About the Club

The Canberra Fisherman's Club Inc. is a sport fishing club that endeavours to promote a social awareness among its members, single or family. General meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month at the **Eastlakes Football Club No 3 Oxley St Griffith ACT** beginning at 7:30pm. All members and visitors are most welcome.

Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

You can also renew using PayPal via our website or pay in person at the next general meeting that just happens to be our AGM.

The Annual General Meeting and Special General Meeting

The Club's Annual General Meeting will be held at 7.30 pm, 11 August 2015, at the Eastlakes Football Club. All committee member positions will become open for application by any member who wants to be more involved in guiding the future of the Club. Nominations are now closed for Committee positions and I thank everyone that has sent in their nominations. As in previous years, it is possible that we might still be two nominations short of a full committee but we will fish that reef when we get to it.

As I've said previously, it is not necessary to have been a member for a long time to join the committee, just a willingness to be actively involved in the club and seeing it grow and continually improve. For those who might need a little extra motivation to attend, we have organised some nibbles for after the AGM and, the Committee has doubled the budget for the August raffle so there'll be heaps of prizes on offer, and no more bread crumbs.

Just prior to the AGM, we will convene a Special General Meeting to debate the following resolution:

That the net profits of the annual fish stocking raffle be shared equally between fish stocking and the Cancer Support Group ACT Eden Monaro's Own (the Cancer Support Group) in 2016 and 2017 if the following conditions are met:

- (a) The Cancer Support Group supplies at least the fifth and sixth prize towards the raffle
- (b) Both the Club and the Cancer Support Group make their best endeavours to promote the raffle and encourage their members to sell tickets
- (c) The net profits of the BBQ and drink sales at the Canberra Carp-Out are also shared equally between fish stocking and the Cancer Support Group, and
- (d) The Club will continue to manage the Canberra Carp-Out as in previous years while the Cancer Support Group will continue to manage food and drink sales.

This resolution, if passed, won't automatically commit the Club to sharing the raffle 50/50 nor does it commit the Cancer Support Group to this arrangement each year. Rather, profits will be shared in 2016 and 2017 *if* those conditions are met. The situation may happen where the Cancer Support Group can't meet all of those conditions for one of the years and if that happens, the raffle proceeds will go to fish stocking and the BBQ/Drinks proceeds go to the Cancer Support Group, as they currently do. This proposal only covers the next two years as a trial run, which allows the Club to review whether it wishes to continue this arrangement.

One of the reasons the Committee is putting forward this proposal is to spread the workload of selling raffle tickets between the Club and Cancer Support Group. This is because the workload for the Committee in organising and managing the Carp-Out and Fish Stocking Raffle continues to increase to an unreasonable level. As a result of the ACT Government granting approval to use Lennox Gardens in 2014 and then withdrawing just before Christmas, the lead up to the 2015 Carp-Out was one of the most stressful and exhausting events I can ever recall. In addition, Committee members spent their weekends in the two months leading up to the Carp-Out selling raffle tickets at shopping centres.

It is difficult to predict whether the Club will experience a similar situation again with Lennox Gardens but this is not the first time this has happened. With the additional prizes and extra hands selling raffle tickets, plus the sharing of the BBQ and Drink Sale profits, we hope that next year's Carp-Out will be easier for the Committee to organise and run and, provide an increased pool of monies to be split between the Cancer Support Group and Fish Stocking.

All members will have an opportunity to speak for or against the proposal at the meeting before we put it to a vote.

Presentation Night and trophies

The Club's Presentation Night will be held at Eastlakes Football Club on 26 September 2015. If you received a perpetual trophy last year, it's time to return it to the Recorder, John Bosch as soon as possible so it can be engraved in time for the next recipient. This will make the Committee's job easier in ensuring everyone who has won one, will get their trophy at the Presentation Night. We will have more details of the menu and ticket price of the Presentation Night soon. In the meantime, please keep this date free in your calendar.

Recorder's Report

G'day all,

Welcome to the new club year. Once again I haven't heard of any changes to the ANSA rules or eligible captures list this year, so for now I'm assuming it is business as usual. If I do hear of a change, I will be sure to let you know.

So far, the only captures I have are for the recent Kioloa outing and a capture sheet for the Walton kids who are up to their usual antics on the Bega River. Both Kyle and Macy landed masters quality fish.

The next outing will be to Buckenderra, which is shaping up to be its usual cold affair. I have heard good reports of the Trout fishing though so hopefully there will be a few decent captures this year. That will be followed up with our last winter outing for the year, at Kalkite. After that, we can start gearing up for the upcoming summer season. I for one am over this winter and am looking forward to some warmth again.

This year we are introducing an all-time length board and the equivalent yearly length board as further encouragement for those fishermen who don't have the means or desire to weigh their captures. As with all length entries you can submit a photograph of the capture on a brag mat as evidence of the capture. There is no need for a witness signature on the capture sheet. Just remember that the photo must show the length markers clearly and the whole length of the fish must be in the one photo. The photo should also be taken from as close to vertically above the fish as possible.

I have included the starting point for the all-time length board in this report as promised. These were taken from the last three years' worth of club captures. We are starting the board pre-filled with these captures so that there isn't a glut of new all-time board awards at next year's presentation night. Congratulations to those that already have their name on the board from day one!

Remember also that this year's total length fish are Bream and Golden Perch. I might just need to organise a trip or two out to the Darling. The fish may not be soccer balls out there but, if they are running, 20 or more in a day is not unusual.

That's it from me for another month. Keep those capture forms rolling in!

By-Laws Change – in case you missed it.

