# About the Club

The Canberra Fisherman's Club Inc. is a sport fishing club that endeavours to promote a social awareness among its members, single or family. General meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month at the **Eastlakes Football Club No 3 Oxley St Griffith ACT** beginning at 7:30pm. All members and visitors are most welcome.

Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

## Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

# Recorder's Report

G'day all,

The CFC-Morven cup is ours again this year. Morven claimed it the first two year and we've now caught up to them, with us both now having won it two years each. CFC anglers entered two Murray Cod (both caught by yours truly) and two Golden Perch (Chris Head and Keith Smith). Morven could only enter a single Murray Cod. In the final wash up we kept the cup, Keith Smith caught the largest Yellow Belly and the Morven Cod catcher, who's name escapes me, claimed the largest Cod.

Both of my Cod were caught trolling large 2 oz. Spinner Baits loaded with a big wriggle tail grub plastic and a stinger hook in about eight metres of water. The largest went 745 mm and weighed in at 6.65 kg.

On the local front, Shane Jasprizza and Darren Hossack have put the pressure on anybody wanting to chase the fresh water length trophy. Both claimed just short of 10 metres worth of carp caught during a Burrinjuck visit. Kevin Spriggs entered a slightly unusual claim too with a Blue Groper, not something we see all that often.

The club is also now sitting third in the ANSA NSW Club Championship thanks to captures by Brian Stacy, Karen Malam and Glen Malam. Brian is currently leading the Flathead Length Only division while Karen leads the Capture by a lady division. Glen, our star performer, leads the Salt water lakes and estuaries division and is second in the fresh water lure division. I encourage you all to keep an eye on the [ANSA NSW competition](#) and to note where you can make a contribution to the club's standing. It would be nice to see the club well represented in out parent organisation's competitions.

Finally, the next outing is to Tuross on the Australia day weekend. This is probably the most popular outing of the year and I hope to see a bunch of you there. Hopefully there will be a good number of Tailor about and we can get some big numbers happening in the salt water length competition.

### 68,000 new Murray Cod for LBG & Lake Ginninderra

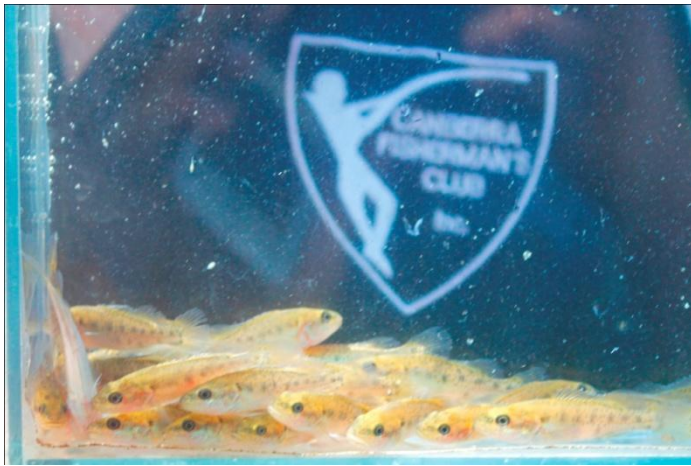


National Capital Authority CEO Malcolm Snow, CFC President Chris Head, and NCA Asset Manager Peter Beutel releasing some of the 29,000 Murray Cod fingerlings into Lake Burley Griffin on 19 December 2014.

The Canberra Fisherman's Club together with the National Capital Authority and ACT Government released 29,000 Murray Cod fingerlings Lake Burley Griffin and 39,000 Murray Cod fingerlings into Lake Ginninderra on 19 December 2014. The Club contributed 18,000 of those fingerlings with the money it raised from the 2014 Canberra Carp-Out. We will be hosting the next Canberra Carp-Out on 29 March 2015 to raise more money for fish stocking and for The Cancer Support Group ACT Eden Monaro's Own.

