General meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month at the **Canberra Deakin Football Club ACT** beginning at 6:30 pm. All members and visitors are most welcome.

Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport Fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
 2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
 3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
 4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
 5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
 6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
 7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
 8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
 9. Using established roads and tracks
 10. Reporting environmental damage
 11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
 12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
 13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
 14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

I hope you've managed to avoid the worst of the heat!

The first Club outing for 2019 was the Carpathon at Lake Burley Griffin. Numbers were well up on previous years, with almost 20 Facebook friends of the Club joining us on the day. While there weren't great numbers of carp caught, they were all around the 60cm mark and put up a great fight. The winning team was a group of visitors (the Willey, Connors and Portelli team) with 9 carp. It was a great day, with the CFC ladies flying the flag for us – Karen Malam took out the ladies section with a 59cm carp and Maharlia Borman took out the junior girls section with a 61cm carp. A big thanks to all that came – I'm already looking forward to next year's Carpathon.

Last weekend saw the Club head down to Tuross for our traditional Australia Day long weekend outing. It was another well-attended outing, which saw us fill two cabins for a very reasonable price of \$190 each for the weekend (that's less than \$65 each per night for the busiest weekend of the year). Keith Smith and Steve Bailey led the way in terms of the fish caught, with a couple of flathead over the 60cm mark and quite a few in the 50cm range. As usual, it was great to hear members sharing intel on techniques and locations at the Club BBQ on Saturday night and also to have a chat with fishing celebrities Steve Starling and Jo Starling, who joined us for the evening.



Looking forward, we have a couple of ANSA conventions coming up: Firstly the Nowra Convention in February (16th and 17th), followed by the Narooma Convention in March (9th and 10th). The Canberra Fisherman's Club has a long history of wins at these conventions (particularly the Narooma Convention) and it will be great to continue this tradition in 2019. These Conventions are usually won by Clubs with a team that includes female anglers and kids, so we certainly have the talent! Our February Club meeting (on the 12th February) will include a short presentation providing tips and tricks on how to do well at ANSA conventions.

G'day all,

The length boards, and the salt and fresh water total length competitions are available to all members and don't have any line-class rules.

At the beginning of December, the annual inter-club friendly competition with the Morven-Culcairn fishing club was held at Burrinjuck. I am happy to report that our attending members managed to keep the cup in our possession. Admittedly, the fight was a little one sided with us outnumbering them two to one. Murray Cod captures by Chris Lemmon and me sealed the deal. Both Cod we in the 60-centimetre range, and both were caught on chartreuse spinnerbaits.

The Tuross outing is coming up on the Australia day long weekend and it is looking to be a cracker again as usual. By all reports there are plenty of Flathead from the four-ways crossing all the way up to the highway bridge, and schools of Bream hanging around the oyster leases in the basins themselves. Unfortunately, I had to pull out of the outing myself so all I can say is good luck to all those attending.

The Zhaos @ St Goerges Basin

In between school events and doing work around the house, it's not often that we get to go out for a fishing weekend as a family that isn't a club outing, but recently we got to do just that as we took a couple of days off, packed our bags and headed to St Georges Basin for a 4-day trip.



We stayed with our favourite place down at the Basin (Island Point Getaway) hosted by John and was greeted by him like an old friend, its been over 2 years since we've visited but he still remembers the Zhao family and all our names. We had a wonderful weekend where PB's were broken as well as some damaged pride by being out fished by your 6 year old and there was plenty of non-fishing activities like a fancy lunch at Rick Stein's restaurant at Bannisters, Cupitt's Winery and Brewery and whale watching, but since this is a fishing newsletter, I'll just stick to the

main event.

We arrived on a Thursday and found the Basin and the surrounding towns to be quiet and pretty much deserted as it was only locals who were around, it was perfect for us so we wasted no time to explore the basin while we had it all to ourselves.

For the weekend we stuck to fishing in the morning straight after waking up and fishing the hour before dusk and at night as the days were used to explore the surrounding towns of Jervis bay.

Based on the notes that Anthony Heiser took during Brett Richard's talk earlier this year on fishing St Georges Basin, we pedal our way around the drop-offs near the St Georges boat ramp flicking soft plastics and trolling and quickly landed a nice 38cm flathead and a couple of undersized pinkies.

This pattern of catches continued for the weekend as we did not explore too much of the main basin because the direction of the wind

meant it was hard work to pedal a kayak for a great distance but from the Yak we managed to land over 15 fish over the 4 days catching flatties, bream, pinkies and a tailor although only the flatties and the tailor was legal sized. I didn't manage to crack the 40cm mark for



flathead during this trip so overall it was disappointing from a flathead perspective given what lurks around the basin.

However, I did say PB's were achieved during this trip and it was a pair of master length breams (410mm and 440mm) both on bait and both off the jetty out the back of the house. The first one was landed by yours truly on Friday night using live prawns that I caught from



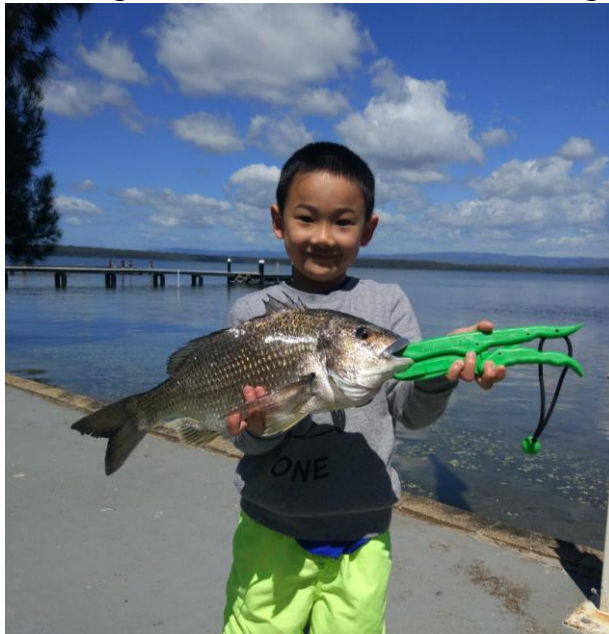
the backyard, that one was a thumping 410mm and weight in at 1.17kg. I was stoked and was pretty certain that was going to be the highlight of the weekend.

How wrong was I in making that assumption, the next morning as we walked out for our morning fish, we spotted a large grey silhouette of a decent sized bream lurking near the end of the jetty and with only a piece of cooked prawn brought from woollies in hand I told Zach to cast it to where the fish was.

Zach isn't that great at casting but the fish was only 3-4 meters away and the prawn was under a float so it was a case of near enough is good enough and sure enough as soon as the prawn hit the water I could see the bream swim straight for the weeds near where it has landed and within seconds the float bobbed up and down, Zach started to wind the line back and in a blink

of an eye the fight was on!

Fishing 2kg pre-test, it was an even fight as the fish darted left and right and tried to wrap the line against the jetty pylons, but Zach manage steer the fish just enough to avoid them and worked it to the shallows where it was safer to net the fish, it was a good 10 minute fight before we got it into the net and that's when I saw the actual size of the fish. It looked pretty big but I was silently hoping that it was not as big as mine. But unfortunately for me the ANSA brag mat confirmed a 440mm length Bream that weight in at 1.12kg, well at least I got the heaviest fish for the weekend!



Overall it was a fun packed weekend where we ticked off everything that a visitor to Jervis Bay would do and landed some pretty good fish as well, now it's time to plan for the club's December Burrinjuck outing and let's see which one of the Zhaos shall reign supreme in the next episode.
