Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- **To promote sport fishing**
- **To foster the art of angling**
- **To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors**
- **To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment**
- **To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.**

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for

Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

- 1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water**
- 2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption**
- 3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch**
- 4. Taking no more than our immediate needs**
- 5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat**
- 6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities**
- 7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish**
- 8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat**
- 9. Using established roads and tracks**
- 10. Reporting environmental damage**
- 11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats**
- 12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters**
- 13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land**
- 14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing**

Eligible species for Total Length Award trophies for 2013/14

The committee has changed the Total Length Award species for the 2012/13 fishing year. The species for the coming year will be:

Freshwater: European Carp



Saltwater: Flathead (legal lengths apply)



Fishing fee increase from 1 September 2013

The Department of Primary Industries announced on 22 July 2013 that the recreational fishing licence fee will increase on 1 September 2013. The DPI advised that this is the first increase in the fee since 2005 and is in line with the Consumer Price Index. The changes to the fees include:

- 3 day fee increase from \$6 to \$7;
- 1 month from \$12 to \$14;
- 1 year from \$30 to \$35; and the
- 3 year fee increase from \$75 to \$85.

Fishers are required by law to pay the NSW Recreational Fishing Fee and carry a receipt showing the payment of the fee. This applies when line fishing, spear fishing, hand gathering, trapping, bait collecting and prawn netting or when in possession of fishing gear in, on or adjacent to waters.

If you have a one year or three year licence that is close to expiring on or around 1 September, then jump in early and purchase a three year licence before the fee increase.

Kioloa Outing 20-21 July 2013: Weather fails to cooperate three years in a row.

The first outing of the 2013-14 Fishing Year was again a weekend of uncooperative weather. Friday was a right royal misery of constant drizzle of freezing rain in Canberra. Some of us couldn't get out of Canberra quick enough. Zane Zhao, Keith Smith, Tom Harrington, and Kevin Spriggs were the first to arrive at Wairo Beach Holiday Park and they wasted no time getting down to Wairo Beach for a fish. I joined them around 4 pm when the rain stopped but the weather was still overcast and the beach did not look pretty.

There was a big hole to the southern side of the beach but I was surprised to find everyone fishing the northern side which looked like a washing machine at first glance. But Zane smartly worked the beach out – a closer look revealed a narrow gutter with a series of holes.

All you had to do was throw your bait at the northern end of the gutter and then walk south as the strong sweep took your bait down the beach until a salmon found your bait. Zane landed a 30 cm Bream and a couple of Salmon, as did Keith and Tom. I landed a 41 cm Salmon that way; it was truly one hungry fish as it took both the pilchard and my surf popper. When I cleaned it, I was amazed to find it full of bluish pea sized crabs.

As the night got darker, Dino Martinello and Kristin O'Neal, Chris Head and Wendie McDonald, Brian Stacy and Coralie, Greg and Rose Davis started to arrive. Glen, Karen, and Mitchell were the last to arrive as they got held up by a nasty car crash at Clyde Mountain.

The weather on Saturday morning appeared promising, there was very little wind and the Manager at Wairo Beach Holiday Park reckoned the seas were flat and he could see a few boats on the water.

If I had known that was not the most accurate maritime weather report, I might have joined Dino, Kristin, Zane, Chris and Wendy fished the beach.

They had a productive session landing a few

Australian Salmon and mullet, as well as watching humpback whale and calf swim by the breakers. I'll let the photos of Dino's Flathead speak for themselves!

Having said that, I certainly don't regret going out in the bluewater, although at the time, I wasn't so sure. Keith and I went on Tom's boat and when we got to the Ulladulla Boat Ramp, there were no other boats or trailers to be seen. We wondered as we launched the boat whether this was because (a) everyone else knew the weather was going to turn nasty, (b) the Kingies were not on the bite, (c) everyone knew the weather was going to turn nasty and the Kingies were not on the bite, or (d) everyone else decided to sleep in.

It wasn't until we joined Greg, Rose, Coralie and Brian at the Kingie Grounds that we realised the answer was (a). It was too rough to tell if answer (c) was more applicable. The forecasted 10 knot westerlies were more like 15-20 knot nor-westerlies, and the combination of huge swells, strong southerly current and choppy seas made jigging for Kingies impossible. Brian found that 300 gram knife jigs weren't hitting bottom and Greg's line found the prop on Brian's boat.

So Tom, Keith and I decided to move closer to shore and attempt to bottom bash for Sand Flathead. We had to use the heaviest sinkers to get our baits to hit bottom. After fifteen minutes of drifting, I landed a 39 cm Sand Flathead and it was all agreed we should continue fishing. This was followed by a few Southern Maori Wrasse by me and Tom and a couple more Flathead for me.

After encountering some monster waves when we drifted over a reef, we decided to head further south and continue fishing. At this point, Keith started catching some decent Flathead, the biggest being 52 cm and Tom landed a nice 42 cm Flathead. In the end Keith and I got four Flathead each, I got two Southern Maori Wrasse and a Sergeant Baker. Tom got a Southern Maori Wrasse and a Flathead.

