# About the Club

The Canberra Fisherman's Club Inc. is a sport fishing club that endeavours to promote a social awareness among its members, single or family. General meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month at the **Eastlakes Football Club No 3 Oxley St Griffith ACT** beginning at 7:30pm. All members and visitors are most welcome.

Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

## Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

# Recorder's Report

Welcome to the new club year.

There are actually a couple of changes to the ANSA rules coming in to effect this year, but neither of them really affect us that much.

- The term "All Tackle" is being dropped from the length only masters and they will now be referred to as "Trophy length records" and "Trophy length masters". This change is to avoid confusion with other all tackle activities.
- For large game species such as Billfish, Sharks and Southern Bluefin Tuna the need to weight the fish is now optional. Instead, an estimate of the length of the fish is taken and the fish released, preferably with a photo of it alongside the boat. Any fish greater than 1 metre is classed a 100-point fish, and those over 2 metres a 250-point fish. This applies regardless of the line class. You can still weigh the fish to optimise points if you wish, but remember that it must be done on land.

The next outing is Buckenderra which, given the rising levels in the mountain lakes, could be a good one. That's followed by Kalkite in September before we make our way out of the winter fishing and start thinking about summer again.

This year's length fish are going to be Golden Perch and Bream again, primarily because I forgot to raise it at a committee meeting and our by-laws say that if we don't announce it it's the same as last year. Steve Bailey and I made a decent start on the Yellow Belly during our trip out to the lower Darling and Keith Smith is already in to the Bream, so get out there fishing.

The last thing I have to ask is that if you have one of the perpetual trophies can you please bring it along to the next meeting so that I can get them ready for the September presentation night.

That's it from me for another month. Happy fishing and keep those capture sheets coming!

# News & Stories

## Maritime

Important notice to all our boating members, there has been changes to the Maritime Safety Regulation from July 1 2016 that you need to be aware of.

The [Marine Safety Regulation 2016](#) replaces the [Marine Safety \(General\) Regulation 2009](#). The [Marine Safety Regulation 2016](#) has been designed to promote safety, reduce red tape and improve administrative efficiency.

The most significant changes include:

- Reforms to boat driver licensing, including streamlining licence classes and application requirements, simplifying the fee structure and the introduction of a 10-year boat licence
- New lifejacket standards and simplified requirements for wearing lifejackets
- Vessels no longer need to display a registration label or trade plate
- Changes to streamline the administration of aquatic licences
- Changes to some penalty levels and disqualification periods.

Make sure you have all the safety gear is all up to date and in good working order and don't be caught speeding or it could get really expensive really quickly;

### Safety equipment

Offence	Penalty notice amount
Failure to carry an item of essential safety equipment (e.g. lifejackets)	\$250
Safety equipment expired or in poor condition	\$250
Not wearing a lifejacket when crossing bar (or master to ensure)	\$250
Not wearing a lifejacket on PWC	\$250
Not wearing a lifejacket in other required circumstances of heightened risk (eg alpine waters, children, boating alone)	\$250

### Speeding and other Regulatory offences

Offence	Penalty notice amount
Disobeying speed sign by <10 knots (vessel)	\$100
Disobeying speed sign by >10 knots (vessel)	\$250
Disobeying 'no wash' sign	\$500
Disobeying other Roads and Maritime signs	\$250

It's up to you to make sure you become familiar with the new regulations, otherwise you may have to pay the price!!!

