Ice, sleet and snow at Buckenderra, 18-19 August 2012

A hardy contingent of eight CFC members braved an awesome show of ice, sleet and snow by Mother Nature to attend the second outing of the Club year. Kevin Spriggs, Greg Davis and I left Canberra on Friday morning. It was drizzling with rain before we left Canberra, but there had been reports of snow falling in Belconnen and other suburbs earlier that morning. After witnessing another of Mother Nature's displays (this one involving two donkeys in a paddock), Greg and I turned left the turn off from Snowy Mountains Highway to get to Buckenderra, where the rain turned to sleet, and then snow.

By the time we arrived in Buckenderra, we were in a full blown snow storm, and you could only just see the lake from the Cabin. John Vogel, John Bosch, and Glen and Karen Malam arrived afterwards.

Kevin and I pre-fished the outing from 5.30 to 7.30 pm at the little bay below the cabin. Having fished Eucumbene in similar conditions previously, I was surprised that we didn't get a single bite and we returned to

the cabin empty handed. The only fish spotted that evening was the 1.5 metre 'snow fish' outside our cabin.

We woke up on Saturday morning to the glorious sight of Buckenderra covered in snow. After taking a few photos, we made our way to the bay below the cabins for a morning session of bank fishing.

Glen and Karen Malam were first on the scene and within minutes of everyone else arriving, Glen landed a 1.2 kg brown trout on chunky cheese. Things looked good when Glen got a second bite on his line but things quickly turned quiet. So we just resigned ourselves to watching the snow slowly melt away waiting for the fish to bite.

Finally, after most of the snow had melted away, Kevin's rod went off and we all gathered around to watch Kevin reel in the second fish for the day. It appears our brains had also melted away as we were all standing around asking 'does Kevin need the net'...eventually some cried out 'Kevin needs the net!' but by the time I raced back and got the net, Kevin landed a 0.58 kg rainbow.

John Bosch and I decided to walk to another bank to spin lures, this spot was fairly shallow but was off a point and facing the wind with some muddy water close to the bank. After several minutes of casting Tassie Devils, John landed his very first trout and a few minutes later, I landed another. Both fish took the lures within 1.5 metres of the bank.

John and I explored the banks a bit further and found a Dad and his two sons fishing the bank with about 20 fishing rods! I may not have kept up to date with fishing regulations but, last time I heard, there was a limit of two rods per angler for fresh water! Meanwhile, Sarah Borman joined the outing, fishing the other side of the Bay, and Glen, Greg and Karen all landed one rainbow each.

John Vogel was fishing another bank nearby and he netted a large gold fish that looked like it had been harassed by a bigger fish. He didn't manage to catch whatever it was that had tried to eat the gold fish but he did land a nice 0.87 kg brown trout instead.

After lunch, Greg, Glen, Karen and Kevin continued fishing the bay below the cabin and landed a few more rainbows.

John Bosch and I returned to the bank we had earlier caught our two rainbows. It looked like my tactic of fishing against the wind had backfired but, just as we were about to leave, I landed a 0.44 kg rainbow on orange salmon egg.

The next morning, was pretty quiet. There was very intense surface activity between 6.00 to 6.20 am – the trout weren't rising, they were busting up the surface predated on things that didn't resemble my selection of lures. Greg, John Bosch and Kevin fished a section of bank near the boat ramp, where Greg caught the only fish on Sunday - a 0.51 kg rainbow.

Thank you to everyone who came and made the outing a great weekend and thank you to Glen and Karen for cooking dinner on Saturday night. The next outing is at Kalkite on 15-16 September 2012. At the last Kalkite outing, Glen and Karen landed a couple of nice size Brook Trout that are in contention for state and national records. If my understanding is correct, this will mean CFC members have now claimed four State or National records for Brook Trout at Lake Jindabyne. But even if you are not chasing a record Brookie, contact the Outings Officer if you want to go as the Kalkite Outing is always an enjoyable weekend.

Making 'caviar' out of trout roe

One of my favourite things about fishing is definitely cooking and eating the catch. So I've always wondered how to make use of trout roe. It comes in beautiful large orange or red sacs and it always seemed a waste to discard it. I've previously tried frying it (like you do with flathead or tailor roe) but it just tastes awful. So I decided to do a little research on the internet on how to use trout roe and was surprised to discover how easy it is to make trout caviar.

So what exactly is caviar?

