Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport Fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

The 42nd ANSA Burrinjuck Convention

Well Burrinjuck is finally behind us and now we all have approximately 11 months of pre-fishing before the 43rd Burrinjuck Convention, which will be held on 3-5 November 2017. A big thank you to everyone who helped out either at Burrinjuck during the weekend or in the months leading up to it.

For those falling in the latter category, I particularly thank Sarah Borman on being the Burrinjuck Chair after taking a break from the role last year, Chris Head for doing much of the ground work in approaching our sponsors, Glen Malam for sharing the role of Sponsorship Officer role with me, Kevin Spriggs and Alex Butler for sorting out our accommodation for the weekend, John Bosch and Mick Peel for getting the data bases ready for the weekend, Albert Magassey for once again organizing the seating for the dining tent marquee, and to Greg Davis and Chris Guion for helping do the pre-Burrinjuck stock take (again...after I lost the earlier stock take Greg did last year).

Absent from my long thankyou list is the Bureau of Meteorology, which missed the memo about providing great weather for the Convention.

The BOM recorded 34 knots at 3.34 am in the early hours of Saturday morning before settling to a gentle 15-20 knots for the rest of the day. This tested Zane and his crew doing the breakfast shift. Not even Mick Jewry's handiwork in securing the dining tent marquee was a match for mother nature.

Breanna Busuttil put in a strong effort for the Botany Bay Sportsfishing Club, with 18 fish captures over the weekend, followed by Adam Camilleri (Botany Bay Sportsfishing Club) with 14 fish, Narelle Tate (Canberra Fisherman's Club) with 13 fish, Angela Bandulet (Ocean Beach Hotel Fishing Club) with 11 fish, and Rachel Camilleri (Botany Bay Sportfishing Club) and Ty Schneider with 9 fish each.

Ross Williamson also claimed the Highest Point Scoring Native Senior Angler Trophy on behalf of Botany Bay Sportsfishing Club.

The strong winds caused a few to pack up and go home on Saturday but those who persevered and fished the weekend were rewarded with some great captures.

Two hundred and thirty fish were weighed in: 138 European Carp, 73 Golden Perch, 18 Redfin Perch and one Silver Perch. The Silver Perch and most the Golden Perch were released unharmed after being weighed.

Narelle Tate's efforts saw her take home the Native Total Length Catch and Release Trophy. Ocean Beach Hotel Fishing Club took home two trophies, with Bryce Hartley winning the Heaviest Native Junior Angler Trophy and Richard Lane winning the Heaviest Native Senior Angler Trophy.

John and Bryce Hartley and Angela Bandulet also took home the Champion Family Prize. Kobi Robinson of Happy Hookers Fishing Club claimed the Junior Mystery Weight Prize and Glen Jasprizza took home the Heaviest Redfin Senior Angler Trophy.

However, the weekend belonged to Wollongong Sportsfishing Club. The Stolk Family put in some sold captures including:

- Chris Stolk's 4.4 kg Carp (that won him the Highest Point Score Fly Casting Trophy and the Highest Point Scoring Carp - Senior Male Trophy),
- Kimberley Stolk's 4.29 kg Carp (that won her the Highest Point Scoring Carp Ladies Trophy)
- Chris Nagle's 4.32 kg Carp (this fish won him the Highest Point Scoring Carp – Lurecasting) and
- Chloe Stolk with her 4.3 kg Carp (that helped her claim second place in the race for the Ranger's Trophy for Highest Aggregate Point Score.

As always, the fight for the Champion Club was closely fought between Wollongong Sportsfishing Club and the Botany Bay Sportsfishing Club. In the end, Wollongong Sportsfishing Club claimed the trophy with 35 points, followed by Botany Bay Sportsfishing Club with 33 points.

Once again, there was strong participation by the junior anglers at the Burrinjuck Convention. The junior female anglers outfished everyone, with an average of 4.5 fish each, followed by Junior Boys with an average of 2.3 fish each, compared with the adults who weighed in an average of 1.3 fish each.

The Canberra Fisherman's Club executive and members would like to thank all our sponsors including our major sponsor Otto's Tackle World Canberra. Without the sponsors this event would not be able to run. The Club looks forward to hosting its 43rd ANSA Burrinjuck Convention in 2017

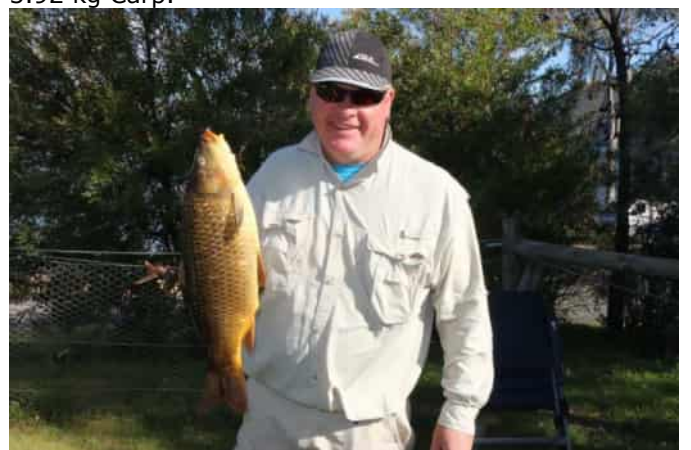

The Total Length Awards bring on healthy competition from the ranks of the CFC and for 2016-17, the target species are Bream for the Saltwater section and Yellow Belly for the Freshwater. There's plenty of time to get involved and put some points on the board to have a shot at these highly contested trophies. Minimum legal lengths apply for fish to be considered eligible for entry.

The target species for the 2016-17 fishing year are:

Bream* in the Saltwater section



Golden Perch in the Freshwater section



*Includes all Tarwhine and all species of Bream caught in Australian Territorial Waters. Note, this does not include freshwater species such as Bony Bream.
