Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

President's Report

Hi all,

Carp-Out

CFC CLUB RECORDERS REPORT

Hi All

Good to see the recent Yellowbelly stocking by the Club into Point Hut Dam and West Belconnen Pond, hopefully Club members and other local anglers will get some benefit from this. There has also been 100,000 Yellowbelly released into Lake Burley Griffin by the NCA in consultation with the CRFA. Good news all around. I'll have to go and fish some of these locations and perhaps remove a few Redfin as a token effort to support these little fingerlings.

Personally I've only caught a few Carp and Redfin locally, a few decent ones here and there but nothing to brag about. Let me know if you're keen to fish locally, weekends or afternoons I'm always interested. It would be good to get a few members together.

Recent Outings

January Outing – Tuross

Well Tuross has come and gone and was fairly popular as it has been in past years, with 14 members attending this year. There was nothing exceptional to report size wise, but some nice 'keepers' were landed.

The Clark brothers focused on the beach as they always do, they caught Bream to 0.55kg, Salmon in the 1.5-2kg range, a couple of Tailor around 600g, and a 3.60kg Shovelnose ray. All on 2kg line.

Glen Malam did well on the Flathead in the lake, with 6 fish from 0.39kg to 0.73kg. Glen has a reputation of being the man when it comes to Whiting at Tuross, this time he caught heaps again but all just undersize.

Tom Stanfield caught a good mixed bag of Flathead to 0.58kg, a couple of legal Whiting and a small Tailor.

Chris Lemmon did well with a Salmon of 1.70kg on 1, a Shovelnose of 1.49kg on 1, a Yelloweye Mullet, and a 40cm Flathead.

A lot of other members picked up a Flathead or two around the 40cm mark.

Other Captures

Heaps of captures have come in over the last month, and I apologies in advance if you don't get a mention!

The Clark Bros fished Brou for Salmon of 1.21kg, 1.33kg, and 1.47kg, all on 2kg line.

I think Brian Stacy was fishing every second day down the South Coast and in different locations. I will quickly highlight some of his better captures. Salmon of 1.88kg, Flathead up to 0.84kg, a 0.48kg Whiting, and a Snapper of 1.20kg at Durras. Bream of 0.47kg, and countless Flathead up to 0.53kg in the Clyde (from his Hobie no doubt), and stack of Sand Flathead around 40cm off Moruya.

Dave and Kyle Walton fished Burrinjuck and Kyle caught some great fish including a 68cm Murray Cod! He also caught a 32cm Yellowbelly, and a Redfin. Awesome fishing Kyle!

Mitchell McGovern caught STACKS of Dusky Flathead at Tuross. I think I went cross-eyed entering them all into the database. He is now well out in front of the Flathead Length Comp. The best Flatties were 1.79kg on 1kg line (64cm), and 1.08kg on 1kg line (550cm). Well done to Mitchell that will take some chasing down!

Looking Forward we have the Bega Brogo this weekend, and the Narooma Convention and Carp-Out are just around the corner. So there is plenty going on in the Club at the moment if you want to get involved.

That's all from me this month, good luck if you are heading out for a fish.

The Bega Brogo Tathra Outing, 18-20 February 2011

The CFC's February Outing was a low key weekend this year with only eight people attending (Keith Smith, Dave Walton, Steve Bailey, Jamie and Tom Stanfield, Andrew Butt, Kate Johnson, and I) and only five captures being recorded. Unfortunately, this outing will probably be remembered more for the write off of Keith's 4WD and boat rather than the fishing. However, I still found lots to enjoy at the outing and hope that the CFC returns to Tathra for future outings.

We stayed at the Tathra Beach Motor Village next to the beach and among bellbirds and yellow-tailed black cockatoos. Keith arrived early on Friday to fish off the bank without success (he avoided putting the boat on the water due to the inclement weather and strong winds). Dave Walton and Steve Bailey collected live yakkas off Tathra wharf and then fished the Bega River for Jew fish until the wee hours of the morning. They both got some hits and one bust off.

Keith and I decided to fish Lake Wapengo on Saturday morning as it would offer some protection from the forecasted windy weather. We left at 5.20 am and proceeded north along Tathra Bermagui Road. There was some slight drizzle and mild patches of fog as we drove through Mogareeka. Four and a half kilometres from the Tathra Beach Motor Inn, we slowed down to 30-35 km/hr as we approached a rather benign looking bend in the road. Unfortunately, it was not until we were on the corner that it became apparent that the corner was in fact an u-bend. A combination of poor visibility, inadequate signage, and wet road meant that we misjudged the corner causing Keith's Toyota Prado to veer off the road and into a tree on the embankment.

Fortunately, the tree prevented us from rolling down the embankment and we both managed to walk away from the accident. The locals who drove past and offered their assistance all remarked that the corner was notorious for accidents and that a driver was injured on the same corner a week earlier. Jamie came over immediately to help Keith and I salvage our gear from the car and boat while the police, rural fire service and tow truck operator arrived from Bega shortly afterwards. Not only did they arrive promptly but they did a rather impressive job getting the boat and trailer off the embankment and managing the traffic.

We returned back to the motor village around 11.00 am. After lunch, Jamie and Tom launched their boat in the Bega River and caught about 20 poddy mullet and then went flathead fishing. They had most of their livies taken by octopi, as did Andrew Butt and Kate Johnson who were also chasing flatties in the Bega River. However, those eight legged critters did not get all the livies. Tom caught two dusky flathead weighing 0.95 kg and 0.65 kg while Jamie landed a 0.60 kg flathead.

I bank fished off the Bega River with soft plastics without success. I had one hit from a bream and had some follows by what looked like undersized tailor.

Keith and I then fished the beach at the mouth of the Bega River until 4.30 pm. We seemed to have found a school of bait thieves and I somehow managed to catch a toad fish that was not much bigger than the hook. After dinner, I returned to the beach and landed a 1.88 kg salmon. Dave and Steve again targeted Jew fish on Saturday night. However, this time they did not get any bites and returned empty handed.

Jamie, Tom and I returned to the Bega River on Sunday morning to spin soft plastics on the sand flats as the tide came in. I landed my first flattie on soft plastic since the Tuross Outing last year. Jamie sight casted a sting ray resulting in an epic battle on 1 kg pretest line. Jamie managed to get the sting ray into shallower water and I then used the landing net to shepherd the ray towards the beach. The plan worked well but by the time it was in ankle deep water, the ray worked out what we were doing and took off into the deeper water. Jamie and I finally caught up with the stingray which had glued itself onto the bottom. Jamie grabbed the leader to lift it but the ray spat the soft plastic and was never seen again.

This was my first ever attendance at a February outing as it is usually wedged within a couple of weeks between the Tuross outing in January and the Narooma Convention in March, making it the poor cousin of the salt water outings. Notwithstanding the poor captures and the accident, it was an enjoyable outing and I am keen to return to Tathra for future outings. Next time, I would like to fish off the wharf as I heard reports of salmon, bonito and kingfish being caught there on the weekend.

Finally, I want to express my gratitude to the deckhand who was on his way to Bermagui for work but drove Keith and I back to the Tathra Beach Motor Village after our accident and to Jamie who gave up his morning fishing with Tom to help us salvage our gear from the Prado and boat.