But before I continue, what exactly is caviar? According an old song I once heard as a kid, caviar comes from the virgin sturgeon. However, the United Nation's Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) defines caviar as a product made from salt-cured fish-eggs of the Acipenseridae family (sturgeon fish). The history of caviar can be dated back to the Persians. According to the FAO:

'The Persians were the first eaters of caviar. They called it Chav-Jar, which can be approximately translated into "Cake of Power". They believed that caviar cured a variety of diseases and used to eat it to improve their stamina. In the Middle Ages the English called sturgeon "the Royal Fish" since King Edward II (1307-27) had decreed that any sturgeon that was caught should be given to the Feudal Lords. French caviar production was controlled by Louis XIV's minister Jean Baptiste Colbert in the mid-17th century. Colbert placed his headquarters on the Gironde, at the time a major caviar production centre using the now critically endangered common sturgeon *Acipenser sturio*. In Russia, the caviar offered to the Tsars was the rarest: the small golden eggs of the sterlet *Acipenser ruthenus*, which have nowadays lost commercial interest (Bolourchi 1996).'

But walk into the deli section of Coles or Woolworths and you will find tubs of 'caviar' for \$5 made from lumpfish roe. But according to the FAO, roe

'...coming from a fish other than Acipenseriformes is not caviar, and is often classified as "caviar substitute". Appreciated fish roes include those of salmon, trout, carp, pike, tuna, mullet, cod and other whitefish, lumpfish and flying fish (tobikko).'

So alas, you are buying a caviar substitute. And so the recipe I share with you is also a 'caviar substitute'. However, it is ridiculously easy to make and tastes great.

Trout caviar recipe

All you need is 1/3 cup of pickling salt, 4 cups of icy cold water and trout roe. Dissolve the salt in the water in a large bowl. Place the roe in the bowl of water and leave in the fridge for 20 minutes.

Then take the roe out and run under a hot water tap and gently prize the eggs out of the roe into a strainer. I noticed the eggs went from orange to yellow under the hot water.

Once you have collected all the eggs in the strainer, place the eggs back in the bowl of cold water and leave it in the fridge for another 20 minutes. The eggs will return to an orange colour. Be careful not to leave the eggs in longer or else it will become very salty.

Then strain the eggs out of the water and store in a glass jar. One roe produces approximately one egg cup of caviar.

On its own, the caviar tastes salty. But served on top of a fillet of smoked trout, the mix of flavours is beautiful.

He's chased grandma up a tree.

