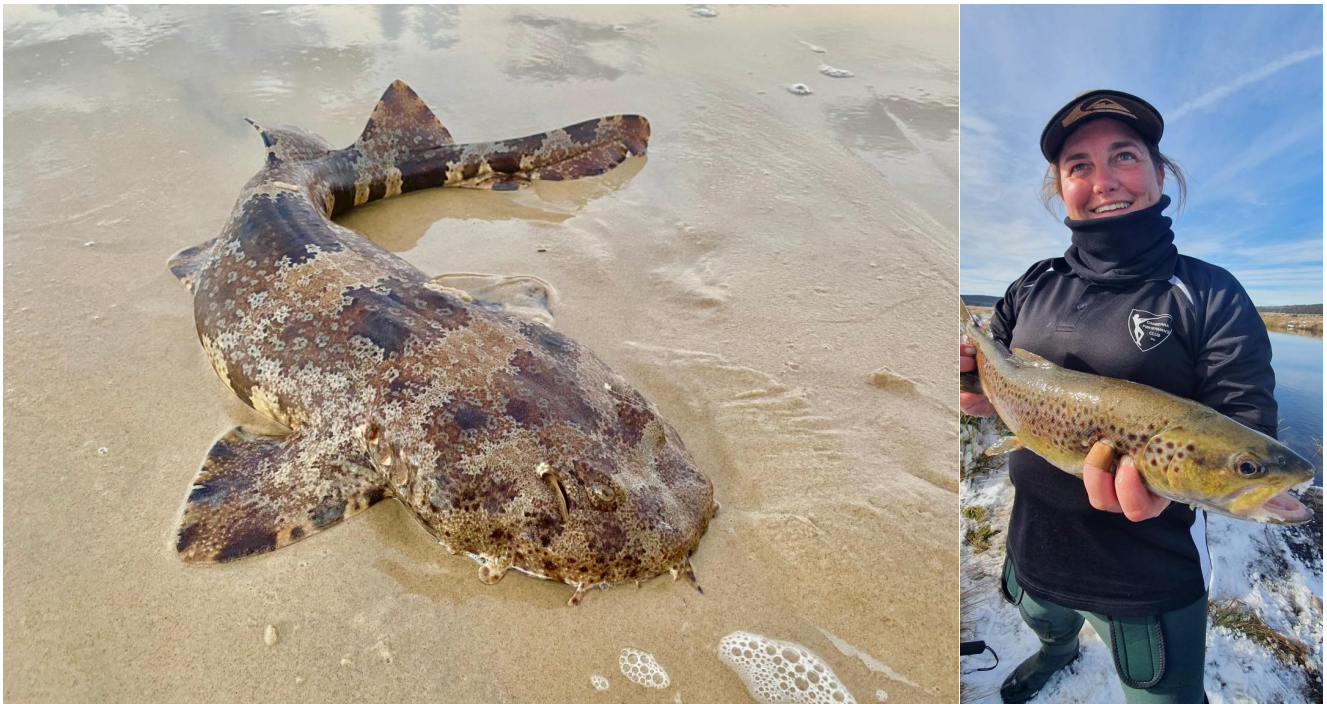

About the Club

Members of the Canberra Fisherman's Club are eligible to set Club Records and, upon payment of an Australian National Sport Fishing Association (ANSA) affiliation fee, also able to set Australian records, and World records (through ANSA affiliation with the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA)).

General meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month at the **Croatian Deakin Soccer Club, 3 Grose Street, Deakin**, beginning at **6:45 pm**. All members and visitors are most welcome.

Aims of the Club

- To promote sport fishing
- To foster the art of angling
- To teach the art of angling to new members and particularly juniors
- To promote the study and conservation of fish species and the environment
- To co-operate with and support other bodies with similar aims and ideals.

