About the Club

The Canberra Fisherman's Club Inc. is a sport fishing club that endeavours to promote a social awareness among its members, single or family. General meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month at the **Eastlakes Football Club No 3 Oxley St Griffith ACT** beginning at 7:30pm. All members and visitors are most welcome.

Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

Last month I mentioned the ACT Fly Fishers will be running its very first 'Casting for Recovery' program on 1-3 April 2016. On 15 September 2015, the Capital Region Fishing Alliance made a \$500 donation to the ACT Fly Fishers to help it offset some of the costs of running the event.

The event is a fly fishing retreat for 14 women who have received a breast cancer diagnosis in their lifetime, regardless of age or stage of recovery. The participants will receive fly fishing tuition, pampering sessions, accommodation, meals, transport and fishing equipment, with the weekend ending with a session at Rainbow Springs. The retreat will be run on a not for profit basis by the ACT Fly Fishers and at no cost to the participants. Visit www.castingforrecovery.org.au for more information.

Meanwhile, another CRFA Club, the Canberra Anglers Association, ran a successful fly fishing clinic over three weekends on 6, 13 and 20 September 2015. The first two sessions were held on the lawns of Old Parliament House. Over 80 participants attended with skills that ranged from novice like myself to the more accomplished and everyone could get tuition from Canberra Anglers Association members. This was followed with a sausage sizzle and raffle.

The third session took place at Kungla Lakes near Nimmitabel on 20 September 2015. Kungla Lakes is located at 158 Jarake Road, Nimmitabel, and is run by Chris from Monaro Fly Fishing Lodging and Guiding Service (0407 518 380; mont@monaroflyfishing.com.au).

It seems that the British High Commissioner, Her Excellency Mrs Menna Rawlings CMG got hold of our Submission to the Inquiry as it got a mention in her speech about the Magna Carta on 19 June 2015. what she had to say half way down at page 2:

'As an aside, I'm reliably informed that the fish-weir clause gave rise to a public right of fishing, which was believed to have transferred over to Australia. Indeed, Magna Carta was cited as recently as 2010 in a submission to the New South Wales Upper House by the Canberra Fishermen's Club. That suggests that the clause has survived the test of time rather better than many others. It also suggests that picking a legal argument with the Canberra Fishermen's Club would be a really bad idea.'

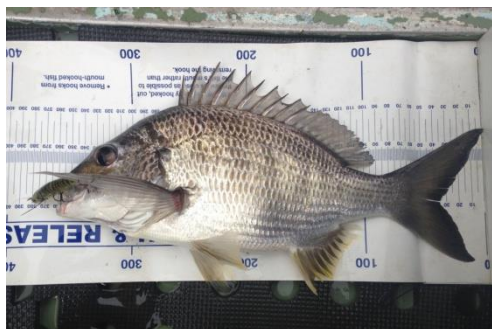
Total Length Award species for 2015-16

Yellow Belly in the Freshwater section

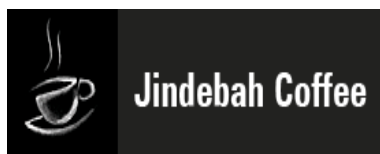
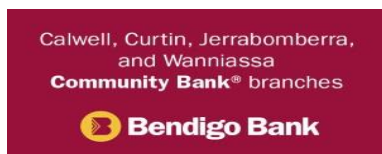


*Includes all Tarwhine and all species of Bream caught in Australian Territorial Waters. Note, this does not include freshwater species such as Bony Bream.

If you submit your photos directly to the website you will not have to do any of the above as they will be automatically resized as they upload so this is clearly our preferred method. Don't blow a valve if you do not see your photo on the site straight away, all photos will need a little human intervention to get to the right place with text you have supplied.

Lastly, if you have some fishing (or fishing related) gear to sell, swap, want to purchase, barter or are hoping to give away because you broke it, please send through the details and I'll be more than happy to put it in the next newsletter.
