Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing

The size of the fish was up on the Buckenderra outing in August, with a couple of nice 2kg Browns finding their way to the back of anglers' landing nets. As well as the Browns, members caught some nice Rainbows and some small Atlantic Salmon.

Since then the level of Lake Jindabyne has fallen suddenly as water was released to provide environmental flows to the Snowy. I haven't received any capture forms since then – it could be because the fish have gone off the bite, or maybe nobody's fished it since then.

Looking to the saltwater scene, the Chris and Colin Clark caught some nice fish on a trip to the Hawkesbury and South Coast beaches. Offshore, Brian Stacy and Mario Imbriano reported good numbers of Albacore off Batemans Bay, so if you can find a weekend when the seas are down, it might be worth organising a trip.

The fish-length categories of the annual championships continue to attract plenty of interest, with Andrew McGovern and Ben Lemmon adding another couple of metres of trout to their tally and Mitchell McGovern.

Kalkite 24-25 September 2011

The Broncos defeated by Manly, a Jindabyne Grand Slam by Keith, Jamie Stanfield bagging the elusive lurecasting masters brown trout, Tom bagging an even bigger lurecasting Brown, and weather that came in all four seasons (except Spring, Summer and Autumn) were among the highlights of the Kalkite Outing.



Tom & Jamie manned the BBQ at the Tackle World Expo before heading over to Kalkite for a Friday afternoon lure casting session off the banks. Jamie, who had been chasing an elusive lure casting masters brown trout, was grinning from ear to ear when he landed a 2.04 kg brown on 1 kg mono towards the end of the day.

Zane arrived later on that evening and braved the cold to fish the bank at night near the Kalkite boat ramp to no avail. I arrived at the Highland Lodge around 8.30 pm to find Jamie still grinning from his afternoon capture and everyone watching the Broncos getting beaten by Manly.

Most of us awoke to a grey overcast morning, Brian woke up crook with a stomach bug and stayed in bed for the entire weekend so Mario took the opportunity to sleep in and go bank fishing later in the morning. Mario had fun chasing small trout and losing some gear to snags.

Bruce and Zane trolled for the morning with Zane getting a 1.4kg brown trout on 2kg mono earning him the nickname "meat catcher" from Chris Lemmon. Afterwards, Zane bank fished near the boat ramp and bagged out with some rainbows and Atlantic salmon.

Tom and Jamie went spinning and bank fishing. Tom landed a 2.10 kg brown lure casting, three rainbows and two atlantic salmon.

Keith and Lemmo trolled for a couple of hours and Keith landed three rainbows, a brown, and two Atlantic salmon (which he released). They picked me up and we then made our way to Kalkite Creek where Keith dropped Lemmo and me on one bank and he went to the other.



Keith landed a few more fish including two legal size brook trout (nailing a Jindabyne Grand Slam) and dropped a monster brown. I landed four rainbows and a brown and Lemmo caught two rainbows on the new



Berkley Salmon Egg powerbaits. I also got my second ever legal size brook trout on a yellow wing tassie devil.

The weather threatened to rain and everyone started making their way back to the boat ramp. Icy cold rain poured down just as everyone got back to the cabin. Jamie cooked up a delicious BBQ dinner for everyone and we all sat back to watch the Wallabies take on USA.



Rain continued drizzling on Sunday morning, a few hardy souls decided to go fishing while the rest of went home. Tom and Jamie reported a few bites but no fish. Zane dropped some big fish at East Jindabyne and is certain to go back there in the near future.



The next outings are the ANSA Talbingo Convention (which the CFC took out the ANSA Champion Club Trophy) in October followed by the CFC's ANSA Burrinjuck Convention in November.

Talbingo 14th – 16th Oct

This year the club was represented by 6 members at the Talbingo Convention ran by the Wagga Wagga Boat Club Anglers. At the start of the week, the weather forecast was looking fairly bleak with the promise of showers and cold weather, luckily it was unreliable and for those who attended it was a lovely weekend of sunshine and calm weather.

I arrived at the Talbingo Township just after 5:30pm with the sun still out and for once the last one there as Jamie and Tom Stanfield had already arrived earlier in the afternoon and Shane Jasprizza (my fishing partner for the weekend) having been there since Thursday and Chris and Sara DeLaRue arriving on Wednesday. Although I was tempted to go for a fish after dinner, I decided otherwise as we were planning a 5:30am start and had an early night.