The Club also supports the Recfish Australia National Code of Practice for Recreational and Sport Fishing, which endorses:

1. Quickly and correctly returning unwanted or illegal catch to the water
2. Quickly killing fish that are kept for consumption
3. Using only appropriate, legal tackle, attending gear and valuing the catch
4. Taking no more than our immediate needs

5. Supporting and encouraging activities that preserve, restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitat
6. Understanding and observing all fishing regulations and reporting illegal fishing activities
7. Preventing pollution and protecting wildlife by removing rubbish
8. Taking care when boating and anchoring to avoid damage to wildlife and habitat
9. Using established roads and tracks
10. Reporting environmental damage
11. Avoiding unnecessary interactions with wildlife species and their habitats
12. Practising courtesy towards all those who use inland and coastal waters
13. Obtaining permission from landholders and traditional owners before entering their land
14. Caring for our own safety and the safety of others when fishing.

President's Report

Hi everyone

The 2021-22 annual Club Competition has almost closed, with only a few weeks left to catch a prize-winning fish. There will be a final Recorders Report in this Newsletter that presents competition standings up to the end of May.

There will be no further updates to the 2021-22 Club Championship to build the suspense in the lead-up to our annual Presentation Night in September. Remember: if you make any last-minute captures, you need to have all the paperwork in with the Recorder (me) by the 14th July.

As we enter the final month of the Club year, it's worth reflecting on where the Club's at, compared to this time last year. And I think it's fair to say that things have improved – but that probably says more about how bad things were last year!

We're now back to having monthly face-to-face Club meetings and monthly outings. The Committee has also decided to get back to hosting the Burrinjuck Convention in November this year. And there are several ANSA Clubs across NSW that are looking forward to joining us. Please put the Burrinjuck Convention in your diaries (5-6 November) – it's a heap of fun and it keeps the Club afloat financially.

The Committee has also decided to run another Carp-Out competition in March 2023. As you probably recall, it's an event where we invite the Canberra Community to get together for a day, fishing for Carp – we put a dent in the Carp population in Lake Burley Griffin and raise money to both buy native fish fingerlings to replace the Carp and to invest in Club infrastructure. The main prize won't be as extravagant as last time, so hopefully the event might be a little more profitable. The main thing is that it is an event that draws the Canberra fishing community together. We still get people talking about it – keep the 19 March 2023 clear, it's going to be a fantastic event!

All other dates in the Canberra Fisherman's Club 2022-23 calendar are provided later in the newsletter. I hope you can make it to at least a few events.

The recent May outing to Kalkite ended up being a Rainbow Trout extravaganza, with just about everyone catching at least one, with a couple of small Atlantic Salmon caught as well. Mel Marlborough stayed on for a few days after the outing to fish the Eucumbene River. I haven't seen any capture forms yet, but the photos look great. Some large Brown Trout in the snow on soft plastics and minnow lures. It looks like our Spring outing to Kalkite in September should be a good one.

The next outing (and the final one for the fishing year) will be our traditional Queen's Birthday long weekend trip to Narooma. Looking at the latest update of the NSW 12 Month Competition (included below), there are a few opportunities for a good-sized Australian Salmon capture. And Narooma is a great place to catch a good-size Australian Salmon – and the Canberra Fisherman's Cub has a reputation for catching good-sized Australian Salmon. Join the dots folks and have a go – there are plenty of NSW entry forms in the back of the Outings Book.

Finally, quite a few members have scales that are no longer current. Rather than list them all out, I've listed all scales that are up to date. If your scales are not on this list, please bring them in to the next meeting and I will get them certified....you don't want to catch a fish of a lifetime, but not be able to weigh it!

Total Length Award species for 2021-22

The Total Length Awards bring on healthy competition from the ranks of the CFC.

For 2021-22, the target species are Bream for the Saltwater section (includes Tarwhine and all species of Bream caught in Australian Territorial Waters but does not include freshwater species such as Bony Bream) and all Salmonid species (which includes Brown Trout, Rainbow Trout, Brook Trout, Atlantic Salmon and Chinook Salmon).

The new target species applies from 1 July 2021.