In case you missed reading the May and June newsletters, the CFC committee reviewed the by-laws during the May committee meeting. The club by-laws have been updated and took effect from 1 July 2015.

Paragraph 8(f) (cancellation of attendance at outings) now reads as follows:

Where a member or guest for whom accommodation is booked on their behalf by the Outings Liaison Officer are liable to pay for their share of the accommodation. However, the Outings Liaison Officer has discretion to accept cancellations by members or guests if reasonable notice is given prior to the outing or reasonable grounds are given for the cancellation.

Length Board Fish have been introduced into the 12 month competition in paragraphs 17(i) and 17(j)

- (i) At the Annual Presentation Night a certificate will be presented to all members who have captured a Length Board fish. A Length Board fish is the longest fish (regardless of the breaking strain of the line used) of any species from the list of eligible species in ANSA Rulebook. A Length Board fish may be captured at any time or place within Australia or Australian Territorial waters or by any means by any member provided that such capture was made within the ANSA fishing rules. Where ties exist, two or more certificates will be presented. To become the new Length Board fish a new capture must exceed the current length board fish by at least 5 mm.
- (j) At the Annual Presentation Night a certificate will be presented to all members who have captured an All Time Length Board Fish. An All Time Length Board Fish is the longest fish (regardless of the breaking strain of the line used) of any species from the list of eligible species in the ANSA Rulebook in the recorded history of the Club. An All Time Length Board fish may be captured at any time or place within Australia or Australian Territorial waters or by any means by any member provided that such capture was made within the ANSA fishing rules. Where ties exist, two or more certificates will be presented. To become the new All Time Length Board fish a new capture must exceed the current record holding fish by at least 5 mm.

As a transitional arrangement, All Time Length Board will be populated with the longest captures of the last 4 years (the 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15) so that there isn't a glut of certificates at the 2016 presentation night. Those initial populating entries will not be eligible for a certificate as they were caught before the board existed.

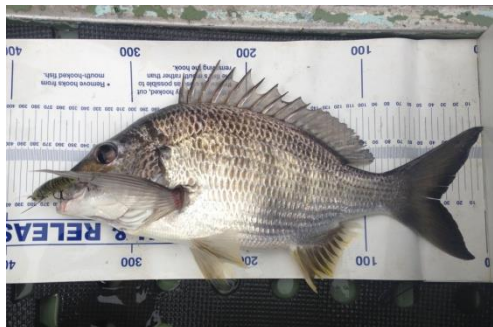
Total Length Award species for 2015/16

Some of our members have already started/attempted to put some points on the board for the Total Length Awards for the 2015-16 fishing year. Those of you yet to get involved, this is a quick reminder of this year's target species, just to make sure you're well and truly in the hunt. As per normal, minimum legal lengths apply for fish to be considered eligible for entry.

The target species for the 2015/16 fishing year are:

Bream* in the Saltwater section

Yellow Belly in the Freshwater section

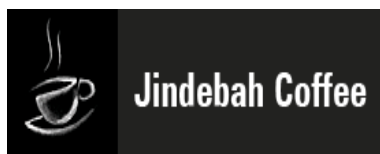
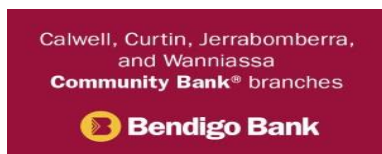


*Includes all Tarwhine and all species of Bream caught in Australian Territorial Waters. Note, this does not include freshwater species such as Bony Bream.

Ulladulla Wairo Outing July 2015

This year's Wairo Beach trip was well attended with 15 Adults and three juniors attending the outing. The weather forecast seemed to get worse as the weekend approached, with Saturday being fair at best and Sunday was just plain bad.

Most members fished the beach on the Saturday afternoon after spending the morning enjoying the relaxing Ulladulla Township. Keith and Rose fished together in Burrill Lake getting a few hits here and there but nothing into the keeper tank. Keith did try to register 18 mud oysters as seafood.

Greg and I ventured offshore with Brian in his boat but the strong tide and moderate breeze meant that holding the same patch of water was near impossible, so we had to resort to lots of drifting. We even had no success getting any livies in the boat to use as bait and should have taken that as a sign but being the devoted fishermen that we are, we pushed on through. I managed to get a wrasse on my bait rig, which ended up as my only fish in the boat for the day. After we decided we had lost enough bait, rig we moved off to fish a 'well-known' kingie reef that produced a couple of Barracudas for both Brian and Greg. Whilst moving spots, Brian's nature guiding kicked in and we were treated to see a whale playing on the surface, enjoying itself as it headed up north.



After half a day of frustration and with the wind increasing as forecasted, we all decided to head back in. By the time the boat was cleaned, the tide was due to turn so we headed to the beach at the back of the Caravan Park and try our luck at some beach fishing. The McNeices were already set up and I watched them bring in 3 shovelhead rays. They had also caught a tailor earlier in the day. I was fishing with Zane and it was another one of those sessions

where we were only metres away from where the fish were biting. We finally managed to get a few hits after the tide turn and just on dusk and ended up bringing in a salmon each.

The fishing was so quiet that Zane and Zack decided to play in the sand. They didn't actually start the digging but as you can see, they ended it, both having a lot of fun playing with their dump trucks. Considering I didn't catch anything after that, I'm wishing I had joined in.



Because the Malam's didn't come down to join in on the outing until Saturday, it was decided that their cabin's fridge was to be used to store the meat and salads for the BBQ. Being security aware, they had locked their cabin before heading off to fish the far end of the beach.