Saturday morning after a quick breakfast, Shane and I were at The Pines campground by 5:30am and were on the water at Blowering Dam by 6:00am. Our plan was to troll, lure fish and bait for 1.5 hour at a time and within 5 minutes Shane pulled in the first two fish for the day, it was however small redfins and little did we know it was going to be the pattern for our day.



After trolling for a short distance and 4 redfins later, we threw our 1.5 hour plan out the window as we came to our first long stretch of bank full of snags and the temptation of casting lures into those "golden" hideouts was too much. It turned out to be a good switch as a few hundred meters after our start point, Shane was on. The fish had initially taken Shane's lure around a snag but after some smart manoeuvring of the boat and some desperate jerks of the rod, the line was out wood and up came a nice 455mm Yellowbelly which Shane put in for a

catch & release. That turned out to be our last capture for the morning.

We stopped at a small bay for lunch and bait fished for 1.5 hour with no reward; we the decided to continue lure casting along the bank and it was not long that Shane spotted a school of fish on the sounder. We quickly swapped our lures for soft plastics and eagerly dropped it to the bottom and it didn't take long for us to pull up another redfin and this continued for the next 30 minutes as we hovered over the spot and pulled in more redfin, unfortunately for us, they did not meet the 300gm minimum weight in limit.

After the disappointment of catching small redfins, we decided to head towards a nice stretch of bank which lead up to the dam wall to troll. Shane's deep diving lure was hit as we turned the first bend by something so powerful that the commotion was over before the blink of an eye. One lure down, we trolled the entire length of the dam wall for no result. However as we back tracked toward where we started the troll, my stump jumper was hit and this time we managed to steer the boat away from the snag and I successfully landed a 460mm Murray Cod, which was quickly released after a photo. Unfortunately it was closed season for Cod so it didn't count. That turned out to be our last major capture for the day as we continued to find small redfins along the way home.



Chris and Sara De La Rue fished Talbingo Dam all day Saturday and Sunday morning. Between them they managed to catch 8 trout ranging from 27cm to 35cm. Of the total catch only four made it to the weigh in station. Chris advised that Sting and Tassie Devil lures were the key fish takers.

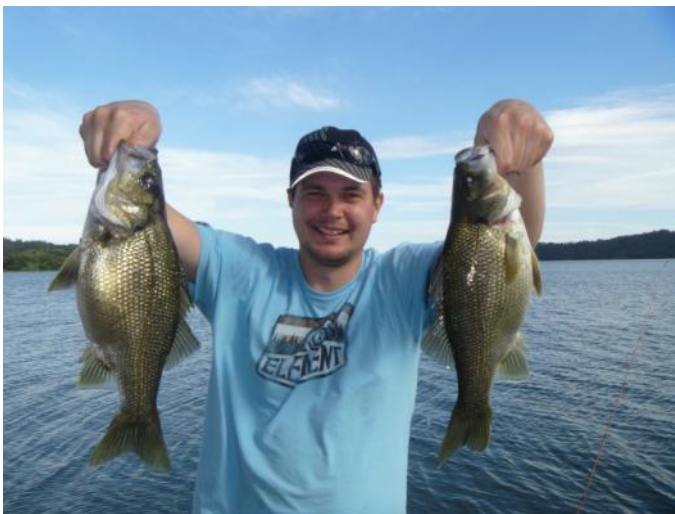
Sunday was another early start as Shane and I launched at Talbingo Dam and we were blessed with a beautiful view of the dam in the morning, if only our fishing was just as blessed. It turned out to be an uneventful morning of trolling and lure casting with Shane's small redfin while trolling and my small brown trout by lure casting the only fish to show for. We ended up bumping into Chris and Sara on the way back and unfortunately they had a similar day.



We left the water at 11:30am as we headed back to the township for lunch and presentations. Although we had a small turnout for the convention by our club, we managed a first place with Chris DeLaRue winning the Champion Highest Point Score Male with 70 points and Shane receiving 2nd place in the Catch and Release category.

All in all it was a good weekend with some beautiful scenery and a great convention run by Wagga Wagga Boat Club Anglers. Let's try and get a few more attendees next year.