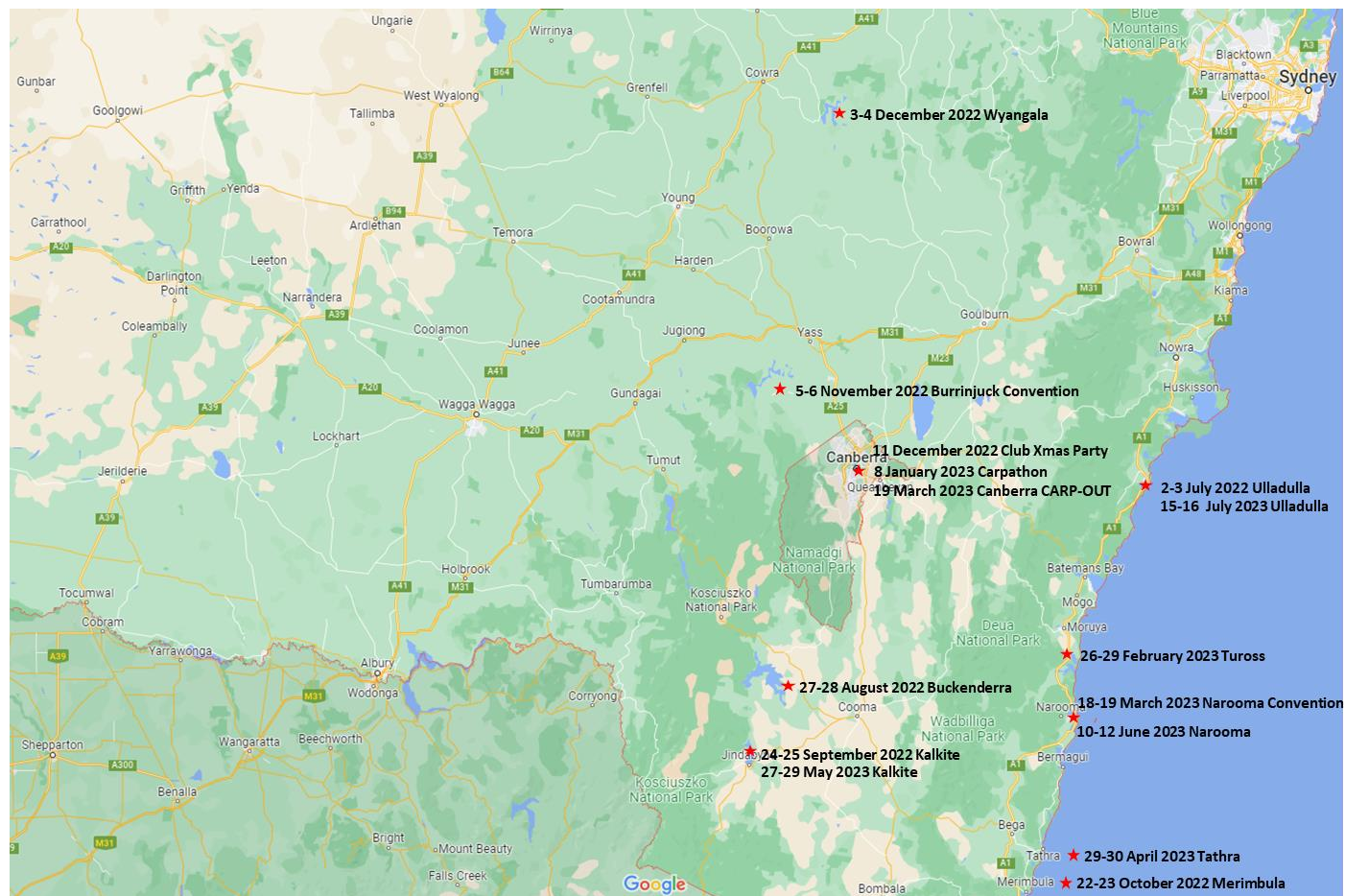
