About the Club

Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

All members should now be aware of the changes to where, when & who needs to wear a lifejacket. If you are still unsure, then have a look at the maritime website www.maritime.nsw.gov.au/ and become familiar with the rules. Otherwise, it could get expensive for you.

In the ACT...

The use of all forms of enclosed yabby, shrimp and minnow traps is prohibited in all public waters.

You can use hoop nets (a maximum of five), except in nature reserve areas such as those along the Murrumbidgee River Corridor – Woodstock, Stoney Creek, Swamp Creek, Bullen Range and Gigerline Nature Reserves.

The unenclosed hoop nets must have a drop of one metre or less and be attached to no more than two hoop rings or frames with a diameter of not more than 1.25 metres.

In NSW....

In NSW the use, and possession, of yabby/opera house traps is banned in all public waters east of the Newell Highway – which runs through Moree, Dubbo, Narrandera to Tocumwal on the Murray River. This ban also applies to parts of the Edward, Murray and Murrumbidgee rivers to the west of this 'line' so go to www.dpi.nsw.gov.au and search for the document *Fishing for yabbies* in New South Wales to find out more.

To the west of the Newell Highway (other than the exceptions referred to above) – these traps can be used but must be modified. The entrance funnels must all have a permanently affixed bi-catch reduction device that consists of a rigid ring with a maximum diameter of 90 mm. There are also other rules so check before using these modified traps to avoid fines or prosecution.

Burrinjuck Waters State Park Fishing Report – 20 September 2013

Water level current: 55.2%

Current discharge: 1,108 mega litres per day

Current inflow: 26,478 mega litres per day **Water visibility:** up to 2.5 metres

Weather: showers clearing for the weekend, with temperatures set to be between three and 14 degrees Celsius. Winds will be up to eight kilometres per hour Saturday and 12km/h on Sunday afternoon.

Full Moon: 19 September 2013

New Moon: 5 October 2013

Water Temperature: 17-18.5°C

Murray cod: it is currently closed season which spans three months from September 1.

Yellow belly: I have heard a bit of joy for the lure casters and the trolling brigade this week. Good reports started to filter in from Thursday last week with some good sized yellows starting to hit crank baits and mask vibes. Trolling crank baits (Jackalls) has also been producing.

The River rats from Shepparton started catching fish in 50 feet of water when they decided to cross over the river to the other bank while trolling Jackalls and deep diving hard body. The trees down the centre of the rivers have now disappeared below the rising water but the yellows are still holding around the submerged limbs. The lure casters have been picking up fish in close along the rock walls.

I ventured out on Tuesday afternoon in light rain with a couple of bait fishing mates Pete and Smiley. They picked up their shrimp traps along the way which contained nine good sized shrimp. We also had worms and small live yabbies on board. We fished in close to a rock wall, them with their bait and me throwing around mask vibes and Jackalls as well as drowning a worm on a second rod at the same time.

I did no good with the worms. The shrimp accounted for four fish, a couple around 45cm, one at 50cm, a cracker at 55cm as well as several other good hits. I managed the first fish of the afternoon, on a redfin mask vibe, measuring 50 cm after losing the fist Jackall on the first cast to a crevice in the rocks, I latter lost that lure and after tying on another mask vibe managed a 60.5 cm fish on the next cast, a total of six fish in 90 minutes of fishing.

Pete and Smiley landed seven yellows on the same wall on Sunday afternoon before the rain arrived. Mark from Gundagai Anglers also landed an impressive 59.5 cm yellow while bait fishing along the bank at the park on Saturday morning. There is a fair bit of water coming in from this week's rain but the weather is also predicted to warm up again and settle for the weekend. We released all the big breeders and let's hope most people do the same.

Redfin: have not kicked off as yet. There were small fish in one of the yellows, won't be long.

Park news: the 39th annual Burrinjuck Convention is fast approaching and will be held at the park on November 1, 2 and 3. Phone 0405721118 or the website