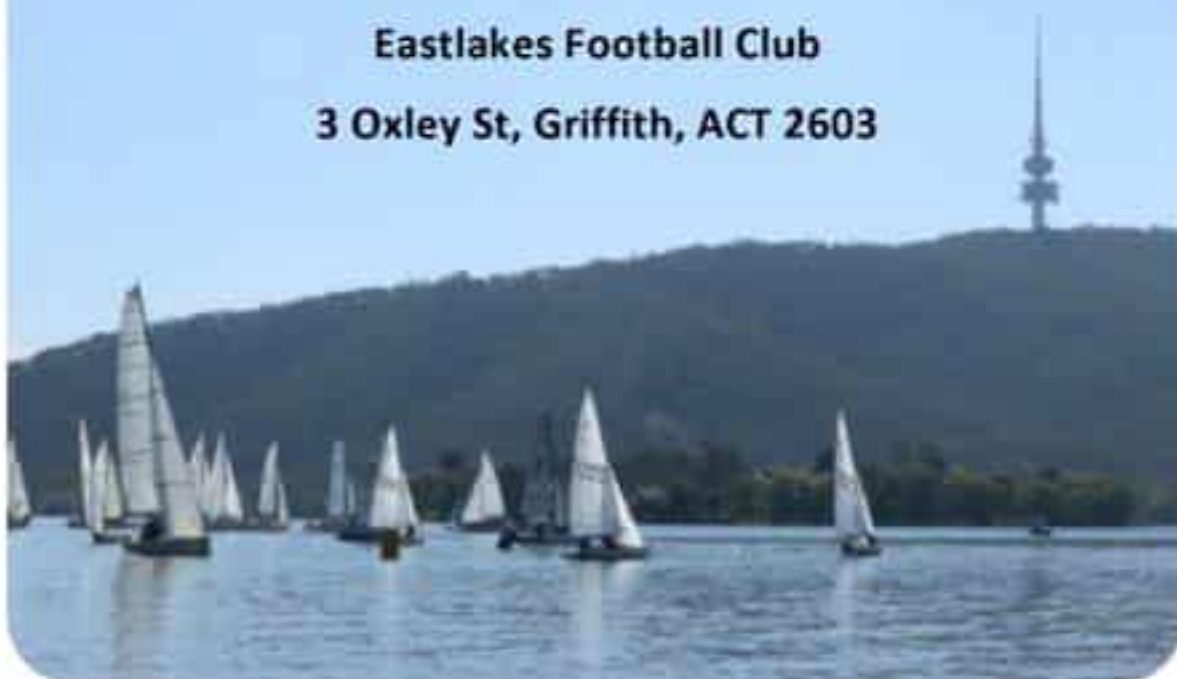

# ANSA and CRFA news

A few of our members have suffered mishaps while fishing or on fishing outings but luckily escaped serious injury. However, ANSA members are covered for accidental death or disability while fishing at any place or time under an accident insurance policy that ANSA NSW has in place with WorkCover NSW.

The new fishing year started on 1 July 2016 and its time to renew your CFC membership. If you haven't already done so, then I encourage you to also pay that extra \$20 for your ANSA membership.

All ANSA members in our Club are covered for accidental death or disability while fishing at any time or place via under an accident insurance policy that ANSA NSW has in place with WorkCover NSW and administered by the NSW Sporting Injuries Committee.

The cost of this insurance is met out of membership fees paid to ANSA NSW and the WorkCover defined accident scheme is far superior to the \$50,000 Defined Event Personal Injury Capital Benefits Accident cover. The only requirement is that when you are fishing you must be accompanied by another person - this need not be an ANSA member. This requirement is for obvious safety reasons and also there needs to be a witness to any accident for the claim to be processed. There is no minimum percentage of permanent loss required for these benefits

<b>Part 2 – physical injuries</b>	
There is no minimum percentage of permanent loss required for these benefits	
Permanent loss of:	
a. all sexual organs or part thereof	27,530
b. sightless eye	12,310

In the case of multiple injuries such as quadriplegia and paraplegia, the benefit payable is calculated by totalling the various benefits payable under Table A and Table B above.

The maximum amount payable in respect of all injuries suffered by the participant as a consequence of a single incident is \$171,000.

**Note:** any benefit paid under the Supplementary Sporting Injuries Benefits Scheme is required to be refunded to NSW Sporting Injuries where:

- an action for damages for death or injuries sustained is successful against the State Government, another Australian State or Territory or of any country
- an action for damages for death or injuries sustained is successful including against any sporting organisation
- a benefit has been paid under any contract of insurance including a sporting organisation's player accident insurance.

## Death Benefits

In respect of an adult or a person over 18 years of age survived by dependants, the full death benefit of \$70,680 is payable plus an additional \$2850 for each dependent child.

Where the deceased is under the age of 18 and has no dependants, the schemes provide a benefit not exceeding \$9,000 for reimbursement of funeral expenses.

If you are not an ANSA Member, please give serious consideration to joining. Adult membership is \$20 a year and family membership is only \$23 a year. It's not a lot of money given the benefits of the WorkCover defined accident scheme. In addition, you will be supporting an organisation that supports a fellowship of anglers through social and competitive outings, access to Master Awards, eligibility to claim State, National and International records, and most importantly, represent your interests as recreational anglers through peak bodies and to government.



The Capital Region Fishing Alliance is still exploring options to pursue the stocking of trout in Canberra's urban lakes. The CRFA will meet in August to consider whether to continue exploring those options. If so, then we will seek feedback from members on the latest draft trout stocking proposal.

The draft proposal suggests running an experimental stocking trial in Yerrabi Pond and Molongolo Pond to be paid for through fund raising activities. The trial will seek to demonstrate the viability of establishing a trout fishery in the Australian Capital Territory and demonstrate the viability of a mixed trout/native fishery in Yerrabi Pond. Molongolo Pond is not currently stocked with fish.