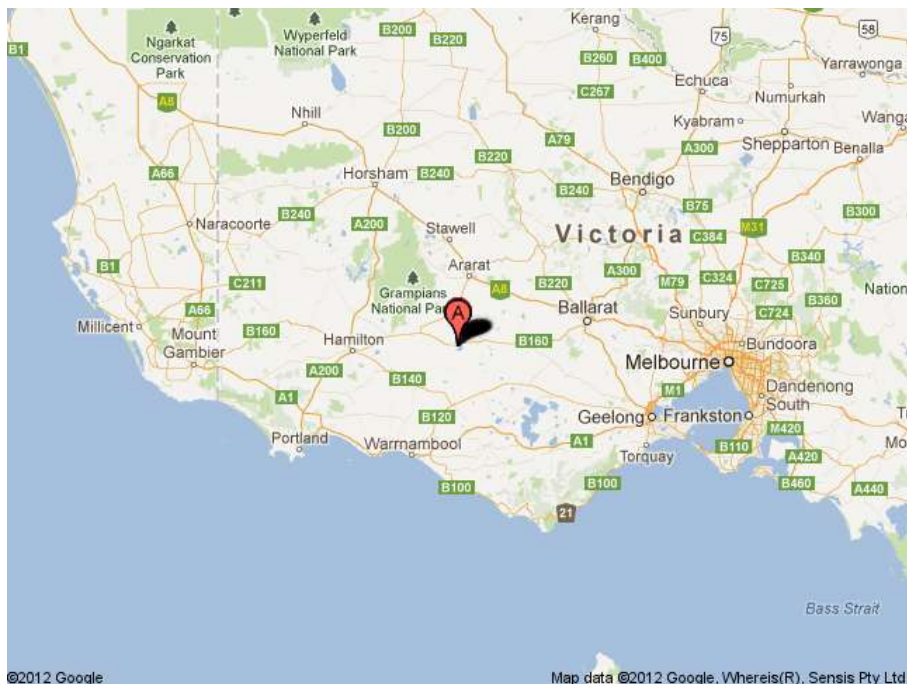

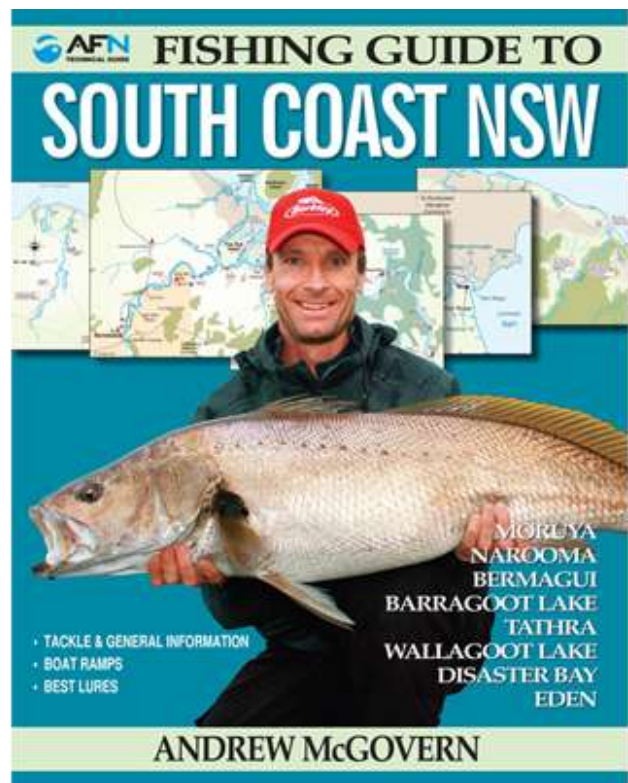
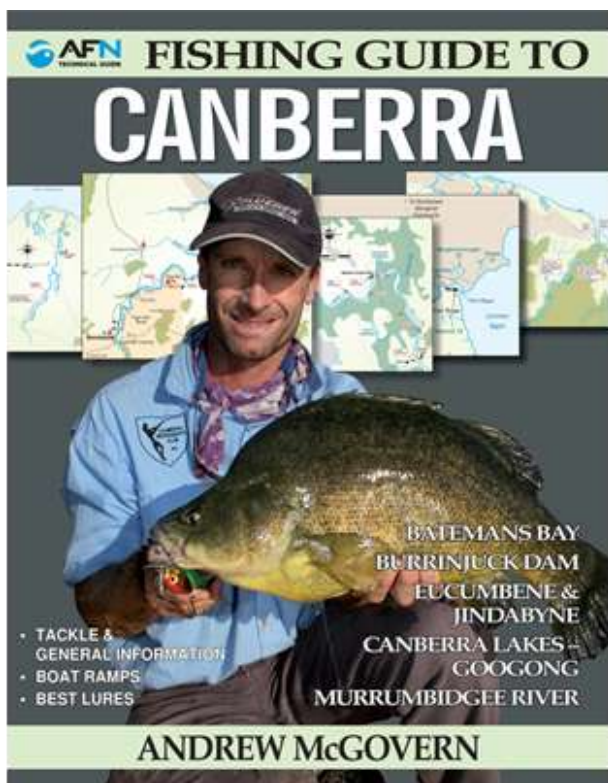

Fishing & Lake Report 27/08/12

Rain last 7 days: 33mm Current discharge: 5020 ml per day.

Water level current: 99.3 % Current inflow: 6120 ml per day.

Water level: 20/08/2012 99 % Water visibility: not good.

Forecast Weather: chance of showers Wednesday & Thursday, The weekend is looking much better with light winds and temps between 1 & 16.

Full moon = 1st September **New Moon** = 16th September **Water Temperature:** 10 to 12 °C

Murray Cod: Finally I am able to report a few Cod captures over the weekend. There were rumours at the shop of a 30 + pound fish being caught but I wasn't able to track down the fisherman. The biggest confirmed fish was 72 cm, the guys from Shepparton picked up the cod on a spinner bait, and another fish of 65 cm was also landed while casting a spinner bait. Macca, who featured a few weeks back with a big cod, has been at it again, last week he pulled in more big fish. I am waiting for the photos. Remember the closed season for Murray Cod begins on the first of September.

Yellow Belly: A few reports this week from boat fishermen. We did have some boats in the park over the weekend. Saturday's weather was again not good & Sunday wasn't much better. The fishos from Shepparton had some success trolling a hard bodied lure called a Humpback and also trolling & casting spinner baits. They caught fish using both copper & chrome blades.

Redfin: A few small fish were picked up on the troll. Not much news from the bait fishermen this week.

Trout: No reports.

Silver Perch: No reports this week

Carp: The usual few have been picked up along the bank by the bait fishermen.

Park News: Upcoming fishing comps at Burrinjuck Waters State Park. These comps are for all the family, Bait fishing as well as lures.
