About the Club

The Canberra Fisherman's Club Inc. is a sport fishing club that endeavours to promote a social awareness among its members, single or family. General meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month at the **Eastlakes Football Club No 3 Oxley St Griffith ACT** beginning at 7:30pm. All members and visitors are most welcome.

Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

We are pleased to announce that at this meeting **Matt Brown** from the **Canberra Marine Centre** will be joining us as our guest speaker. Matt will be taking us through what all boat owners should be doing to maintain their boat trailer all year round. The tips and tricks you will learn from this presentation should ensure (if followed) you don't find yourself stranded on the side of the road in a rage instead of enjoying the pleasures of being on the water.



Also if you are having some issues with your boat trailer setup, then bring along your questions and I am sure Matt will be more than happy to advise on what could be done to help the situation. Hope to see you all at this meeting.

By-Laws Change

In case you missed reading the May newsletter, the CFC committee reviewed the by-laws during the May committee meeting. The club by-laws have now been updated and will take effect from 1 July 2015.

Paragraph 8(f) (cancellation of attendance at outings) now reads as follows:

Where a member or guest for whom accommodation is booked on their behalf by the Outings Liaison Officer are liable to pay for their share of the accommodation.

However, the Outings Liaison Officer has discretion to accept cancellations by members or guests if reasonable notice is given prior to the outing or reasonable grounds are given for the cancellation.

Length Board Fish have been introduced into the 12 month competition in paragraphs 17(i) and 17(j)

- (i) At the Annual Presentation Night a certificate will be presented to all members who have captured a Length Board fish. A Length Board fish is the longest fish (regardless of the breaking strain of the line used) of any species from the list of eligible species in ANSA Rulebook. A Length Board fish may be captured at any time or place within Australia or Australian Territorial waters or by any means by any member provided that such capture was made within the ANSA fishing rules. Where ties exist, two or more certificates will be presented. To become the new Length Board fish a new capture must exceed the current length board fish by at least 5 mm.

- (j) At the Annual Presentation Night a certificate will be presented to all members who have captured an All Time Length Board Fish. An All Time Length Board Fish is the longest fish (regardless of the breaking strain of the line used) of any species from the list of eligible species in the ANSA Rulebook in the recorded history of the Club. An All Time Length Board fish may be captured at any time or place within Australia or Australian Territorial waters or by any means by any member provided that such capture was made within the ANSA fishing rules. Where ties exist, two or more certificates will be presented. To become the new All Time Length Board fish a new capture must exceed the current record holding fish by at least 5 mm.

As a transitional arrangement, All Time Length Board will be populated with the longest captures of the last 4 years (the 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15) so that there isn't a glut of certificates at the 2016 presentation night. Those initial populating entries will not be eligible for a certificate as they were caught before the board existed.

Change of Total Length Award species

The committee also changed the Total Length Award species for the 2015-16 fishing year. The species (minimum legal lengths apply) for the 2015/16 fishing year will be:

Bream* in the Saltwater section

Yellow Belly in the Freshwater section

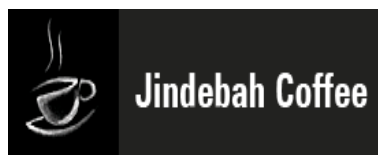


*Includes all Tarwhine and all species of Bream caught in Australian Territorial Waters. Note, this does not include freshwater species such as Bony Bream.