Ian Charles from Silverwater Native Fish delivered the first batch of fingerlings to Weston Park at Lake Burley Griffin. Eagerly awaiting the arrival of those fingerlings was Chris Head, Luke Robbie and myself at Lake Burley Griffin together with National Capital Authority CEO Malcolm Snow, NCA Asset Manager Peter Beutel, Melanie Skinner, NCA PR Director, Mark Jekabson from ACT Environment and Planning, and David Winter and Jeffrey Chan from *The Canberra Times*.

Ian Charles first tested the water and reported the water had a healthy oxygen content while Mark Jekabson advised that the most recent water quality testing found no blue green algae and only minimal levels of bacteria.



So after a few photos for our newsletter and *The Canberra Times*, we then released 29,000 Murray Cod fingerlings into Lake Burley Griffin.

Mark Jekabson and Ian Charles then joined John Bosch at Lake Ginninderra to release the remaining 39,000 fingerlings.

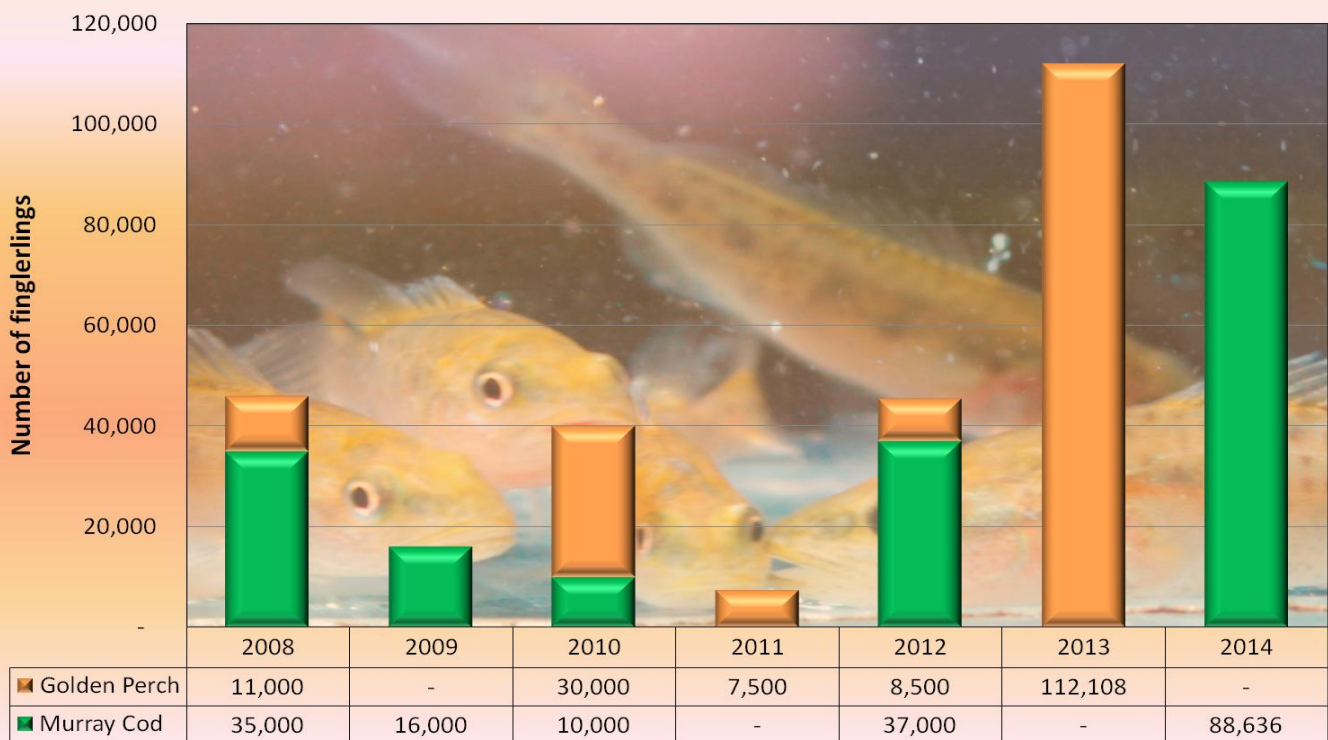
The Club undertakes its fish stocking activities under the ACT Government's current Fish Stocking Plan which expires in

