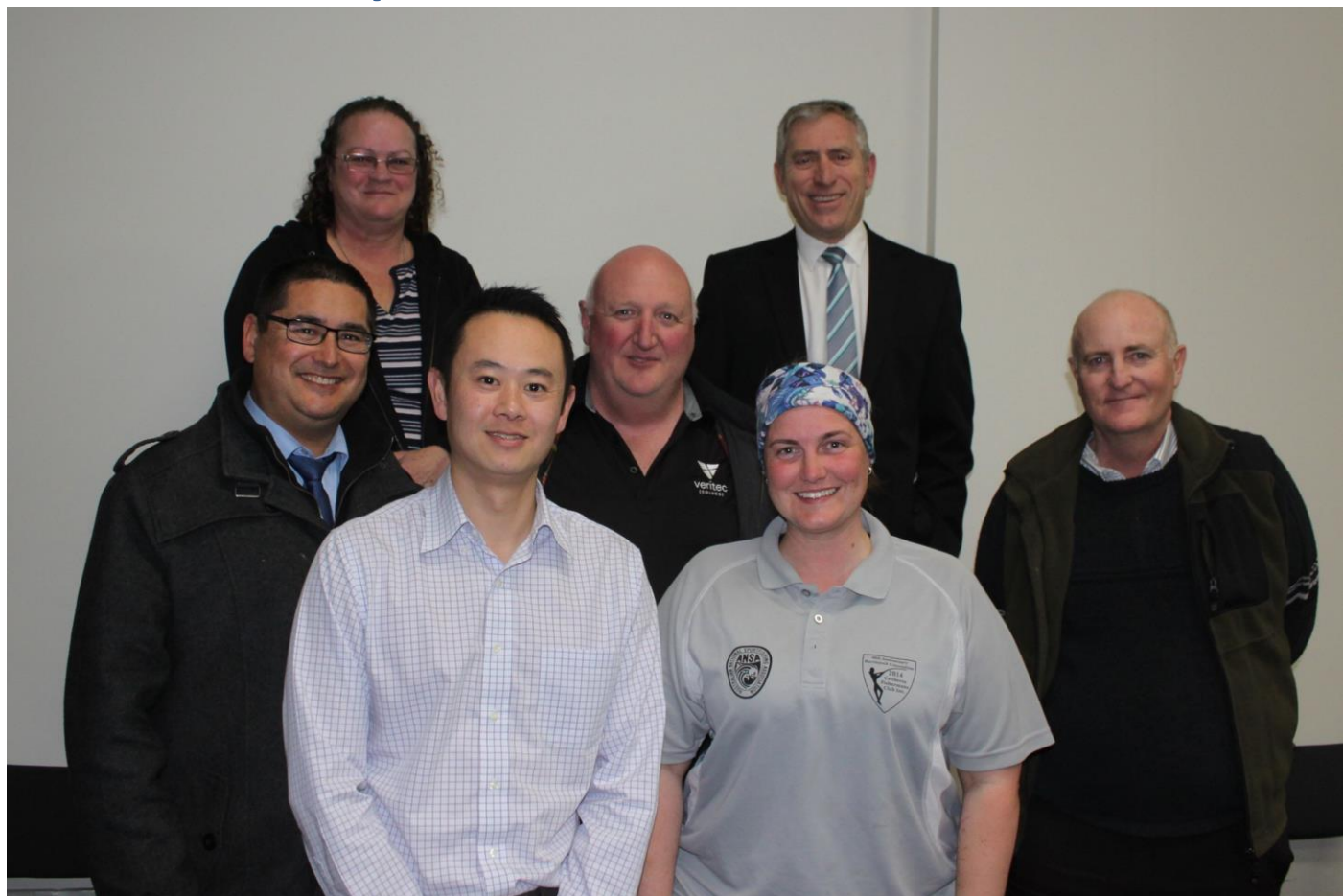
Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs
5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

Outings

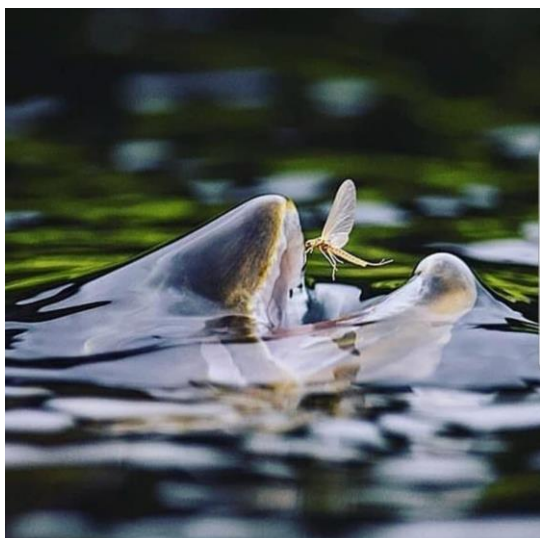

The Buckenderra Outing: 24-25 August 2019

The Club held its second outing for 2019-20 at Buckenderra, Lake Eucumbene, on 24-25 August 2019. This year, only Steve Bailey, Jason Rogers and I fished the outing. To those who didn't go, I fondly recall many occasions where I'd say to you that 'you missed a fantastic outing'. This is not one of those occasions.

Jason and Steve arrived on Friday evening and launched their boats around 7 am. I arrived just after 8.30 am, stopping by Reception briefly to stock up on a five for \$20 Tassie Devil deal from the cheap bin.

