Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

## Aims of the Club

- **To promote sport fishing**
- **To foster the art of angling**
- **To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors**
- **To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment**
- **To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.**

**The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:**

- 1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water**
- 2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption**
- 3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch**
- 4. Taking no more than our immediate needs**
- 5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat**
- 6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities**
- 7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish**
- 8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat**
- 9. Using established roads and tracks**
- 10. Reporting environmental damage**
- 11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats**
- 12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters**
- 13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land**
- 14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing**

# Recorder's Report

Well, the results are in and Wollongong are winners of the Burrinjuck Bell for 2011. Congratulations to Wollongong for a well-deserved win in the face of fierce competition. The outstanding capture for the Convention was the whopping 5.76 kg Carp caught by Canberra Fisherman's Club sub-junior member Kyle Walton on 2 kg line. Well done Kyle – the future's looking pretty good for CFC!

Overall, I weighed in 681 kg of Carp in the Recorder's tent, along with 79 kg of Golden Perch and 13 kg of Redfin. This represented 372 Carp at an average weight of 1.83 kg, 70 Golden Perch at an average weight of 1.13 kg, and 48 Redfin at an average of 0.28 kg. The actual number of Carp caught would be much higher than this as many anglers only weighed their largest.

Also - while I was weighing in fish at the Convention I heard many reports of just-legal size cod being caught and released. Next month's Club outing back to Burrinjuck sounds promising.....hope to see you there.

Many thanks to the members that helped me out over the weekend, and to the weatherman for keeping the rain away! I had a great weekend and am looking forward to Burrinjuck 2012.

While the Club's focus over the past month has been on Burrinjuck, there have been a couple of members weighing in some nice fish. Steve Bailey caught a monster Barramundi of 30.5 kg on a recent Queensland trip, Anthony Heiser caught a nice Golden Perch in Lake Burley Griffin and Darren Hossack caught a thumper Dusky Flathead in St Georges Basin.

It's looking like there's going to be a great summer of fishing this year. So if you're planning to wet a line over the Christmas break, now's probably a good time to get your personal scales checked.

## News & Stories

### Burrinjuck Convention



"The weekend of the 4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> of November was the 37<sup>th</sup> Annual Burrinjuck Convention, hosted by the Canberra Fisherman's Club (CFC). This convention is part of the NSW Australian National Sportfishing Association (ANSA) convention circuit. The CFC team started arriving at the Burrinjuck State Waters Park just after 8am and transformed Lawlers picnic area into their convention headquarters, by erecting a huge marquee for a dining area, another for the convention kitchen, and two smaller structures for the Weigh-in Station and the Secretary's tent.





The competition commenced at midnight Friday, and concluded at 12pm on Sunday, with 183 competitors registering for the event.

Over the weekend 372 Carp (681 Kg) were caught, along with 70 Golden Perch (79 Kg) and 48 Redfin (13.5 Kg). The largest Carp (5.76 Kg) for the event was caught by 6 year old CFC angler Kyle Walton.

The Native Catch and Release section was won by Greg Clarke from Wollongong with a total length of 835mm.

The Champion Family this year was the Anderson family from Wollongong. This prize is not only for fishing achievement, it's awarded to the family that is competing together and out there having fun together. The Andersons are always out there early on Saturday, getting on the water before most other families have made it to breakfast. This pays off as both Aaron and Amelia got some good fish.



The Mystery Weight Carp for junior competitors was 2.343 Kg this year, with the nearest being a 2.32kg carp caught by Dylon Bryant.

The ANSA competition for the St. Georges Trophy (the Burrinjuck Bell) comprised of 6 clubs.

The Wollongong Sportfishing Club regained the Bell with a convincing 47 points, in second place was Botany Bay Sportfishing Club with 24 points, followed by Sea Bees Boating Club with 9 points, CFC with 5 points, Ocean Beach Hotel Fishing Club with 4 points and Sportfishing NSW with 1 point.

The Rangers Trophy, awarded to the angler with the highest aggregate points score, was this year won by Terry Tatton from Wollongong with 264.3 points. The Highest Point Scoring Fish Fly-casting went to Chris Stolk from Wollongong for a Carp weighing 4.46 Kg, and the Highest Point Scoring Fish Lure Casting was won by Kimberly Stolk also from Wollongong with a Carp of 4.59 Kg.

The CFC was very pleased with the convention and is looking forward to doing it all again next year on the 2<sup>nd</sup> -4<sup>th</sup> November, 2012. The CFC would like to thank Tackle World Canberra and all the other sponsors for their continuing support of this event”.





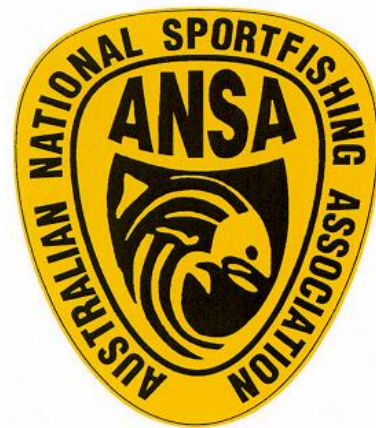

## Happy hunting in Jerra

The last week of October brought a few nice surprises for Chris Head, Steve Borkowskis and myself.

*24 October 2011*

After sitting through an hour and a half of an agonisingly dull presentation at work that was running way over time, I managed to quietly slip away at 4 pm and make my way to Jerra Pond. It was a cold and miserable afternoon with heavy rain pouring down but it started to ease by 5 pm and I caught a 450 gram reddie on soft plastic. Chris Head then joined me and landed a couple of reddies. He then inadvertently landed a 40 cm plus cod on his favourite Big Eye Blade, followed by a 42 cm cod. Both fish were released promptly and gave us a bit of a splash as they swam off.



*26 October 2011*

This time, Steve Borkowskis decided to join us at Jerra Pond after work and caught and released two 40 cm plus cod. I couldn't even get a reddie and I was beginning to feel left out so I wandered off to try some different spots. Just on sunset, my efforts were rewarded when I inadvertently caught a 45 cm cod. An undersized and out of season cod is not exactly a dream come true. However, there was a satisfying sense of accomplishment given it has taken me seven years and eight months to finally catch and release my first cod! By the time I caught up with Steve to tell him about my cod, he was releasing his third cod back into the pond. After it got dark, Steve went home and Chris and I continued fishing. Chris ended the night with a bright red 1.29 kg rainbow trout.





30 October 2011

It was a nice sunny Sunday morning so I again found myself at Jerra Pond at 9 am flicking blades. I didn't get any hits so I assembled a spinner bait from parts I purchased at the recent Tackle World sale and got busted off on the first cast. Not long afterwards, I had some follows by a kilo plus rainbow that refused my offerings of blades and soft plastics. I spotted a dark brown 80 cm carp spy hopping near the bank so I immediately notified Steve, who promptly went down to the pond to set up with his carp rods. Steve then pulled out a 1.23 kg rainbow on bread (is there anything he hasn't caught on bread yet?). Chris also made his way down to Jerra and we ended the afternoon with a few small redfin each.
