General meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month at the **Eastlakes Football Club No 3 Oxley St Griffith ACT** beginning at 7:30pm. All members and visitors are most welcome.

Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing

I spoke with Andrew McGovern briefly at the Narooma outing, and he's agreed to do a beach fishing presentation soon. He's about to go, or is currently overseas on a fishing adventure, so once he's returned from that we'll lock in a date and let you know. Andrew is a great presenter, so I'm looking forward to this event.

AGM and Committee Positions

If you've been considering a position on the Committee, or even an Executive position, time is running out. According to the Constitution, written nominations for Committee positions must be received by the Public Officer (Zane) twenty-eight days prior to the AGM. The AGM is on the 14th August, so you have just over 2 weeks to get your nominations in. If you put in a written nomination, you're almost certain to get a position on the Committee, so if you're keen, fill out the nomination form at the end of the newsletter.

My Recent Adventures

As I mentioned above, I've been on a break down the coast. It wasn't a fishing holiday, but I did manage a few fishing sessions.

The Monday afternoon after the Narooma outing, I managed a couple of hours out with Brian Stacy in his new boat. We intended to go to Durras and chase some Snapper; however time was against us, so we went to Lilli Pilli instead, and tried for some Snapper there. We couldn't get our baits past the Slimy Mackerel, they were everywhere. I tried a 3 hook Paternoster rig with plastic squid on it, to try and get past the Slimies, but they ate that as well. On two occasions I had hook-ups on both my rods, resulting in 4 large Slimies in the boat each time.

We didn't get any Snapper, however we did manage a nice Bonito each. It was a very good session to finish the weekend. Rose and I had one session on the Clyde while we were at the Bay, but didn't have any luck.....





Rose thought she'd check out the Moruya River to see what all the fuss about dirty water was about from a bird's eye view.... There was definitely a lot of dirty water pushing out to sea. She thoroughly enjoyed her little adventure, and recommends the guys from SkyDive OZ at Moruya.

We spent some time around Jervis Bay as well, and had a great day on St Georges Basin. As we headed out, it was fairly windy, with westerly winds 15 – 30 Km/hr, and expected to get up to 40 Km/hr. I've fished St Georges Basin in 30 – 40 Km/hr winds previously, and it's not pleasant. It was disappointing as it was a beautiful clear day, not a cloud in the sky.

We found a spot out of the wind for a couple of hours, and the wind died down instead of increasing. This allowed us to do some exploring... I had recently downloaded the "Navionics Marine: Australia and New Zealand" application for my iPhone. Brian Stacy told me about it; it has all the marine parks marked out in it. I was surprised to see that it also had the artificial reefs at Sanctuary Point marked on it. I was even more surprised when I used my iPhone to navigate to one of these reefs and actually saw it on my Lowrance Sounder! A very good app, highly recommend it. We didn't catch much, a nice Bream and an undersized (just) Flathead, but we had a great day, thanks to the weather turning nice.



Recent and Future Outings

The Narooma outing was great, Rose and I thoroughly enjoyed our time there. The fishing was hard. Keith and I managed a few on the Saturday at Lake Mummaga, but unfortunately Rose and I couldn't manage the same on the Sunday. We only managed an undersized Flathead each. Karen Malam showed Glen how to fish 1080 beach on Saturday, getting a bumper Salmon just before they called it a day! Those that caught fish over the weekend worked for them, however I think everyone had a great weekend.

The July outing is to Kioloa/Ulladulla on the 21st and 22nd, where we'll be staying at Wairo Beach. Depending on the weather, there is a chance to chase some Kingies out of Ulladulla, some Salmon off Wairo Beach itself, or maybe some Flathead or Bream in Burrill Lake. It's a bit of a smorgasbord really!

August is Buckenderra on the 18th and 19th. I'm looking forward to this outing, as I missed it last year. And then in September it's back to Kalkite. Hopefully, work will not get in the way this year, I enjoy the Kalkite outing.

Kioloa/Ulladulla

Membership Renewal

Presentation night this year has been booked for Saturday, 22nd September at Eastlakes Football Club, please keep this date free as can promise you it will be a great night for all as we hand out the year's competition awards and recollect some fine moments from this year.

Recorder's Report

Well that's it. The annual Club Competition is pretty much over and I'll soon be getting trophies engraved. The winners will be announced at the CFC Presentation Night in September.