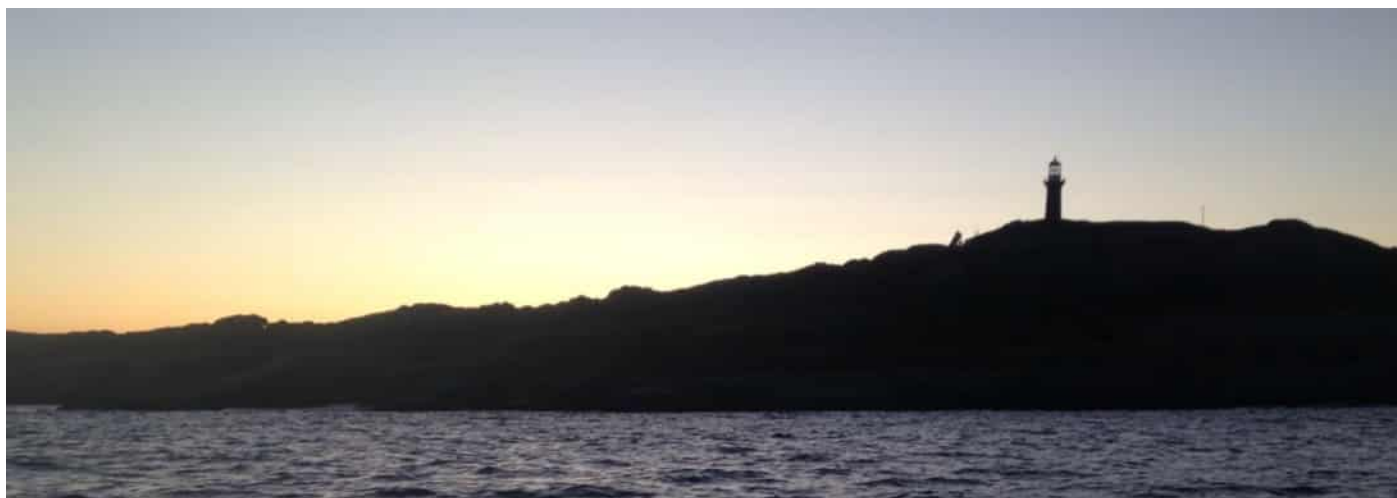

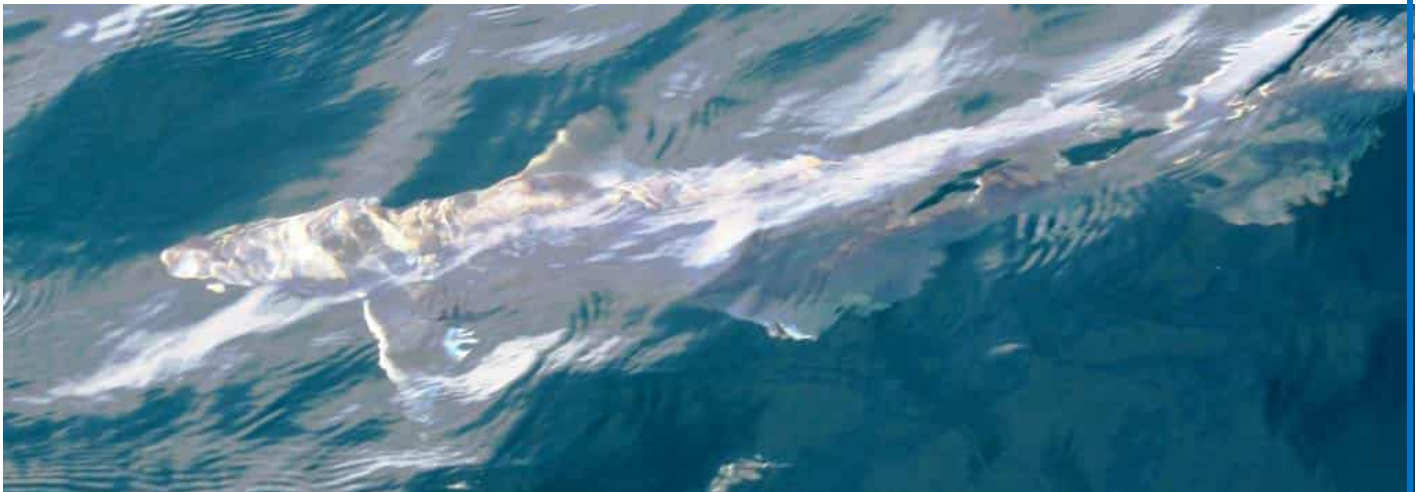

Don't blow a valve if you do not see your photo on the site straight away, all photos will need a little human intervention to get to the right place with text you have supplied.