We then headed back to Ulladulla Harbour to join Glen, Karen and Mitchell back at the boat ramp. They also found the fishing tough but Glen managed a 1.22 kg lure casting Bonito on 8 kg line.

Brian, Coralie, Greg, and Rose joined Zane, Kristin and Dino who were already fishing down on the beach. Dino got a small sand flathead. By the time Kevin and I got to the beach, everyone was gone

By the time we got back to the Cabins, Brian and Coralie were cooking up an awesome BBQ dinner for the troops. The July

Burrinjuck Waters State Park Fishing Report – 24 July 2013

Water level current: 42.7%

Current discharge: 1539 mega litres per day

Current inflow: 1750 mega litres per day

Water visibility: up to 1.5 metres

Weather: We have sunshine and a high barometer for the middle of the week before possible showers and warmer temps across the weekend. A top temp of 16 degrees for both Saturday and Sunday with a low of 4. The winds are also predicted to be only light. Snow could be seen from the boat ramp last weekend.

Full Moon: 23 July 2013 **New Moon:** 7 August 2013

Water Temperature: 12-14°C

Murray cod: The weather was terrible last weekend but believe it or not we had some campers and fisherman in for the weekend. Trolling big hard bodies such as Oargees or Invaders and big spinner baits in 4 to 6 metres of water is producing good fish. A couple of cod a day seems to be the average with fish up to 70 cm still common. Bait fishing with Yabbies of the bank at Carrolls Creek also produced some good fish. Trolling the edges of the main basin has been the best.

Yellow belly: Bait fisherman with worms or small yabbies, mostly of the bank over the weekend, were catching fish. Peter from Wallendbeen fishing club reported 5 yellows on bait in the terrible weather conditions. So the fish are still biting despite the conditions. This weekend is looking like much better warmer conditions.

Redfin: No reports this week.

Trout: No reports this week.

Silver Perch: No reports this week.

Park news: Excavation works are in full swing behind the cedars. The dirt from here is being used to level the pads for the new cottages 11 & 12. The cedars will now have an all weather access to the top side of the cottages. Photos will be posted on our Facebook page.

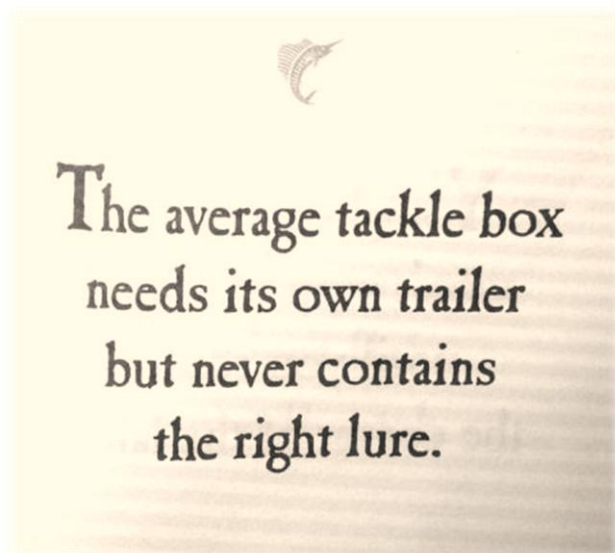
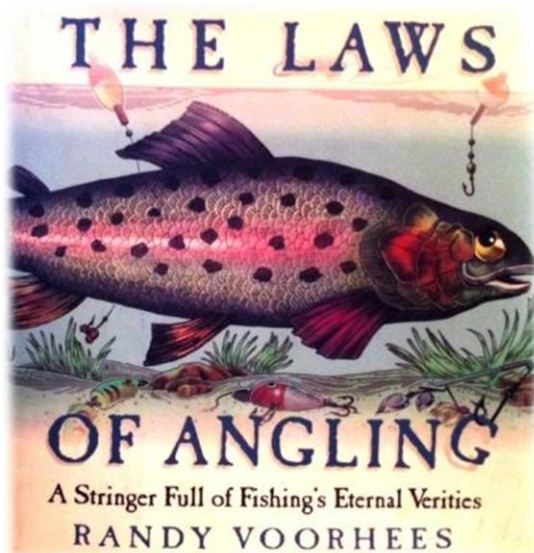
- Members can submit up to two photos per month

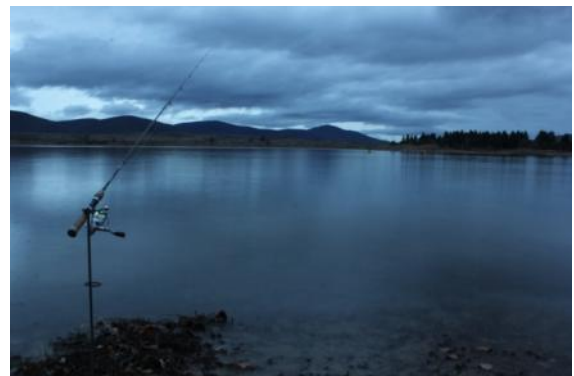