Sticking with tradition, there will be no summary of the current Championship standings in this final report for the year, so I've put together a brief summary of how the Club competitions work:

The CFC runs three types of competitions each year:

1. A **line class** competition using the ANSA points calculation method (weight of the fish in kg X fighting factor for the species caught (see ANSA Rule Book) X 100 / breaking strain of the line used)
2. A **length-based** competition that is cumulative over the year for two target species (next year they are bream in saltwater and carp in fresh)
3. A **count** of the number of fish caught at scheduled Club outings (called the "All Tackle" Championship).

Line class

This includes the Club Championships (Overall Club Champion, Freshwater Club Champion, Saltwater Club Champion, Land-based Club Champion, Ladies Club Champion and Junior Club Champion); the Highest Point scoring Fish awards (Best Fish Blue Water, Best Fish from the Rocks, Best Fish from the Beach, Best Fish Estuary, Best Fish Freshwater, and Best Shark or Ray) and the Most Versatile Angler Championship.

The Club Championship trophies are awarded to the angler with the highest aggregate ANSA point-score accumulated over the fishing year (1 July to 30 June). Points are awarded for the highest point-scoring fish of each ANSA eligible species caught within ACT and NSW. Captures must be a minimum 25 ANSA points to be eligible (except for junior members, who have no minimum) and anglers must have attended at least two Club outings throughout the year.

The Highest Point scoring Fish ("Best Fish") awards are awarded to the angler who captures the individual highest point-scoring fish (ANSA points) in each category.

The Most Versatile Angler Championship is awarded to the member that has accrued the highest Most Versatile Angler (MVA) over the fishing year. MVA points are awarded for the highest ANSA point-scoring fish of each eligible species, across each ANSA division and each "Best Fish" section. Fish scoring from 50 ANSA points to 100 ANSA points gain 1 MVA point; fish scoring 100 ANSA points or more gain 2 MVA points.

Length-based

Two length-based trophies are awarded each year for the highest cumulative length of species captured; one a saltwater species and one a fresh. For the 2012-13 Championship year, the target species are Bream (saltwater) and Carp (freshwater).

Count

The All Tackle Championship is restricted to fish captured at Club Outings. Points are accrued over the fishing year, where 1 All Tackle point is awarded per fish caught at a Club outing,

with a maximum of two captures per species. One bonus point will be awarded for attending an outing.

How to enter a capture in the competitions

1. To be included in the various competitions you must complete a "Notification of Capture" form and get it to the Recorder within 30 days of the capture (less if the capture is between 14 and 30 June – all forms must be with the Recorder by 14 July at the latest). The only exception to this requirement is if the capture is at a Club outing:
 - a. When a Club outing is to an ANSA Convention the Recorder will get the capture information from the host club.
 - b. At a regular Club outing, captures should be recorded in the Outings Book if you want them to count towards the All Tackle Championship (NOTE: if for some reason the Outings Book is not available at the Club Outing and you want your captures to count towards the All Tackle Championship, complete a Notification of Capture form and hand it to the Recorder or a Committee member by the end of the next Club meeting).
2. To be eligible for the Club Championship trophies, anglers must attend at least two scheduled Club outings during the fishing year. You are deemed to have attended an outing when you sign the Outings Book, which will be available for the duration of the outing (outings usually start at midnight on the Friday night, with final weigh-in at midday on the Sunday) at a central location determined by the Outing Liaison Officer. In extreme conditions, an outing may close early (9.00am on the Sunday morning), but only with the unanimous agreement of all members who have signed the Outings Book. In this situation, if you have not already signed the Outings Book, there is no right of recourse.

Keep safe on the water – good luck in the 2012-13 fishing year.

Chasing Rainbows

Eavesdropping on a conversation whilst on a Tram last week between two guys led me to decide to visit Lake Bolac this weekend just past (a long way from Narooma outing but we were with you in spirit). One of these two guys had been there a couple of weekends ago and had caught over 15 fish with 4 of them weighing between 3 and 4 kg.

Lake Bolac is approx. 240 kilometres west of Melbourne out past Ballarat and towards Hamilton. It is a small Lake covering 1460 hectares (27 kilometres around the foreshore) and it is also fairly shallow with the deepest point only being 3-4 metres.

Tom and I visited the local tackle store and as we wandered around one of the staff asked if he could help. I took the opportunity to ask him about the lake and what he would recommend in terms of tactics, etc. His advice was to just use powerbait and non-salted whitebait (which apparently resemble the local minnows) and fish off the bank. He said that he had also heard of some good fish being caught there in the last month, although he couldn't give us exact details or the best spots to fish.

As we didn't know the area at all we decided to head up on Saturday to get there just after lunch with plenty of good daylight so we could have a drive around and decide on a few likely spots. This we did and eventually settled on a rocky point feeding into a small shallower open bay, hopefully giving us the best of both possible feeding zones.