2014. You should be aware by now that the ACT Government is about to publish its Fish Stocking Plan for 2015 – 2020. A copy of the draft plan is on our members' forum under 'Industry News' thanks to the Capital Region Fishing Alliance.

Comments on the draft plan are now closed and the CRFA has submitted comments on behalf of the Club and other CRFA affiliated fishing clubs. Thank you to Shane Jasprizza who coordinated the feedback process from the CRFA affiliated clubs and wrote on their behalf to the ACT Government.

In the meantime, I'm sure Chris Head and past CFC Presidents will join me in thanking the members of our Club for helping out every year at the Canberra Carp-Out and selling fish stocking raffle tickets. Without your support, we would be able to stock Canberra's urban lakes with native fish each year. With your hard work, the Club has now released over 355,000 fingerlings in partnership with the National Capital Authority and ACT Government since 2008.

The lady said, "It's amazing that you can tell all that just by the sound of it dropping on the counter. I think it's what I'm looking for so I'll take it."

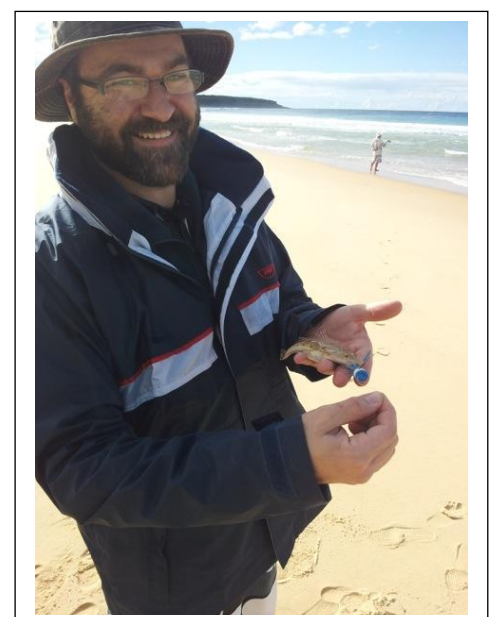

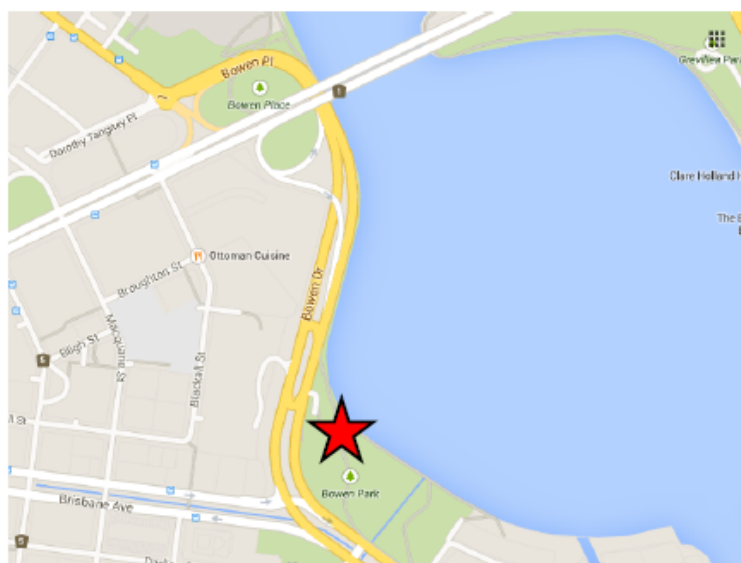
