- 6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities**
- 7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish**
- 8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat**
- 9. Using established roads and tracks**
- 10. Reporting environmental damage**
- 11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats**
- 12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters**
- 13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land**
- 14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.**

I recently had an opportunity to visit Ottawa, Canada. I was looking forward to seeing the place as summer approached and possibly dropping a line, as the days there are fairly long over summer. Unfortunately the weather was against me, so I didn't get to go fishing. On my way home from work meetings one evening I did see one keen fisherman removing a small fish from his line on the bank of the Rideau Canal. Not sure what fish are actually in the canal that goes through Ottawa. It's a manmade canal and they drain it to nearly empty in autumn and people ice skate on it during winter. What I did do while I was there was buy a new camera, so I'm keen to get out there and try out my new camera and update the picture at the end of my article.

### **Final Carp-Out Figures**

At the May committee meeting we finalised the Carp-Out figures. Even though there were significantly less people in attendance, the event was still a great success. We made a profit of \$6,536.49, which is fairly good considering the attendance and the increase in costs to run the event. The committee decided that we could boost this figure slightly using some additional funds in the account not linked to the Carp-Out, and a small donation from the Club. So that means we'll be making a donation of \$4000 to the ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group. Once again, I'd like to thank Chris Head for all the effort he put into this year's event, and also everyone else who put in a great effort on March 20.

### **By-Laws Review**

As I mentioned last month, the committee, well Anthony mainly, were undertaking a review of the Club By-Laws. We finalised this at the May Committee meeting, and the revised By-Laws will be available on the website in the very near future (Possibly already there by the time you read this)

We've changed the species for the Total Length Awards. Next year the species are Trout (All) in freshwater and Aust. Salmon in the salt. These species will definitely keep the recorder busy, but provides you guys with a change of scenery to win the awards.

There are several other changes, mainly clarifying things and the removal of things that we no longer need. One other change of note is that the By-Laws now refer to ANSA rules, which includes the use of Pre-test line, including its use as a break-away when using Braid.

Later in the day Jamie and Tom returned from downstream, and they'd managed some good fish using live poddy mullet. ## New Sponsor



Let me introduce Adam Samios. He is a 26 year old fishing enthusiast and now a member of the Canberra Fisherman's Club.

Adam has been fishing since 3 years old. He was introduced to the sport by his uncle Nick, who was part of the crew of one of NSW most successful game fishing boats. It holds 3 Southern zone NSW records and the first marlin tagged/released in Batemans Bay.

Fishing has been very important in Adams life, both serious and recreational. In the last 5 years he's been involved in schools and charters run from his parent's garage. Adam has run over 138 classes and been on 73 trips away with clients.

In February 2009, fishing late one night on Lake Ginninderra in Canberra, Adam unofficially broke the world 4lb, 6lb and 8lb record for Murray Cod. The fish weighed approximately 21kg on a 4lb breaking strain line.

This milestone opened a door to do weekly reports on Prime T.V network. The first campaign finished in late December, 2010, and the response has been fantastic. Now, more than half way through campaign two which is running for 20 weeks, the demand is

growing. Adam is currently putting together campaign number three, which is looking at kicking off around the beginning of July, 2011.

Adam has kindly offered to display the Canberra Fisherman's Club logo in his reports, in return for the Club and its members supplying information and photo's on how the fishing in general has been when they have been out and about. Adams reports cover the local and the NSW coastal scenes. I have recently supplied some information based around fishing in St Georges Basin, which was used in a recent fishing report by Adam.

So don't be shy - we don't want you to give away you secret fishing spot, but just drop us a few lines on how the fishing was when you were out. Send in photos of your catch if you want it on TV and we will pass this onto Adam, as well as use it in the club newsletter.

### IFish

For those of you that might be interested the IFish episode to be aired on Sunday 12th June at around midday on channel 10, will be about fishing St Georges Basin and feature no other than our mate Ian Phillips or Big E as many of us know him by. Unfortunately or should it be fortunately we have a fishing outing down at Narooma that weekend so some of you might want to set the recorder to capture this for you.

### Minn Kota foot pedal

As a few of you may be aware I have been having some troubles with my bow mount Minn Kota for a while with intermittently losing power and stopping. I would turn left and right no problems but would not power up or would but then stop start whenever it was the most inconvenient. So out at Googong a few weeks ago it finally stopped for good, no power to the prop just as we were starting out. So it was a very slow day running around on the 30lb tiller mount Minn Kota for the day.

Anyhow with a bit of research on the web I found a manual and a wiring diagram of the Minn Kota Power drive 1991 model and so proceeded to pull the pedal and controls apart. Tested the motor all good so that was a relief, power to everywhere was fine, eventually I tracked the fault down to the speed adjustment pot on the pedal with the resistance above 500ohms the motor would not run. So off to the electronics shop for a 1Kohm trim pot and with some clippers and a soldering iron proceeded to replace the original slide speed control with a dial speed control. With a minor false start we eventually got it all wired up and tested it out and worked faultlessly. So once proved that it worked I fitted it to the foot pedal permanently and attached a large dial to the shaft which still enables me to adjust the motor speed with my foot while fishing. So for about \$20 I now have a fully function Minn Kota again and thank goodness. Picture below shows what the finished product looks like.