We fished for 5 hours and only had 1 bite which resulted in a nice 800gm fish on orange Gulp nuggets. During the time there, we had thrown out some bread crumb berley and when I cleaned the fish it had small lumps of this also inside its stomach. Finishing up for the day, we threw out some more berley and headed off to the caravan park for dinner and some sleep. The plan was to come back before dawn and fish this spot until 10 before then heading to another spot we had seen but had someone else fishing there when we went past it again.

We woke up to fogging morning and a temperature of 5 degrees (a lot warmer than Jindabyne I thought to myself) and headed back to our initial spot hopeful that more berley had attracted some fish or had peaked their interest enough for them to cruise past again.

The morning remained foggy and the temperature only went up to about 10 by the time we left to head home to Melbourne. We had a light breeze and the occasional shower as the morning progressed, so pretty good Trout weather I guess. We had a reasonably good morning ending up with 5 more fish.



Four were a very healthy 800gm size and one was a good fish of 2.3kg. The biggest fish went 59 centimetres and was released to be caught another day. All were taken on Powerbait with the whitebait untouched. We did not encounter any of the "monsters" that I had heard about but talking with some locals, they all said that the fishing was much better a few weeks back and that they had seen or had caught themselves fish between 3-4 kg.



All in all, a great spot and one that will be visited again.

It was Saturday morning, 23 June 2012, and having spent five long days in the office in preparation for the end of the financial year, I just had to get out of the house. The previous Sunday saw me return home from Lake Eucumbene with five rainbows weighing 0.6 to 1.05 kg, so I decided to head back.

I took a shortcut to Adaminaby via Bobeyan Road in my Corolla as I was told by a couple of people that snow and ice don't settle on dirt roads. Not true I quickly discovered. Without going into the details, I quickly discovered that Corollas don't like icy roads.

But I made it in one piece so I stopped at Adaminaby for a nice meal of fish and chips and to pick up essential supplies (coke zero and chips). I proceeded down the Snowy Mountains

Highway towards Kosciusko National Park and found myself driving through a thick snow shower all the way to my fishing spot.

After setting up two rods at my usual spots around 3 pm, I was joined by John, his son Anthony, and five week puppy named Axel. They went lurecasting for a couple of hours while the icy cold wind continued howling and dumping huge flurries of snow.



By sunset, the wind eased a bit and John landed a nice pan sized brown with a yellow winged Tassie devil. John and Anthony then set up their bait rods and then we all sat around the fire and talked.

About 7.45 pm, a couple of fisheries inspectors dropped by to say hello. While they were there, they checked our fishing licences, our fish, our fishing gear and searched our cars. Fortunately, the fisheries officers found everything was in order and left us to enjoy our camp fire.

One of these days, I keep telling myself, I'll bring my swag to Eucumbene and stay the night. This was not one of those nights. After landing four nice sized rainbows, I decided to call it a night and go home.



So I packed up my gear and John and Anthony very quickly positioned their rod holders in my lucky spot. I thanked them for sharing their dinner with me and offered a couple of fish in return. But they declined, feeling confident they were going to catch some fish now that they got my lucky spot.

Saturday was a 5am start at the boat to head out for the day; we were the first boat out. Destination straight out to the 1000 fathom mark. Fishing started at 6am and we were only just over 100 fathom mark when we set a lure pattern and then sat back and waited.

10.30am we had well over a 1000 fathoms under the boat and started to cube for 4 hours for no fish. Again on the move with lures in tow. Fishing stopped at 4pm and we were still about 38 nautical miles of shore. Then the first reel when off at about 5pm for our first striped tuna and then about 15 minutes later we had 2 more for the day. We finely birthed at about 7pm.

Sunday was a slightly later start 5.30am and plans were to head out to were the long liners were fishing about 60 nautical miles (120km) off shore. Mario had it on good info where the long liners are fishing the fish would be. Midday come still no sign of them and fishing to stop at 3.30pm. It was time to head back to shore just before 1pm the sound we had all been waiting for that scream of a reel going off. All five of us had fish except Mario's Dad so it was his turn. After a 35 min fight he had it to the boat. Pasquarly landed his biggest yellowfin ever which went 48.5kg at the gantry.

ANSA NSW 12 MONTH COMPETITION RULE AND ENTRY FORM FOR 2012/2013.

The ANSA NSW Committee has made a few small changes to the 12 month competition format and tweaked some of the divisions, including adding to the length only categories.

Overall this years' 12 month Competition was well contested, but some divisions still remained under-represented by overall entries. Based on this, the Committee has made some changes.

