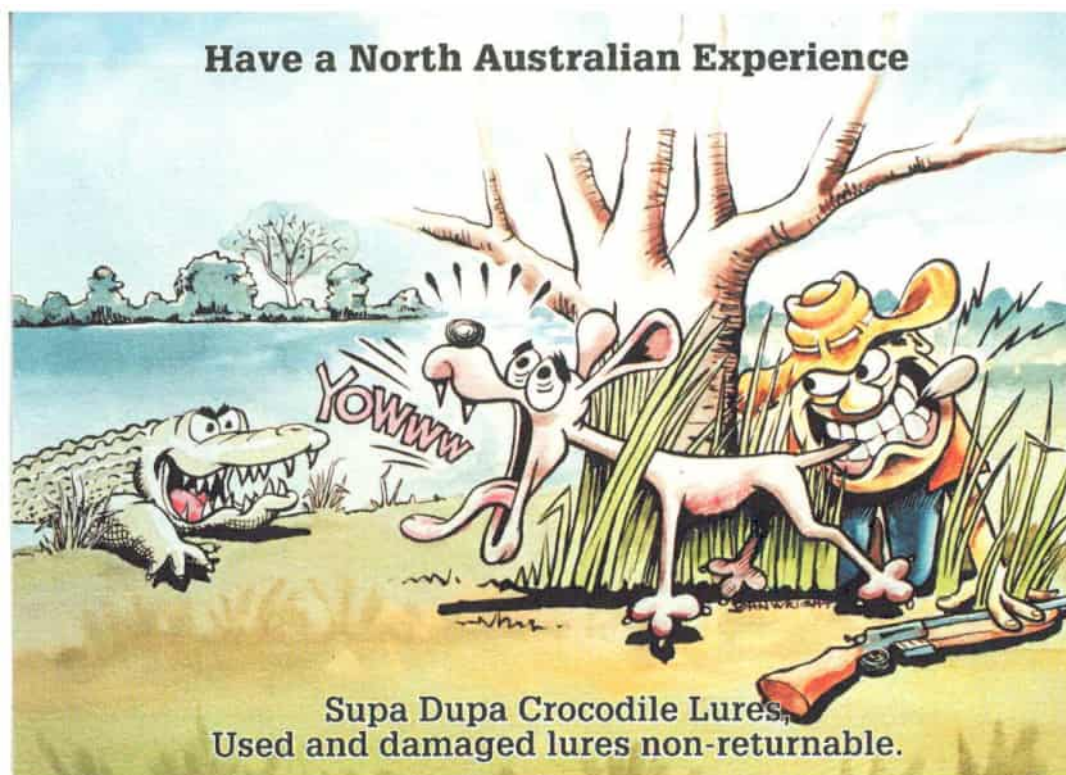

Angler won, Fish won & lesson learnt!

Well this year so far I have only been able to attend the odd outing due to family commitments.

Thankfully Steve Borkowskis introduced me to what our local lake's have to offer in my own backyard which I had not even given it a thought, a body of water or two that are within walking distance if I was to really get motivated and walk instead of drive.

Anyhow at Steve's invitation I spent a number of visits using bait and lures to only watch others catch fish with my netting assistance from time to time. This frustration even made me head off to our major sponsor Tackle World to throw some hard earned cash across the counter for a couple of those Jackals that seemed to be Steve's secrete weapons. Even this did not produce the goods.

Eventually this last weekend while fishing with Steve and Anthony the drought was broken I managed to land a Redfin on a soft plastic only the one though. After a number of lure changes I cracked the code with a deep diving shad and managed to land 4 for the afternoon so I danced around the platform and all of us on this afternoon managed a number of fish.

I was now hooked and have been heading down to the local lake at every chance I can get and sending out an SMS to see if other were available to join me.

This leads me to Sunday afternoon, managed to find some time and sent out the SMS but no takers so headed off down with 1 rod, a box of lure and waders. Decided to try some other lures and settled on a small minnow diver with a green/white body and a red gill plate.

A few casts here and there then just as the lure was about to come out of the water with the lift of the rod, bang the lure was hit hard and headed off towards the reeds with the 1kg pre-test being pulled from the reel. Managed to steer the fish back towards me before it hit the reeds only for it to go head first into another lot of reeds and just stop there, no amount of pulling or angling was moving this fish it was as if it was saying to me what you going to do now buddy. This is where I wished I had one of those extendable net handles that Steve has, would have been so much easier. So here I am trying to hold the rod, wade out to a point that I can net this fish with the water rising with every step in the sludge threatening to go were you don't want it to go and just as I think I am doomed to get wet the fish swims out of the reeds straight into the net Angler won this one a nice 1.54kg redfin.

Now after this bit of fun and the fish weighed, pictured and returned safely and healthily back to the water I start to think of some of the things Patrick Brennan had told us at his presentation on leaders and knots. So I check the leader and sure enough it needed changing. So I change it and make a good knot to my double and away we go again. Another small redfin after a couple of more casts and I think this little lure is a cracker. A few more casts and another big hit and nothing, I mean nothing line is light and limp and as I wind in I realise that the cracker lure is no more. Fish Won, a few choice words and inspect the damage to find that the line had broken at the top of my double.

Now this I did not check when I changed my leader and my mind goes back to what Patrick had said in his presentation about tying a double with a 30 turn bimini-twist and not a spider hitch and check the knot from time to time etc etc etc.
Now I am sitting down as the sun goes down trying to remember the way we were shown to tie the bimini as fish are popping up on the surface, I am sure they are laughing at me.

For those of you who like me need a helping hand on the bimini give the Fishing World website a look <http://www.fishingworld.com.au/news/video-the-bimini-twist> and Patrick will run you through this knot again via a You Tube video. You will find many other knot instructional video's here as well.