## Googong Glory

**Googong** is a tough place to fish. We all know it's full of yellas and best of all big cod but striking it right is a tough ask and does require big hours on the water. To be honest I'm not a fan of the place. Admittedly I have probably fished the place 10 times at most and never set the world on fire, generally catching one or 2 yellas a trip, hence why I as well as others know it better as 'Nogong'!

The Friday night of the last weekend of May, Roman Dicoski gave me a call and said he needed a passenger, why not I thought, my time must be up, I've paid my dues, and maybe I will get lucky.

Turning off the Old Cooma Rd and taking the Googong Dam road I remember thinking I'm excited about getting out for a fish, just not excited about where I'm heading "Nogong". The frost could not have been heavier. It tipped minus 4 just 2 hours earlier, and to think I'm chasing cod is crazy, maybe I should have kept driving to Eucumbene and chase trout.

It was a once off I beat Roman to the ramp but once he arrived he had his boat set-up, cameras and all set up with military precision in no time. Soon his high powered Torqueedo electric was buzzing away and off we set to where he caught a 100cm model just a week earlier. Once we started firing our spinnerbaits between all the flooded shrubs, I realized how bloody cold it was. We have all been there before, when that light fog slowly lifts and there's that light breeze blowing. Half a dozen casts into it I couldn't take it any more, my hands refused to function, I was experiencing that cold burning feeling. I pulled out my gloves and to my horror the inners were damp! All I could do was just waiting for that sun to warm up, and that's usually when winter natives usually bite from 11am to 3 pm.

I have only been out to Googong twice this season since it filled and it has changed remarkably. Gone are all those lush thick weed beds replaced by a dense shoreline of thick shrubs. To most the banks all look the same which makes finding a likely location for success very tough. You really have to look for something that little different. Fortunately I had a good guide Roman. No one has fished this place as often as Roman for the last 5 years and he has caught plenty of big fish here. Early up we fished a bank that was once a rock wall but the only sign to give this away was that there was only a shrub exposed every few meters instead of the usual thick masses. After our first pass I said this is where I want to fish when the sun warms up. It was then he told me this was where he caught a 108cm cod 2weeks back, even better.

It was around 12 when we were back there on this bank again. Half way along the bank in autopilot slow rolling my Bassman Spinnerbait back, it was not far from the boat when it was crunched. It proceeded to turn like only a big cod can and I was left feeling helpless as it powered away with the drag crackling. Tough one, hold on or let that drag do its thing? I lightly feathered the drag with my thumb then I said 'think I've got a good one mate!' I have caught a few big cod before and I knew exactly what was going on. Roman wasted no time and he was capturing it all with that camera rolling. The cod pulled Romans boat very close to the bank before I yelled get this boat out of here so he promptly moved us away from those shrubs into the deep. It was then we got a good

look at him as he swam just below the surface straight past the boat. Wow what a horse! It was a priceless moment one of those times when that image just stays with you for years. We got awesome footage here on camera, big cod slowly swimming past with the spinnerbait clearly visible in the corner of its mouth and that blade spinning away.

This cod was a fighter. Big cod are strange creatures, most go crazy yet I have seen a few giants do bugger all. At another stage Roman made mention how much it was pulling the boat around.

After a torrid fight we slid this beauty into the net. It's not till you lift them you realize how heavy they are. We slid him onto the brag mat where he measured 110cm. We conservatively estimated him to be 60lb. Not bad for my 1st Googong cod! We took a few photos but best of all it was all captured with the camera rolling including that all important strike.

As you could imagine I was soon experiencing adrenaline pumping through my body to the max and it lasted for the rest of the day, come to think of it I think I'm still getting that natural high now!

Googong love it or hate it, we are lucky to have it on our doorstep. I think it will always be a love hate kinda dam but I'm slowly coming around, maybe it's not such a bad place after all.

# *Summary of Changers to the Canberra Fisherman's Club Bylaws As of 1st July 2011*

- The By-laws have been renumbered numerically and a table of contents have been inserted.
- Duties of office bearers and committee members have been updated.
- By-laws covering outings are now contained in Part B of the By-laws.
- By-law 7 puts in writing existing arrangements for arranging accommodation at outings and gives guidance to the Outings Officer about how to calculate everyone's accommodation costs.
- The species for the Total Length Awards can now be changed without changing the By-laws. If the Club wants to change the total length award species, then the Committee can do this by publishing the new species 28 days prior to the Commencement of the new Club year.
- The rules on Club Records are now set out in By-law 19. It was previously set out as part of the Recorder's duties in the old By-laws. The minimum ANSA point scores still apply. However, it is recognized that some old Club records do not meet the minimum ANSA point score requirements. Therefore, an exception to the minimum point score requirement will continue to be applied where a capture beats the ANSA point score of an existing Club record.
- Part D of the By-laws on safety have been updated and Members should familiarize themselves with the new safety by-laws.
- Members attending outings are encouraged not to fish by themselves, especially off ocean rocks and in blue water. The Outings Attendance Book will be redesigned to encourage members to keep the Outings Officer and Safety Officer informed of their movements at outings.
- By-law 25 sets covers breaches of safety by-laws to encourage Members to not put their own safety at risk at Club outings.