Attached with this memo you will find the NEW 12 Month Competition Entry form and competition rules. Please ensure that your club members and club recorders are aware of the new form and rule changes for 2012/2013. Please ensure all new claims made from 1 July 2012 for the 2012/2013 competition year are entered on the new form.

Note Rule 4: "No entries will be admissible if the fish species has been caught in the closed spawning season as detailed by NSW Fisheries"

Essentially this means that Fisheries spawning closures to species like Bass, Estuary Perch, Trout and Cod make them off limits to catch, measure, photo and release in the interests of returning the fish as quickly as possible to the water. Anglers need to keep in mind that the species can still be entered into the competition during these spawning closures if caught outside the prescribed closure areas e.g. Trout in dams are OK. The spawning closure is only for Trout in rivers.

12-Month Competition Rules:

1. The competition runs from July 1st 2012 to June 30th 2013.
2. Only financial members of ANSA NSW are eligible.
3. Only captures made in NSW or ACT and adhering to NSW Fisheries & ANSA guidelines are acceptable.
4. No entries will be admissible if the fish species has been caught in the closed spawning season as detailed by NSW fisheries.
5. Only captures made within the 12 month period of each year's competition are eligible for inclusion.
6. Entries should be in-hand (be with) with the State Recorder no more than 35 days after the date of the capture.
7. Entries 'completed in full' can be posted **OR** emailed to the recorder - Not Both. Incomplete or incorrect forms will be returned to the club recorder. If they are re-received within the 35 days from the original date of capture they will be processed, otherwise they will be filed unprocessed.
8. To allow for planning of the presentation night and issue of final results, captures made after 31st May, have to be in-hand (be with) the State Recorder for processing by the 14th July. This is the only exception to rule 5 and 6 above.
9. Each capture will be eligible for **ONE ONLY** of divisions 1 to 21.
10. The first 3 place getters in divisions 1 to 21 will contribute to the Champion Club point score.
11. Division 22 (Most Versatile Angler) is calculated automatically by the State Recorder and does **NOT** contribute to the Champion Club point score. All 12 Month Competition entries will be included. Points will be allocated to the angler's highest point scoring fish if the same species has been entered more than once during the year. Each entry will be allocated 1 point for every 50 ANSA points up to a maximum of 5 points per capture, only entries in Divisions 1 to 13 will score points.
12. Captures must comply with ANSA NSW rules for line eligibility. Captures made on "Signature" or "Factory" pre test line do not require a 5 metre line sample to be submitted. Captures made on "Standard" line will require a 5 metre line sample to be submitted unless the line has previously been submitted to ANSA for testing in which case the designated/tested breaking strain will apply and the line categorised as "Signature" pre test line. Captures made on "Break Away" line combinations must comply with ANSA NSW rules for use of "Break Away" line combinations – the breakaway line must be "Signature" or "Factory" pre tested line. For fly-fishing the class tippet must conform to ANSA National rules. If not, the complete leader and fly should be submitted for line testing.
13. For Division 14 (Tag and Release), either the NSW Fisheries tag card / copy or the tag numbers must be included. Captures must comply with the ANSA NSW tagging species list, which is available on ANSA's website.
14. Where an entry qualifies as an ANSA State / National Record in addition to being entered into the 12 Month Competition, the correct State / National Record Claim form should be completed and submitted together with appropriate line samples and photographs. **NOTE** – If line other than "Signature" pre test is used for the record capture (National or State), a 15 metre line sample of the line used for the capture must be submitted.
15. Entries must be a minimum of 50 ANSA points for divisions 1 to 13, except Division 14.
16. Entries in Divisions 11, 12 and 13 must include a Date of Birth on the entry form. Juniors are those anglers who have not yet attained their 16th birthday on the date of the capture, and Sub-Juniors must have not yet attained their 10th birthday on the date of the capture.
17. 1kg line class is **INELIGIBLE** for ALL DIVISIONS.
18. Sharks and Rays are only eligible for Division 14.
19. Carp are only eligible for Division 15.
20. For Divisions 15 to 21 only one entry, per division, per angler, per year, upgrading of fish is acceptable.
21. Fish submitted for weight captures, cannot be submitted for length captures and vice versa.

22. A total of 6 points is available per division, points awarded in the ratio 3 / 2 / 1 for 1st, 2nd, 3rd places respectively.
23. If a tie occurs, the points for those positions will be added and divided and allocated evenly.
24. Club Recorders may enter captures on behalf of the angler if they are satisfied that the capture meets current ANSA rules and requirements.
25. Final decisions on eligibility or validity of entries will be made by the ANSA NSW Committee.
