About the Club

General meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month at the **Eastlakes Football Club No 3 Oxley St Griffith ACT** beginning at 7:30pm. All members and visitors are most welcome.

Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing

Secretary's Report

Hello all members & visitors,

The days have been short and the cold has really settled in such is the Canberra winter; this means we have less time to fish. However for the keen fisho, there is always monthly club outings to attend and during the last general meeting, the club decided on next year's club outings so keep an eye out on our website for the latest updates.

Lake Burley Griffin Closure

Lake Burley Griffin is closed to activities that involve whole-body water contact or submersion of the head due to extreme levels of blue-green algae. The National Capital Authority Water quality results received today indicate blue-green algae levels are more than 1000 times higher than the level considered safe for activities such as swimming.

More worryingly, this is a very different strain of blue-green algae from the one we typically experience over the summer months. Pet owners should also not allow their pets to swim or drink from the lake. I will keep everyone up to date on the condition of the lake as soon as I get an update from the NCA.

Membership Renewal

Membership for 2012/2013 is due in July; although I know some members are keen to pay up before then so they have one less thing to worry about in the coming months. Membership can be renewed by posting a membership renewal form (available on our website) with payment to the club's mailbox PO Box 325, Civic Square ACT 2608 or paying in person during our June (12th) and July (10th) club meetings.

Nominations for Executive Roles

Our AGM is 14th August this year and all the executive positions will be open for application from any member who wants to be more involved with the club and want to guide the direction of the club. It will be good to see some new faces on the committee and bring some new ideas on how we can run this club even better.

Recorder's Report

Well, we're down to the last month of the Club Championship, so following tradition there will be no update to the competition in this newsletter.

But expect plenty of changes as there have been some great captures over the past month.

First up, Mitchell and Kelsey McGovern caught some great trout at Jindabyne in late April, followed up by some horse golden perch and eel tailed catfish for Mitchell at Windamere.

Karen and I headed up to South West Rocks at the start of May looking for spotted mackerel – didn't catch any mackerel, but caught a 13kg longtail tuna on a 6kg mackerel rig.

Back at Eucumbene, Anthony managed a masters rainbow trout the weekend before the Kalkite outing, and followed it up with a masters brown trout at the outing. Everyone that attended the Kalkite outing caught fish – mainly browns and rainbows, but there was a remarkable 5 brook trout captures for the weekend. The catch of the weekend was undoubtedly Karen's 1.71kg brook trout (the forms are currently being finalised for a National Record claim).

A handful of members attended the Canberra Gamefishing Club's Bermagui Yellowfin Tournament this year, and while they didn't return with any trophies, Chris and Brian managed to return with a couple of large albacore.

Looking to next year, the Committee has reviewed the Length-based Championship and have decided that for the 2012-13 competition, the target species will be Bream (saltwater only) and Carp.

On a final note, about a week ago the NSW Government listed Great Hammerhead Sharks as Vulnerable species and Scalloped Hammerhead Sharks as Endangered species. Both have been declared totally protected. The other species of hammerhead found in NSW waters is called the Smooth Hammerhead Shark; it is much more common and is still an eligible species. The Smooth Hammerhead has virtually no scalloping to the leading edge of their heads, while the other two do – the most important characteristic is that both the Great and Scalloped Hammerhead have a clear notch in the middle of their hammers, while the Smooth is well, ... smooth!

Keep safe on the water and keep the capture forms rolling in.

While Anthony's and Steve's bait fishing efforts were an epic fail, Karen Malam had spectacular results, landing a 1.71 kg brook trout and placing her in contention for a national record.

Those who went trolling fared better with around four to six fish being landed per boat including several kilo plus fish, with Bruce catching the most fish (four including a couple of kilo plus fish) and the best result being a Brown Trout of 1.52kg caught by Anthony Heiser on a Rapala Minnow.

Further trolling and lure changes failed to raise anymore fish and at one stage Brian's comment of "have not been this far out in my boat, hope the wind does not come up or it will be a long bumpy ride home".

Fortunately the wind

stayed down as we estimate we were at one stage about 45km out to sea.



Sunday and Monday the wind came up a bit so did not venture out as far as we did on the Saturday. Unfortunately no more fish came our way for the event. We all had a great time and congratulations to the Canberra Game Fishing Club www.canberragamefishing.com for a well run event. Looking forward to 18th - 20th May 2013 for the next event.

The weather last Saturday was bad. Only one boat ventured out from the BWSP boat ramp. A few brave souls fished from the bank. Thus there were very few fishing reports over the weekend.

Murray Cod: Sunday saw a drastic improvement in the weather. There were no reports of Cod captures from any of the park visitors. I managed a trip out for an hour on Sunday afternoon. I started with some casting around Cave Island with no luck. The wind picked up so I headed into the mouth of the Bidgee for a troll. I was given a couple of Harro's Clip & Catch to sample. The lure consists of a double spinner bait blade set up. A lure of your choice is then clipped on behind the spinning blades. I chose a green TN60 Jackall. I began trolling on the shaded side of the river for about 10minutes and soon decided that the sunny side looked more inviting, just as I was about to wind in, a nice 55cm cod hit the Jackall. I was trolling in 3 metres of water using brass blades.

Yellow Belly: Very few reports. Some fish were picked up from the bank using worms. The shrimp are getting harder to catch with the dropping water temps The yellow belly have been very sluggish this week even for the bait fishermen. I managed to pick up 1 fish trolling the Harro,s clip & catch with a Stuccky in tow on the sunny side of the Bidgee River. Unfortunately I managed to snag up and loose both of the lures before picking up any more fish.

Redfin: Very quiet

Trout: No reports yet but hopefully won't be long.

Park News: Plenty of accommodation available over the cooler months for anyone looking to get back to nature and a quiet weekend getaway. The days have been beautiful with clear blue sky's and no wind.

CHANGES TO ANSA NSW GAMEFISH TAGGING

SALMON AND BARRCOUTA REMOVED FROM TAGGING LIST AND WAHOO NOW WORTH 50 POINTS EACH

ANSA NSW has been an enthusiastic and passionate supporter of the NSW DII Fisheries Gamefish Tagging Program; we have continually modified the program to dovetail with our principles and motto, 'sport, conservation and integrity'. We have also worked closely with NSW DII to evolve the ANSA NSW Tagging Species List to complement the research requirements that the program is based upon.

Our tagging species list adopts 97% of the program, with the only species being abandoned being the few that have a very minor chance of appearing in our State waters.

These changes will come into effect as at 1st July 2012 and will be the new regulations for the 12 month competition which started on 1 July 2012.

Salmon and Barracouta have been removed from the listing and the Wahoo points have now become 50 per fish.

A revised tagging list has been attached for your records.