I then joined Steve boat at the boat ramp and we headed to the shelter of Wainui Bay. Jason had already done few laps of the bay with nothing to report. We also did a few laps without finding fish, after which, we decided to fish the Frying Pan Arm instead.

Each time Steve and I thought about the fish we weren't catching, my hard bodied lure would tangle with the rest of our lines.

So I ditched the hard body and just fished with the Tassie Devil.

500 gram 40 cm Brown Trout caught trolling in the Frying Pan Arm.

As we approached Shepherd's Point in 25 feet of water, my el cheapo Tassie Devil landed me a half kilo Brown Trout. We kept trolling couldn't find any more fish.

By mid-afternoon, winds were gusting at 25 knots so we called it a day.

By the time we returned to our cabin, I was very much looking forward to eating a roast dinner.

Unfortunately, this was the worst roast I had ever cooked.

I purchased a new brand of 'environmentally friendly' heat beads for the Weber, which was a couple of dollars cheaper than standard heat beads. To my horror, I discovered they don't generate as much heat as the standard heat beads and don't last as long. The result was better described as a dry-stewed slab of beef rather than a roast beef.

Steve landed a 41 cm Brown Trout in the first ten minutes of trolling, but had nothing to report for the rest of the morning. Jason also trolled, but he landed a 46 cm 0.85 kg Brown Trout when he started flicking lures.

After a couple of rather ordinary sessions at Buckenderra, things can only get better. Our next outing will be at Kalkite on 21-22 September 2019. It's always a great outing provides plenty of options for both boaties and land-based anglers.

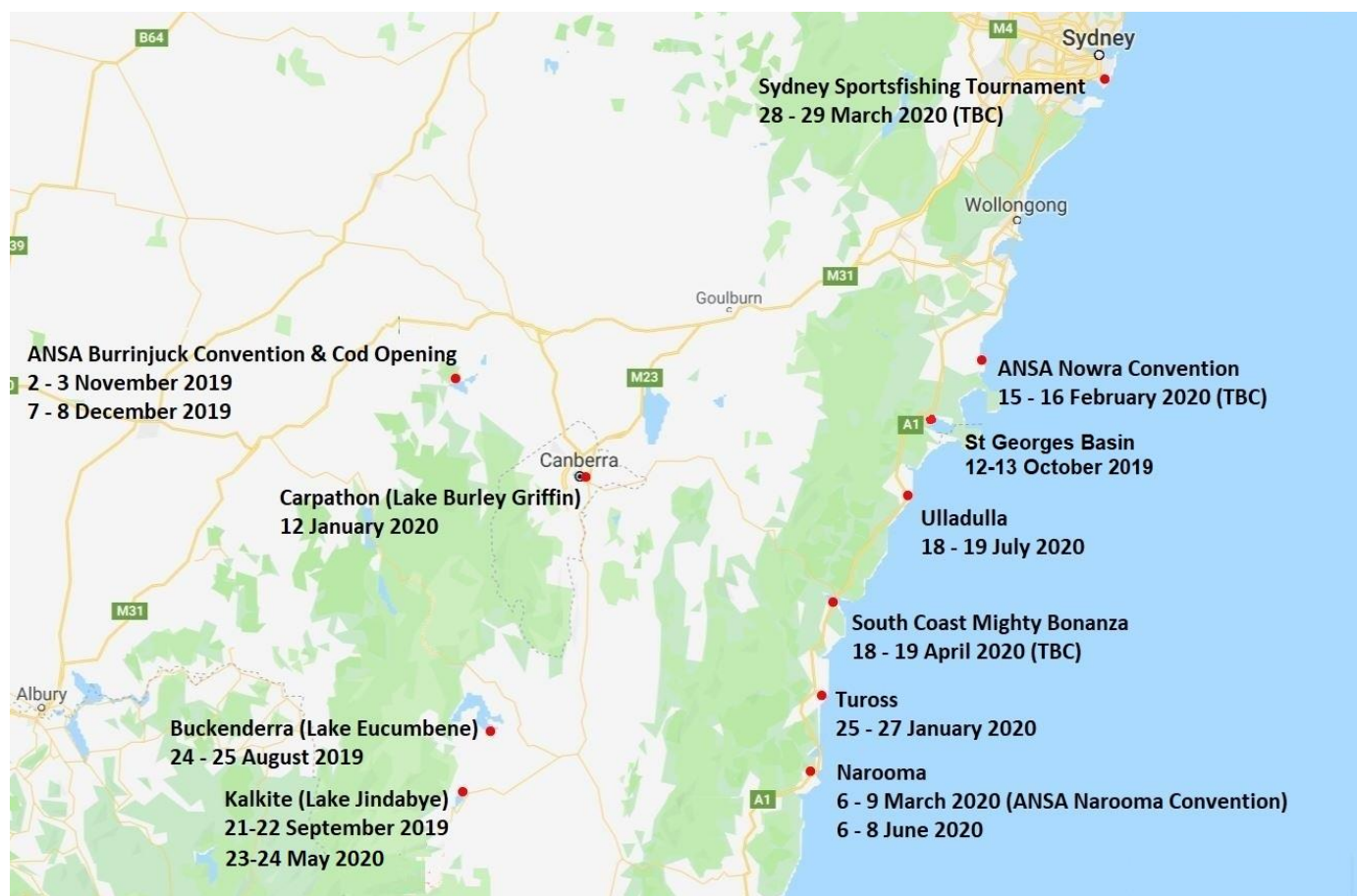
