## Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

# ANSA and CRFA news

The 21 delegates attending the ANSA NSW Delegates Meeting and AGM in Sydney on 29 August 2015.

On 29 August 2015, Chris Head, Kevin Spriggs and I travelled to Sydney to attend the Australian National Sportsfishing Association – NSW Branch’s Delegates Meeting and Annual General Meeting. For our new members who may not be familiar with ANSA, ANSA is the peak body for sportfishing in Australia and represents recreational anglers through various branches and affiliated clubs, including our Club.

One of the major items of business was proposed changes to the ANSA NSW 12 month competition rules. You will recall we put these to a vote at our AGM on 25 August 2015. The majority of our members instructed us to vote no to all six proposals. For motions 1 to 5, this was based on our understanding that other divisions in the 12-month comp would need to make way for any new ones approved. However, ANSA NSW Secretary Joe Garufi advised that this was not the case (after we had voted no to motions 1 and 2). The results of the votes were as follows and the changes to the 12-month comp rules will start in 2016-17 and will continue to 2019-20:

Phil Bolton from NSW DPI then gave a presentation on improved catch and release techniques. According to a recent national survey on recreational fishing, anglers release an estimated 47 million fish each year in Australia. NSW DPI studies found that survival rates for different species ranged from 70% to 90%. Phil also advised that the biggest cause of fish mortality was the deep hooking of fish and he gave a demonstration on how to avoid this with the use of circle hooks. He also discussed the successful release of fish suffering from barotrauma as well as some of the negative impacts of using lip grips and storing fish in live wells.

After the Delegates Meeting and AGM, Brian Stacy and Jenny joined us from Batemans Bay to attend the ANSA NSW Presentation Night. As to be expected, the evening clearly belonged to Wollongong Sportsfishing Club. I lost count of the number of awards they collected but it was certainly an impressive haul. However, all was not lost. Brian Stacy claimed first place for the Length only – Flathead award, John Bosch claimed second place for the Sportsfishing – Freshwater award, Glen Malam claimed third place for the Sportsfishing – Saltwater Lakes and Estuary Award, while I claimed first place in the ANSA Convention Circuit. While the night belonged to Wollongong, we claimed over half the prizes on the raffle table.

The St George Sportsfishing Club hosted all this year's ANSA Delegates Meeting, AGM and Presentation Night. They did an excellent job and I hope our Club can match their effort when it is our turn to host the event next year.

On the local front, the Capital Region Fishing Alliance held its Committee meeting on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of August. One of the major topics discussed at the meeting was the CRFA's effort in re-introducing trout stocking in Canberra. The CRFA is still finalising its proposal and ran a BBQ at Bunnings earlier this year to raise \$627 for trout stocking. Members of the Canberra Anglers Association and ACT Fly Fishers ran the BBQ and we're now waiting to hear from Bunnings for when we can run the next BBQ. We will probably get a few weeks notice and the CRFA would welcome anyone from our Club who would like to assist at the Bunnings BBQ.

Finally, the ACT Fly Fishers will be running its very first 'Casting for Recovery' program – a fly-fishing retreat for women recovering from breast cancer. The very first event will be held on 1-3 April 2016. Casting for Recovery is a breast cancer recovery program that started in 1996 by two women in the USA, a breast cancer reconstructive surgeon and a professional fly fisher. Casting for Recovery's innovative program focuses on women recovering from breast cancer and improving quality of life and has been endorsed by medical and psychosocial experts. The program has since expanded to Canada, UK, Ireland, New Zealand and I understand this is the first time it will be run in Australia. 
## Total Length Award species for 2015/16

Yellow Belly in the Freshwater section





\*Includes all Tarwhine and all species of Bream caught in Australian Territorial Waters. Note, this does not include freshwater species such as Bony Bream.

## PM Urged to Take Caution On Removing Factory Trawler Ban

The Australian Recreational Fishing Foundation (ARFF) is calling on Prime Minister Tony Abbott to display caution in allowing the removal of the ban on the Geelong Star from fishing at night. The foreign owned factory trawler was banned by fisheries authorities from fishing at night after it killed eight dolphins on its first two trips to sea.

Allan Hansard managing director of ARFF said "It is understood that the Abbott Government has come under heavy pressure from the powerful commercial fishing lobby and is now considering lifting the ban on night fishing. It is also understood that a select meeting of scientists was convened by the Government to justify the lifting of the ban by coming up with an allowable number of dolphins that can be killed before any further regulations are enforced."

"However, lifting the ban will increase the probability of further dolphin interactions from the fishing activities of the Geelong Star and could increase the probability of localised depletion of fish stocks in particular areas. Government needs to consider whether these are risks worth taking.

Careful consideration is required about the implications of removing any of the measures established to protect our marine environment. This includes the night fishing ban and the dolphin mortality trip limits and zoning regulations applying to the fishery.

"We are also extremely concerned that the Prime Minister and his Government seem to be favouring a foreign industrial fishing operation potentially at the expense of the Australian's recreational fishers and the hundreds of coastal communities that support them.

The recent disbanding of the Resource Assessment Group on the Small Pelagic Fishery by the Australian Fisheries Management Authority, has removed the voice the recreational fishers had on resource issues related to this fishery even though the harvest of these important baitfish may have a significant effect on recreational fishing opportunities, as well as coastal communities and businesses.

Mr Hansard explained that frustration is growing among recreational fishers "Our calls for meetings between the Government, AFMA and the managers of the Geelong Star about where and when the vessel should be able fish have not been answered.

"Come summer there will be a lot of very unhappy families, businesses and local communities around the Australian coastline if the Geelong Star is allowed to adversely impact on their recreational fishing, business and tourism opportunities. Surely the business interests of this foreign owned factory trawler should not be put before the interests of millions of Australian recreational fishers and hundreds of local businesses and communities.

"Australia's recreational fishing community asks that the Prime Minister shows leadership and orders immediate talks between the Government, AFMA, the vessel operators and recreational fishers so that the recreational fishing community can have a genuine say in how this fishery is managed and where and when the Geelong Star can fish".
